## COMMODORE'S REPORT

My first year as Commodore of our Club whilst being hard work, has been most gratifying. When elected I stated it was my aim for more members to enjoy our Club, provide more member benefits, all to have fun both in the Club and on the water, to be proud of the CYCA and to be financially strong. I believe that with your help and that of the staff and directors we are achieving these goals.

My year started near the end of the 2002 BMW Sydney Winter Series and as always this was most successful. My thanks to BMW Sydney for their support and I am happy to report they are with us as major supporters for the next three years. Following the BMW Sydney Winter Series, we held the Sydney Gold Coast Race which attracted a reasonable number of entries. It is disappointing that the Club has not been able to find a sponsor for this race, any ideas from members are most welcome. It is an ideal sponsorship prospect with a spectacular start on the harbour.

After blowing out the winter cobwebs up north we had our main spring / summer season with our many and varied point scores. Entries in most events and divisions were fair but could certainly be improved upon and I urge you to give your ideas on how we can strengthen our offshore fleet to either the incoming Sailing Committee or the Sailing Office. Our winter races are an ideal opportunity to train offshore crews.

Last year heralded in our first year of Rolex as the major sponsor of our icon event, the Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, "The Everest of Yachting Events". Although only 57 yachts entered the great race south, the yachts and crew participating were among the best prepared and sailed that have ever participated and we were honoured to have Sir Edmund Hilary as the official starter. My thanks to Rolex and all involved for a very successful race.

Interest in this year's event is high and we have already published the Notice of Race and lowered the entry fee ten percent. We recognise how difficult it is for owners to organise and prepare for this challenging race and my Board and Sailing Office staff are endeavouring to limit the paperwork required and assist with entering. We recognise insurance is a major issue and we will endeavour to assist with this by organising a seminar with a major insurer well prior to the event. I would like to see a fleet approaching 100 yachts in this year's race and around 200 for next year's 60<sup>th</sup> race. We are already working on this with the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania. Alterations have been made to the various handicapping systems for the race to attract more entries and to give more competitors the opportunity to win the major trophy – "The Tattersalls Cup". Whilst your Board has received some criticism over the size limit selected we believe this will stabilise the event and lead to stronger participation in future years.

Prior to Easter we held the FKP Ltd Sydney Mooloolaba Race. This proved to be a very successful race with an increase in entries over last year which is very satisfying.

Our YSA program continues to advance and this year we took delivery of ten new Elliot 6.0 training yachts. These are proving very successful and I wish to thank all those that sponsor these yachts and the various events held.

The year has seen us drop the word "Division" from cruising and this is to remind all members that cruising is for everyone. "Cruising" has already staged a most successful heavy weather forum and more such nights are planned.

The Club has held more nights for Club members and these and our popular badge draw are certainly adding to member benefits. We held a popular Sportsman's Dinner and more are being planned. Membership is still open and I urge all members to convince their friends and crews to join.

The Monday spinnaker races sponsored by Hahn Premium and the Wednesday Twilight Series sponsored by UBS again proved very popular with large competitive fleets.

Work is continuing on the planning and development of a new slipway facility. This has not been easy due to the many constraints now applying to this use but we are forging ahead.

Finally the CYCA is in a sound financial position as can be seen from the balance sheet.

In closing I would like to register my thanks to the Board, our CEO Joe Goddard and his staff, (both permanent and casual), our many sponsors, start boat crews, Breakfast Club volunteers, Associates Committee, Safety Officers, past Commodores and Board members, and you the members for your support which has made the past year as Commodore most rewarding. I would like to make special mention of one member in particular, (Neville Crichton) for his assistance and sponsorship of the Club in various ways over the past few years, It is much appreciated. If I have missed thanking anyone or any group, it has not been intentional. Remember to support our sponsors and prepare now for the 2003 Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and other club events.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

#### Summary

Another good year with our new sponsor for the Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, Rolex, completing the first year of support. As a whole the support of Rolex has meant a significant level of certainty as to the way ahead. In addition, there was a strong and continued level of support from our members, resulting from the quality of the events we run and the quality of service provided by our staff. In turn, this is then reflected in the strong financial results from the various areas of the Club. We need to recognise the quality and sustained support from our volunteers in assisting in all our events. They have made many sacrifices and without them we would be in a very different position. It is thanks to these people as well as to our Chief Executive Officer, our tireless administrative, marina and bar staff and to our cleaners that we have achieved our present result.

The effect of all this has been that the profit this year is \$395,123. This compares well to last year's result of \$396,336.

I know that this seems to be quite a surprise, being so close to last year's figure, but I assure you our Auditors have again done their usual eagle eye examination of the figures and they are correct. When you look at the accounts, the similarities in some of the numbers could make you think you were looking at the same report as last year but you are not. The trends in some areas are clearly different.

This year has been different in that, because of the certainty of our go ahead position, we were able to expend more in specific areas. As members, you will be able to see the differences in the level of service and the atmosphere at the Club. In certain areas we have moved to more full time staff and it is this change that makes a whole lot of difference. The improvement in member service has been positively commented on.

