Commodore's Report



Commodore Geoff Lavis

It was indeed a great honour to be elected to the position of Commodore of this great Club in July last year. Whilst this came about a little earlier than anticipated, I have thoroughly enjoyed my first 12 months at the helm of the CYCA.



There are many wonderful social aspects of the Club's activities, however the core activity remains sailing, and so it has been over the last year. Starting with a near record fleet in the Sydney Gold Coast Race, onto the Rolex Trophy series, the Big Boat Challenge, the 61st Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, the various summer offshore series, including the Short Haul series and cruising activities, the Mt Gay Monday Twilights and the St Arnou Wednesday Twilights and then into the BMW Sydney Winter Series, which will be underway when you read this report.

Add to this mix the various other races that our active racers participate in, including; races organised by the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron; Middle Harbour Yacht Club; RANSA; Royal Prince Edward Yacht Club; Sydney Amateur Sailing Club; and other Sydney and interstate yacht clubs. Other events include the Brisbane

Gladstone Race; Brisbane Mackay Race; Airlie Beach Race Week; Hamilton Island Race Week; Gosford Lord Howe and Pittwater Coffs Harbour Races and the sailing calendar is indeed a busy one! Not forgetting, of course our very active Youth Sailing Academy which continues to grow from strength to strength under the enthusiastic guidance of Jenni Bonnitcha. Our youth sailors have achieved some outstanding successes during the year and they continue to graduate onto members' yachts providing a continuing source of well trained skilful sailors.

You will note that I didn't mention Sydney Mooloolaba! As most are now aware, the Sailing Committee proposed, and the Board agreed, to a change in format this calendar year, which involved moving the Sydney Gold Coast Race to pre-Easter and the Sydney Mooloolaba Race to the end of July. There were a number of reasons for the switch which was done with full consultation with both the Southport Yacht Club and Mooloolaba Yacht Club. The repositioning allowed the Southport Yacht Club to re-invigorate an offshore series at the end of the Gold Coast Race, and allows us to initiate the Sydney Mackay Yacht Race, in conjunction with, and part of, the Sydney Mooloolaba Race in late July. This 930 nautical mile race will now feed into the popular Queensland regattas at Airlie Beach and Hamilton Island and already a number of skippers have indicated their intention to contest this inaugural event.

One of the sailing highlights of the year for me was welcoming home Club member Alex Whitworth and his mate Peter Crozier following their epic journey in *Berrimilla*, a Brolga 33. Alex and Peter competed in the 60th Rolex Sydney Hobart, then set sail double handed for England,

competed very successfully in the double handed division of the Rolex Fastnet Race and then set sail once again for Sydney, via Hobart, to get back just in time to compete in the 61st Rolex Sydney Hobart. I have the greatest admiration and respect for the gritty determination and seamanship of these two men.

The 61st Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race

The 61st Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race attracted huge media interest partially surrounding the anticipated match race between the world's newest and fastest 30 metre maxis. The prevailing conditions for the race determined that it would be a big boat race with the leaders virtually facing no significant upwind work whilst the rest of the fleet had to battle against the usual strong south to south west winds. This resulted in Bob Oatley's *Wild Oats XI* achieving the 'triple' – Line Honours; the Tattersall's Cup for IRC overall winner and the establishment of a new race record for variable ballast boats. We had an excellent fleet of 85 starters of which 80 finished and all but one arrived in Hobart. My congratulations to all who competed and in particular the divisional winners and place getters. The race attracted an unprecedented world wide audience on our excellent yacht tracker system which this year was significantly enhanced by the addition of Google Earth. Another notable achievement in this race was the record equalling performance of *Phillips Foote Witchdoctor*. She equalled *Peer Gynt's* record of 25 Sydney Hobarts. Maybe she will hold the record on her own after this year's race.



For many years the Tasmanian Government has provided medallions for those who have participated in 25 Sydney Hobarts, but last year they also struck medallions to recognise the achievement of competing in 40 Sydney Hobarts. Those who had earlier achieved this milestone received their medallions at the prize giving on New Year's Day and the recipients were; John Bennetto (posthumously) 44; Lou Abrahams 43; Tony Cable 42; Bernie Case 40 and Richard 'Sightie' Hammond 40 – the first to sail in 40 Sydney Hobarts.