The differences are apparent in the comparative data in the Accounts. Also the notes to the Accounts provide interesting information about the changes. Even still, there were periods that were difficult. The staff again pulled out all stops. Our members also stepped in and supported our functions, our Bistro and the bars. Also there was a delightful trend with more members getting down to the Club on a regular basis to support our great and increasingly popular sailing events. It is said that when the CYCA organises a sailing event it is like Pitt Street Sydney during rush hour, except it is on the harbour. That tells us a lot.

The results again speak for themselves. I think you would all agree that we have come a significant way in the seven or so years that I have been the Treasurer. When I look back, I am amazed at what we have achieved. We have the new marina, the new Clubhouse and now we have new sail training boats for the Youth Sailing Academy.

I again want to thank all our wonderful sponsors who have stood by us. From BMW Sydney in the Winter Series to our sponsors for the Thursday night badge draws. All of you do so much to help the Club and thus the sport of sailing. I would also like to welcome Rolex as the sponsor of the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. The race is a world recognised icon event and the Board is always looking at ways to make it even better.

The major reasons for our present position are shown in the detailed Financial Report, but in brief, the change has been brought about by a slight increase in revenues, which unfortunately have been eroded by an almost matching increase in expenses.

Again this year all the good news does not mean we can become complacent. The Board will continue to exercise good measures of financial control, but it will not be at the expense of reducing member benefits. I think member's can continue to look forward to enhanced levels of Member services in various areas of the Club over the next year.

In terms of our outstanding debts, we are progressing in accordance with the repayment schedule I set down several years ago. It will still take a good few years to get on top of the present debts, but the value of the legacy we leave for future members is something I am sure they will all thank us for.

#### My Report

The key issue has always been to maintain revenue, which was achieved by increasing participation in our sailing events and the associated increase in the use of Club facilities. Improved service levels clearly made for happier members and thus a slight increase in revenue from \$7.04 million to \$7.66 million. However, even with strenuous cost controls, our costs increased from \$5.75 million to \$6.35 million. The combination of these two factors gives us the result that would be expected.

Our Balance Sheet looks quite healthy, with both our current and non-current liabilities being well under control. Our net asset position is improving.

The Accounts contain some new items, which are aimed at providing increased statutory disclosure. One change is the disclosure of employee remuneration. I should point out that our Chief Executive Officer as well as doing his usual work also serves as our Licensee and as our Company Secretary. The salary level disclosed in the Report includes the value of fringe benefits, which are provided at no cost to the Club.

All the usual items are reported upon. The results are well within their expected ranges. Depreciation is up, because we are depreciating more assets. All other areas are under close control. Borrowing costs are down because we are following our programmeof debt repayment. Again, at the back of the Report, we have the report by individual areas, so that members have information on the performance of particular areas that may be of interest to them.

The fundamentals are now well established, we have now fully concluded Stage 1 of the development programme that was commenced some years ago. It is important that we now go ahead in a careful manner, watching our expenditures, meeting our debts and obligations. The results will in a few years time, demonstrate that we will be stronger than ever.

Again this year I take this opportunity to thank our Club Accountant Ms Nina McKinnon, who has spent an incredible number of hours working to control and report on our financial position. Our Chief Executive Officer has also put in a sterling performance attending morning meetings from 7.30am to evening meetings starting at 7.30pm on the same day! Also, all the other office staff are to be commended for their commitment and high level of support to the Club.

Again this year, our Audit, Planning & Risk Committee worked a crazy number of hours. The number of email exchanges is staggering. I would like to thank its Chairman (Rear Commodore Martin James), the Committee members and our staff who made presentations often late in the evening at the meetings so that we could agree on the Budgets, set controls on our expenditure and manage the risks in running the daily business of the Club.

#### The Accounts

The Accounts are largely the same as last year. However, with recent events in the accounting profession, there has been an increased level of rules and regulations and our auditors have to be quite stringent. The Profit and Loss statement is still called a "Statement of Financial Performance" and the Balance Sheet is called the "Statement of Financial Position". Personally, I prefer the old terms. These new terms do not alter the content of the report. If you are interested in the minor rule changes contained in the Accounts and notes, I urge you to speak directly with the Auditors.

#### **Major Directions**

The focus still needs to remain a matter of control aimed at further stabilising our position. We need to continue the high levels of control over our expenditure, particularly for high cost activities. We really would like more sponsors for our Youth Sailing Academy. This should remain one of our major challenges, as they are a group that deserves our strong ongoing support.

Thank you again for the many opportunities you have allowed me to serve as your Treasurer. This year has had some very interesting challenges, not only in the financial area. I can only see us going ahead from our now quite strong base.

## CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

It has been a few years since the Annual Report contained a Chief Executive Officer's report on how management has sought to respond to members' needs and to fulfill the objectives of the Board and Committees in the previous 12 months.

Over the past two years, management has focused on its service to members and guests. Many of you can appreciate that Clubs all over Australia have found it hard to adjust to a more modern-day approach to service and quality. Sensitive to this and initially unsure of what members thought of their Club, we conducted a comprehensive survey with an excellent response rate.

One of the most important issues raised was the quality and service of the catering. This has been addressed and we are now enjoying a much better standard of food and service from Vicki McKinnon and L'Eat Catering. Functions are now more affordable and offer an ideal venue for your next family celebration or corporate event. I hope that members try the new food and facilities and let me know their thoughts.

The Club met the challenge of conducting the 2001 Sydney Hobart Yacht Race without a sponsor. Following a successful search for a new major sponsor, and after the Board had laid the foundations to the relationship, the Club emerged with Rolex as its new major sponsor for a number of years.

It was during those early days that we also focused on reducing costs in all areas of the Club. Accountant Nina McKinnon and I set up some very strict financial control systems. We now enjoy a sharper team with proper management and operational efficiencies equivalent to most well run businesses.

The Sailing Calendar has changed over the years to reflect the needs of today's skippers and crews who have indicated they prefer challenges packed in small bundles. We believe that is what we now offer our members. We will always be best-known as the home of the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, but we also revel in the ever-increasing popularity of the BMW Sydney Winter Series and UBS Wednesday Twilight Series. Members and interested parties can now track yachts sailing in our major ocean races using satellite technology and special web sites set up for each event. Our Rolex Sydney Hobart Committee, Chaired by Rear Commodore Martin James, is spending countless hours continually refining our ocean racing web sites in order to provide an up to date and interesting site for members to enjoy.

Yachties competing in our many regattas return from racing to a modern clubhouse and marina with friendly staff and quality catering. Members also enjoy discounted bar prices, the convenience of our ATM machine and regular social nights such as the popular weekly Badge Draw and low cost Prawn and Carvery nights. Soon members will benefit from an updated Club Web Site and fortnightly "Onshore" delivered by email. These are just some of the many positive aspects of a CYCA membership. In fact, there are currently a small number of memberships available at the CYCA, so please consider proposing your family, friends and business associates to be future members.

Our Club has about 45 staff members, both in permanent and casual positions and they have all contributed significantly to the overall performance of the Club. Managers Christina Del Conte (Administration), Justine Kirkjian (Sailing Office), Jenni Bonnitcha (Youth Sailing Academy), Scott Finsten (Marina), and Lisa Ratcliff (Communications) have shown dedication and creativity to improve services for members. I would like to thank Garry Long AM, our Food and Beverage Manager, who left the Club recently. He was instrumental in stabilising our bars and improving profitability and service.

One thing that can never be changed at the Club is the wonderful support and enthusiasm from volunteers and Committee members. Committees are instrumental in shaping the Club's future and committee members spend many hours researching, discussing and recommending policy and direction. Volunteers are the unsung heroes who help in many different areas of Club operations including functions, fundraising, race management and liaison during our flagship event in December. Recently the enthusiasm of CYCA Cruising resulted in an impressive 250 people attending an informative and interesting Heavy Weather Seminar at the Club.

The Club also benefited from other sponsors, in particular Neville Crichton for his contribution and support over the past 18 months.

I would like to thank our popular Commodore John Messenger for his guidance and trust in my management, plus the Flag Officers, Treasurer and Club Directors who volunteer their time and effort for the benefit of the Club. This commitment will result in a stable environment for all members to enjoy into the future.

## **AUDIT, PLANNING & RISK COMMITTEE**

#### Chairman Martin James, Rear Commodore

The Club has an Audit, Planning and Risk Committee with its own charter.

The Committee's focus is on issues relating to the governance of the Club and its subsidiary (CYCA SOLAS Limited), its forward planning (particularly financial planning) and the management of its risks. The Committee's responsibilities include:

- reviewing the adequacy of existing external and internal audit arrangements, the Club's accounting
  policies and practices, the financial statements and the Club's internal control systems;
- giving the Board additional assurance regarding the quality and reliability of financial information prepared for use by the Board;
- reviewing and approving draft annual budgets prepared by management;
- liaison with KPMG, the Club's external auditors and reporting to the Board on the auditor's findings;
- monitoring compliance with the Club's and its subsidiary's statutory responsibilities including those under the Corporations Act, the Registered Clubs Act and environmental laws;
- reviewing regular reports on the Club's insurance affairs and reviewing policy terms;
- reviewing policies and procedures relating to the Club's risk management and making recommendations to the Board as to appropriate risk management strategies;
- the monitoring of compliance with approved policies;
- reviewing the Club's compliance with its taxation obligations;
- considering matters relating to the information technology requirements of the Club;
- an ongoing audit of the procedures employed by the Club in its conduct of its major races, including conducting spot audits of the operations of the Sailing Office prior to all major races;
- dealing with litigation and other claims against the Club, including those arising out of the 1998 Telstra Sydney Hobart Yacht Race;
- reviewing, negotiating and signing-off on all significant contractual arrangements and other long-term commitments to be entered into by the Club, particularly the agreements with UBS, BMW Sydney and the Club's other sponsors; and
- the oversight of the operation of the CYCA Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Safety of Life at Sea Trusts.

All of this would not be possible without the assistance and support of the members of the Committee. I would therefore like to thank Treasurer Alan Green, Directors Matt Allen and Michael Cranitch and member Andrew Bloore for their respective contributions during the last year.

## **SAILING COMMITTEE**

#### Chairman Roger Hickman, Rear Commodore

The CYCA Sailing Committee is a group of boat owners who discuss every facet of our racing, from the longest of our ocean races to the Sunday yacht around the harbour. These boat owners represent each and every boat owner's needs and desires in their sailing and their racing. The members of the Sailing Committee give their time freely and each year gain more of the knowledge required to steer CYCA sailing in the right direction. Our aim is to align the Club with world mainstream ocean racing and set standards that other Clubs believe are ones they would aspire to.

This year has been challenging, with the advent of a new dimension of ocean-racing maxi yacht. Alfa Romeo has broken many of the paradigms of sailing, with speed, strength and professionalism creating a new set of standards for the Committee to embrace. Our yachting is constantly evolving, the handicap methods used require constant monitoring and the continuing evolution of safety standards causes the Committee to assess the changes. The increase in the JOG fleet is exciting and the competition is tough in this fleet. The strength of our IMS and IRC fleet has ensured some excellent rating sailing, and the sound and successful work done by John MacLurcan has again produced a remarkable Performance Handicap sailing year.

The Sailing Office, headed up by Justine Kirkjian, has produced a good and successful sailing year. Justine has tackled the difficult and much-needed task of rewriting many of our Notices of Race. Along with the Chairperson of the Audit Planning & Risk Committee, she has brought these documents in line with both the legal and the safety issues facing the Club. Justine has also worked hard in the area of customer relations and I believe her team has made good inroads to ensure the sailing members enjoy the experience.

Our goal is to ensure our members enjoy a high quality of offshore racing and enjoy their boats or the boats they may crew on. The CYCA's vision statement could read, "Our aim is to ensure that those who venture into sailing by way of races or by way of cruising shall enjoy their experience". The CYCA Sailing Committee will continue to provide the highest possible standards for those who race and cruise with the Club. We will also endeavour to hear every suggestion for the improvement of our sport.

The Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, the Sydney Mooloolaba Race and the Sydney Gold Coast Race all proved to be great events this year and the quality of the fleets were exceptional. The Short Ocean races have been broken up into a spring and an autumn series in an endeavour to allow people to compete for a part if not all of the season. The Summer Twilight Series, both on Monday and Wednesday nights, continue to be very popular, especially the Wednesday Twilight night racing. The BMW Sydney Winter Series continues to have fantastic success with the large fleet turning out every Sunday, with numbers of over 200 yachts being seen on the harbour.

The 2002 Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race was yet again a great race. Winning the George Adams Tattersall trophy was for Quest the culmination of the endeavours of a great Club member over many years, but the realisation of a dream for many of that race-winning crew. Zeus also showed that a good boat well sailed can push the very best of the best. Delta Wing's win in Performance Handicap was an excellent sail and Starlight Express sailed a fantastic race in a very competitive IRC fleet to yet again bring a very successful yacht to the podium. Chutzpah won the new Sydney 38 One Design division and signals the strength of one design racing within the Rolex Race. The Line Honours win by Alfa Romeo, heralded as the fastest ocean-racing maxi in the world, set the standard of this, the first Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. Her dominance over the fleet was complete even though Grundig continues to amaze us all with her potential.

Participation of these super-maxis along with each and every yacht right through to Red Rock Communications will ensure that this great race will flourish in years to come. The CYCA is grateful to Tim Cox, Chairperson of the Race Committee for the 2002 event. He was well supported both by our own members and members of the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania in the formation of a competent and capable team. The CYCA is also grateful to Harcourt Gough for allowing the Club to use his magnificent yacht Four Seasons as the Radio Relay Ship for the Race. David Kellett and Harcourt, assisted by a very capable crew, ensured the race was well relayed from the sea. Thank you also to John Kirkjian, Stuart Primrose and the very hardworking members of the YA of NSW safety scrutineers who have continued their great work in assisting owners with safety issues. The standards that Jon Meyer created have ensured we have safety second to none – thank you Jon.

The 2003 Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race will certainly be another race that we can be proud of and support with all our energy.

The CYCA Sailing Committee is made up of persons that give their time voluntarily to the Club and I would like to thank those members for their assistance throughout the year. Other groups also contribute, firstly, the Breakfast Club who certainly add to the atmosphere of the BMW Sydney Winter Series and work tirelessly for the Club's sailing calendar. Richard Grubb, our race starter and finisher, has a great team of assistants who are always there for us.

Jeremy Smith from the Sailing Office has moved on and we will miss his friendly face and his capable and keen work ethic. ## TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

#### Chairman Don Telford, Director

The Youth Sailing Academy (YSA) continues to provide opportunity for new sailors, developing sailors, school and university groups and sail training regattas. The numbers of young sailors coming through its programs continue to grow and positions in the Advanced Squad are more highly contested than ever. Most significantly, because of the high level of interest in the YSA programs, the CYCA can look forward to the involvement of many talented young sailors in its sailing activities.

This year the YSA entered an exciting new era with the replacement of our much loved and well used original Elliott 5.9 fleet with 10 Elliott 6's. Designed by Greg Elliott in New Zealand specifically for youth training programs, the Elliott 6.0's were built in Nowra by YSA sponsor and long time supporter, Sydney Yachts. The longer keels and skiff style deck layout have provided a new impetus and coupled with their greater maneuverability and speed, these Elliotts have been received with great enthusiasm.

The Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania has purchased six of the Elliott 5.9 fleet and is using them for their Youth Sailing program. Sutherland Police Citizens Youth Club have purchased the other four for a youth intervention program.

During 2002 Ben Croucher acted in the position of manager of the Youth Academy for 11 weeks while Jenni Bonnitcha, YSA manager, was overseas competing with the Australian Olympic Squad in a number of regattas. Ben's ability to diversify and manage the Academy during this period was exemplary. Jenni has returned with lots of new ideas and experience to share from her exposure to high-level competition.

#### New Initiatives in 2002-3

The Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron won the CYCA's Youth Sailing Academy's inaugural ISAF Grade 3 International Youth Match Racing Championship on Sydney Harbour in November. Sailed in the YSA's brand new Elliott 6 sports boat, the series was fought right down to the line. Second was Britain's Royal Yachting Association team. The CYCA team of John Winning, Seve Jarvin and Sam Newton finished a very creditable 3<sup>rd</sup> to defeat all other Australian and overseas teams. Following the outstanding success of this inaugural International Regatta, Accord Logistics committed to sponsoring it in 2003.

CYCA member, Laurence Freedman, through the Freedman Foundation, has funded a very successful new initiative to introduce students from Western Suburbs High Schools to sailing. The program was so successful that the Freedman Foundation has committed to its expansion to incorporate 12 schools in 2 programs in 2003.

Two new training programs in Umpiring and Race Management have received considerable interest and involvement from parents of youth sailors, staff and the CYCA sailing volunteer community. The courses have been initiated to help maintain the very high standard of race management that all competitors have come to expect from the CYCA.

The YSA has identified a need to provide a bridge for sailors to develop their skills to a level to achieve selection in the Advanced Squad. This has resulted in the introduction of the Winter Intermediate Course.

#### Schools and University programs

Scots College maintained its long involvement with the YSA bringing a squad of boys every week in Terms I and IV to polish their sailing skills. The year finished with the annual parent race, in a very fresh southerly breeze, and followed by a presentation on the CYCA deck. Mosman Prep, SCCEGS Redlands and for the first time, Conservatorium High School all conducted their sailing programs out of the Youth Sailing Academy.

#### School Holiday Programs

A weekly program was conducted in every school holiday period with two in December/January. The courses provide sailors with boat handling and skill development, spinnaker work and racing and always include some fun 'cruises' to a swimming hole around the harbour. The combination of fun and skill development sees many sailors choosing to return every holiday and a continual stream of new participants applying to become involved with the YSA.

The school holiday program has been strengthened by the support given by coaches from the Advanced Squad in 2002. These sailors give their time to provide individual feedback on the water to each boat.

#### Advanced Squad Program and Associated Regattas

Many of the past Advanced Squad returned from 2001 and brought with them lots of Elliott experience resulting in very competitive squad training sessions. With loads of talent and shared information it was certainly the strongest advanced squad that the Academy has seen for a while. Twenty-three of our youth sailors enjoyed the experiences of offshore racing and BMW Sydney Winter Series racing. Eleven joined yachts to race north to the Gold Coast while two, Marcus Jones and Joel Skelton being over the ages of 18 years, later sailed in the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race.

Our sailors are in high demand as they quickly learn new skills for racing and many permanent positions result. The new opportunities that are so generously provided by our members are greatly appreciated. Also, a high proportion of the Advanced Squad were given the opportunity to represent the CYCA in 2002. Fifteen were able to represent at state, national and international regattas.

RSYS, RPAYC and CYCA youth sailed in a number of Interclub regattas throughout the season providing a large number of sailors with regatta exposure, competition atmosphere and many friendships.

First honours at interclub regattas went to the youth women's team representing the CYCA in the Newport Cup at RPAYC. This is the first time a women's Match racing team has won an IASF graded event representing the CYCA.

A second team of girls gained experience at the RPAYC Women's Match Racing Regatta in September. A number of CYCA YSA sailors represented their schools in the NSW Schools Match Racing Championships. Both the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> placed boats had YSA sailors on board. The CYCA entered two teams in the NSW Youth Match Racing Championships and with nine boats in the competition, CYCA placed 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> overall.

For the first time the CYCA sent an Under 25 team to Cowes Youth Week in England. The team trained hard to be selected for this match-racing event and represented the Club well. A CYCA youth team participated at the Harken Youth Match Racing Regatta at RPAYC, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> out of the Australian teams, and just missed out on the RNZYS Regatta. Another Under 25 team were in the RSYS Hardy Cup and lost on a count back to miss the finals.

A team of six from the squad, supplied with uniforms by Neville Crichton and Shockwave, represented CYCA for the first time in the Australian Teams Racing Championships, held in Hobart in 2002. They finished the regatta in fifth place, disappointed after their impressive start. A young youth Match Racing team, support by Steve Jarvin Kia, represented the CYCA in Sandringham U25 Match Racing, finishing 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### Regattas and additional Training Programs conducted by CYCA Youth Sailing Academy

As well as conducting the NSW Schools Match Racing Youth Regatta, the NSW Youth Match Racing and the very successful International Youth Match Racing Regatta, the YSA was kept busy with many other regattas.

Olympic sailors from the Australian Institute of Sport used the YSA Elliotts to hone their skills against each other over a training weekend in October. The Academy also conducted successful specific training weekends for the NSW High Performance sailors, nominated through the YA of NSW dinghy programs and the Hunter Academy of Sport.

All 10 Elliotts were involved in the Marinassess Women's Regatta. This very popular regatta received much positive feedback and requests for more female regattas and training.

The Mt Gay Top Jocks CYCA Champion of Champions race day was extremely successful in 2003 and is now again a permanent fixture on the calendar. Winners, Richard Perini and team generously donated back their \$1,200 prize.

The Academy conducted training sessions followed by separate regattas for the Intervarsity Championships, the Australian Sailing and Cruising Club Regatta and The NSW Police Sailing Assoc. Regatta.

During December Eden Marine High School sent a group to the Academy for its annual visit and sailing program. This program continues to be part of the CYCA's thank you to the Eden community for their support during the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race.

#### Sponsors and supporters

The YSA was pleased to have KAZ Group (Sailors with Disabilities) join our Elliott 6 sponsors list in 2002 and the ongoing sponsors Village Roadshow (Triple M), Rushcutters Harbourside, Quiet Little Drink, Musto, Club Marine, Toll, Qantas, Sydney Yachts and Wynyard Lane Secure Parking. Harken's sponsorship and support of our deck hardware and ropes, Hood Sails' ongoing commitment to Elliott sails and Andrew Short Marine and International Paints all contribute to continue to provide youth with well-maintained boats.

The YSA gratefully welcomes new 2003 regatta sponsors Mt Gay (Top Jocks Regatta) and Accord Logistics (International Youth Match Racing regatta) and thank Illawarra Youth Sailing for again supporting young sailors to take part in the Academy training programs.

The Academy would like to acknowledge all of those members who support youth sailing with their direct donation or donations to the Australian Sports Foundation. The funds raised are an important contribution towards the ongoing development of youth sailing and maintenance of the Elliott fleet. In conclusion, a special thank you to Jenni Bonnitcha for her leadership and tireless energy, and to Ben Croucher and the staff of the CYCA for making this an excellent year for the YSA.

## CYCA CRUISING

The primary function of CYCA Cruising is to encourage members to gain more enjoyment from their yachts and also for those not fortunate to actually have a yacht, to gain more from their Club by way of both on and off water events.

Initially the first major cruise the Club undertookwas to Hobart, which turned into a race. As they say large oaks from small acorns grow and today the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race is one of the world's classic events attracting competitors from all over the world.

- Educational Seminars are organised that are of particular interest to all who venture offshore, be it racing or cruising. Our first was on Heavy Weather Sailing and our next will be Medical Emergencies at Sea Beyond First Aid, to ensure that the best advice is given for members to cope with unforeseeable medical problems.
- Our General Meetings are great social events where by we have one or two speakers discussing their sailing adventures and overseas trips followed by dinner on the deck. ## MARINA & SITE COMMITTEE

#### Chairman Geoff Lavis, Vice Commodore

Once again, the floating marina has been an outstanding success and it's a facility that is being enjoyed by boat owners, members and visitors alike. The marina is a wonderful asset for the Club and has been run through the year consistently ahead of budget. This has been achieved through the excellent and tireless efforts of our Dockmaster, Scott Finsten and Marina Administrator, Frank Bergmann. Well done and my thanks to both of you. Unfortunately, the popularity of the marina has not helped to reduce our waiting lists. The waiting lists are reviewed at every Committee meeting with the aim of allocating berths wherever possible.

Due to the pressure of boats on the waiting list, the Committee is currently reviewing methods to ensure that those who have been granted marina licenses will continue to maintain the use of their boats as was agreed at the time of occupancy of the berth. In a nutshell, if the marina occupier is simply using the berth as a parking lot for their boat, then the Committee will seek to have that boat removed from the Marina. We simply have far too many active boat owners that cannot currently gain a marina berth.

Our policy of not allowing ad hoc "For Sale" signs on boats appears to have been successful and does not appear to have infringed on owner's rights to sell their boats in the best possible manner. Certainly the appearance of the Marina has been enhanced by the removal of ad hoc "For Sale" signs.

To prevent the unauthorised use of the Fire Hoses on the Marina, a protective cover has been installed over the tap area of each reel. This is easily breakable in the event of a fire and has been successful in preventing unauthorised usage.

The vexed issue of the slipway still remains. We made some progress with our consulting engineers, to maximise use of the slipway area, however the plan presented to us failed to take into account other needs for the area. We are now in the early stages of reviewing plans for the total available area that will optimise the use of the location, including slipways and existing buildings, which should result in a far more homogenous structure. The Committee and the Board will continue to push forward with this project in the coming year.

During 2002 we replaced our start boat with the *new* "Offshore". This was a great purchase and Club members can rest assured that we have an excellent craft. We have recently fitted her with some quite loud air horns that most certainly can be heard at any point on the start line. Richard Grubb, our race starter, has been giving the boat routine maintenance since she was acquired, thus ensuring that she remains in first class condition.

Our tenders and chase boats have been well maintained through the year following the introduction of a maintenance protocol. The "George Barton" has just undergone a major refit and looks great. She will shortly be fitted with a windscreen to enhance comfort on board.

Building and site maintenance is being carried out as and when needed. No major area of building rectification/repair has been identified this year, although we did need to replace the timber flooring in the Restaurant. The timber decking under the storage lockers and on the dinghy ramp was replaced where necessary, or simply turned over to increase the useable life of the timber.

I would like to again thank Scott Finsten and Frank Bergmann for their commitment to the smooth and efficient functioning of the marina. I would also like to thank my fellow Committee members, Director Garry Linacre, Director Rod Skellet, Tony Hearder, Karl Stechmann and Ed McCarthy for their valued assistance and support during the year.

## MEMBER SERVICES COMMITTEE

The Year 2002-2003 has been a busy year for the Member Services Committee. The most important activity on which the Committee was engaged during the course of the year was the securing of a new Caterer for the Club to replace Blue Rock Catering. #### **Principal activities**

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2003

#### 1 Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

#### (a) Basis of preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies are consistent with those of the previous year.

#### (b) Revenue recognition - Note 2

Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST) payable to the taxation authority. Exchanges of goods or services of the same nature and value without any cash consideration are recognised as revenues.

#### House revenue

Sales revenue comprises revenue earned from the provision of food, beverage and clothing sales to members and other patrons of the Club. Sales revenue is recognised when the goods and services are provided.

#### **Subscriptions**

Subscription fees are taken into account on an accruals basis and the portion relating to the ensuing year is transferred to subscriptions in advance.

#### Yard and marina

Yard and marina revenue consists of casual and permanent berthing fees, hardstand rentals, locker rentals, slipping fees, tender fees and boat repairs provided to members and other patrons of the Club. Yard and marina revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided.

#### Sailing revenue

Sailing revenue consists of donations and grants received by the Youth Sailing Academy, ferry charter fees, race entry fees, sponsorship and other associated income. Sailing revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided for all revenue except sponsorship which is recognised as it accrues.

#### Interest revenue

Interest income is recognised as it accrues, taking into account the effective yield on the financial asset.

#### Sale of non-current assets

The gross proceeds of non-current asset sales are included as revenue at the date control of the asset passes to the buyer, usually when an unconditional contract of sale is signed.

The gain or loss on disposal is calculated as the difference between the carrying amount of the asset at the time of disposal and the net proceeds on disposal.

Any related balance in the asset revaluation reserve is transferred to the capital profits reserve on disposal.

#### 1 Statement of significant accounting policies (continued)

#### (c) Goods and services tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as a current asset or liability in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

#### (d) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs include interest, amortisation of discounts or premiums relating to borrowings, amortisation of ancillary costs incurred in connection with arrangement of borrowings and lease finance charges. Ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings are capitalised and amortised over the life of the borrowings.

Borrowing costs are expensed as incurred unless they relate to qualifying assets. Qualifying assets are assets which take more than 12 months to get ready for their intended use or sale. In these circumstances, borrowing costs are capitalised to the cost of the assets. Where funds are borrowed specifically for the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset, the amount of borrowing costs capitalised are those incurred in relation to that borrowing, net of any interest earned on those borrowings. Where funds are borrowed generally, borrowing costs are capitalised using a weighted average capitalisation rate.

#### (e) Income tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Company is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997), provided it continues as a sporting Club predominantly encouraging and promoting the sport of yachting, boating, cruising for pleasure and the building and sailing of yachts and boats. Accordingly tax effect accounting has not been adopted by the Company.

#### (f) Acquisition of assets

All assets acquired including property, plant and equipment are initially recorded at their cost of acquisition at the date of acquisition, being the fair value of the consideration provided plus incidental costs directly attributable to the acquisition.

Expenditure is only recognised as an asset when the entity controls future economic benefits as a result of the costs incurred, it is probable that those future economic benefits will eventuate, and the costs can be measured reliably. Costs attributable to feasibility and alternative approach assessments are expensed as incurred.

#### Subsequent additional costs

Costs incurred on assets subsequent to initial acquisition are capitalised when it is probable that future economic benefits in excess of the originally assessed performance of the asset will flow to the Company in future years. Costs that do not meet the criteria for capitalisation are expensed as incurred.

#### 1 Statement of significant accounting policies (continued)

#### (g) Revisions of accounting estimates

Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively in current and future periods only.

#### (h) Receivables - Note 5

The collectability of debts is assessed at balance date and specific provision is made for any doubtful accounts. Debtors are generally settled within 60 days and are carried at amounts due. The collectability of debts is assessed at balance date and specific provision is made for any doubtful accounts.

#### (i) Inventories - Note 6

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### (j) Leased assets

Leases under which the Company assumes substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership are classified as finance leases. Other leases are classified as operating leases.

#### **Operating leases**

Payments made under operating leases are expensed on a straight line basis over the term of the lease, except where an alternative basis is more representative of the pattern of benefits to be derived from the leased property.

#### (k) Recoverable amount of non-current assets valued on cost basis

The carrying amounts of non-current assets valued on the cost basis are reviewed to determine whether they are in excess of their recoverable amount at balance date. If the carrying amount of a non-current asset exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is written down to the lower amount. The write-down is recognised as an expense in the net profit or loss in the reporting period in which it occurs.

Current valuations for leasehold improvements valued on the cost basis are carried out at least once every three years.

Where a group of assets working together supports the generation of cash inflows, recoverable amount is assessed in relation to that group of assets.

In assessing recoverable amounts of non current assets the relevant cash flows have not been discounted to their present value.

#### Cost versus fair value

Except where specifically stated, non-current assets are recorded at the lower of cost and recoverable amount.

#### (I) Depreciation and amortisation

#### Complex assets

The components of major assets that have materially different useful lives, are effectively accounted for as separate assets, and are separately depreciated.

#### Heaful lives

All non-current assets, have limited useful lives and are depreciated/amortised using the straight line method over their estimated useful lives.

Assets are depreciated or amortised from the date of acquisition.

#### 1 Statement of significant accounting policies (continued)

#### (I) Depreciation and Amortisation (continued)

Depreciation and amortisation rates and methods are reviewed annually for appropriateness. When changes are made, adjustments are reflected prospectively in current and future periods only.

#### (m) Payables - Note 9

Liabilities are recognised for amounts to be paid in the future for goods or services received, whether or not billed to the company. Trade accounts payable are normally settled within 60 days.

#### (n) Interest bearing liabilities - Note 10

Loans are recognised at their principal amount, subject to set off arrangements. Interest expense is accrued at the contracted rate and included in "Other creditors and accruals".

#### (o) Employee entitlements – Note 11

#### Wages, salaries, annual leave and sick leave

The provisions for employee entitlements to wages, salaries, annual leave and sick leave represent present obligations resulting from employees' services provided up to the reporting date, calculated at undiscounted amounts based on current wage and salary rates including related on-costs.

#### Long service leave

The provision for employee entitlements to long service leave represents the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made resulting from employees' services provided up to the reporting date.

Provision for employees with less than 10 year's service has been allocated to non-current liabilities.

In determining the liability for employee entitlements, consideration has been given to future increases in wage and salary rates and the Company's experience with staff departures. Related on-costs have also been included in the liability.

#### Superannuation plan

The Company contributes to several defined contribution superannuation plans. Contributions are charged against income as they are made. Further information is set out in Note 20.

#### (p) Marina security deposits held - Note 12

Marina berth holders are required to pay a refundable security deposit to the Company equivalent to three months berthing fees at the time of acquisition of the berth.

#### (q) Floating rate notes – Note 10

Floating rate notes are carried on the statement of financial position at their principal amount. Interest expense is accrued at the contracted rate and included in accruals.

In accordance with the Constitution of the company, every member of the company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$2 per member in the event of the winding up of the company during the time that he is a member or within one year thereafter. At 31 March 2003 there were 2,566 members.

The principal place of business is Darling Point, New South Wales, Australia.

### 24 Trust fund

The Company is the sole member of CYCA SOLAS Limited, a company limited by guarantee which is the trustee of the CYCA Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Safety of Life at Sea Trusts. The administration of the CYCA Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Safety of Life at Sea Trusts is under the control of the separate board of CYCA SOLAS Limited. The trustee Company has a right to be indemnified out of the assets of the trust to satisfy liabilities properly incurred by the trustee. As at 31 March 2003 the outstanding liabilities committed by the trustee on behalf of the trust totalled \$30,000 (2002: \$5,000). The assets of the trust are more than sufficient to meet this commitment. In the event that CYCA SOLAS Limited is wound up and unable to repay all outstanding debts, the liability of its members is limited to an amount of \$10.

CYCA SOLAS Limited is a controlled entity of the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia. The company acts as trustee for the CYCA Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Safety of Life at Sea Trusts. It has not been consolidated into the financial statements on the basis of materiality.