Solid support of our sponsors

We at the Club are extremely pleased to have the continuing solid support of our sponsors. I would also like to thank all the sponsors of the Thursday night 'Badge Draw' - this has developed into a highly successful regular Club function. Also, the generous continued support given by many members through their voluntary donations to the Australian Sports Foundation with a direction of the funds to the Youth Sailing Academy is most welcome and gratefully received. To all our sponsors, on behalf of the Board I offer my sincerest thanks.

Thank you to our many volunteers

Apart from the support of our sponsors, this Club would be unable to function without the

continuing support of our many volunteers, be they on regular Committees, the Breakfast Club, Race Committees, Emergency Management teams, start boats, assistance in the Information Centre for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and assistance finding new crews – to all of you – thank you!

Under the guidance of our Chief Executive Officer, Mark Woolf, and the enthusiastic and loyal support of his excellent staff, the Club is in a very sound financial position. Due to sound budgetary management the Club has again recorded a solid result with further diminution of our long term debt, despite the impost of substantially higher land and water lease costs. Please refer to Treasurer Graham Swan's report and Vice Commodore Matt Allen's Audit Planning and Risk Committee report for further details.

Club based activities well supported

The Club based activities continue to be well supported by members giving a solid boost to the financials mentioned above. Director Michael Cranitch and his Member Services Committee have been very active over the year. At the direction of this Committee, minor renovations to the ladies restrooms and the restaurant have just been completed. This Committee has also put forward a novel approach to attract new members to this magnificent Club, a promotion that will run over the winter months culminating in a lucky member winning a trip on the inaugural CYCA Aegean Yacht Rally for 2007. The Cruising Committee has also been extremely busy over the year organising many in-house functions and gatherings, not only for the benefit of the cruising sailors but also all racing sailors in this and other clubs. This group is ably led by Cruising Captain John Keely and his report of

their activities is an interesting read.

The Marina and Site Committee, led by Director Garry Linacre is currently reviewing optimum usage of the marina and is now finally able to reassess the requirements and best use of the old slipway area. I anticipate that the Committee will have some recommendations for the Board prior to the Annual General Meeting.

The Archives Committee, led by Director Rod Skellet have for many years been gathering historical information on the Club and its members. This work is getting closer to fruition and in fact a great deal of the available information is currently being uploaded to the Club's website. This has been a difficult and arduous task and the Committee are to be congratulated for their ongoing commitment.

The Associates Committee has again continued their solid commitment of support for the Club, this year once again under the skilled leadership of Jeannette York. Her Committee's activities are detailed in her report.

To all the Committee Chairpersons and all the Directors, thank you for your assistance and support this year.

I commend to you this wonderful Club. Be proud of your membership of this, the pre-eminent ocean racing club in Australia.

Treasurer's Report



Treasurer Graham Swan

Members will have noticed the dramatic effect of the introduction of Australian International Financial Reporting Standards on this year's profit after tax and the 2005 comparative figures where a \$143,287 profit has been reversed to a loss of \$26,402.

This is because under AIFRSs we are required to recognise the obligation to restore certain sites at the end of our land and waterways leases, in effect make good the site. Under previous generally accepted accounting principles the cost of rectification was recognised as an expense when incurred. The adjustments are of a non-cash basis and are more fully explained in the notes to the accounts.

Following is a summary of key financial information over the last three years:

Members' funds have again increased even though membership numbers have remained static as a result of strong patronage and participation in Club events which combined with careful management has ensured gross margins were maintained and costs contained. There was also a flow on effect with savings in interest and finance charges as a result of the reduction in our borrowings in prior years.

This year's profit result and the positive cash inflow enabled a further part repayment of the floating rate notes and a reduction in total liabilities from \$6.9m to \$5.9m. There was also an opportunity to make a substantial donation to SOLAS.

The Club continued capital expenditure on areas of strategic value and in particular acquired the *MV Gordon Marshall*. As well as the make good provision our results continue to be affected by a large amortisation and depreciation expense to reduce the carrying value of non-current assets over their useful lives.

As in prior years our working capital ratio remains poor but members will have noticed that we reduced our accounts payable at year end by some \$366,291 and subsequent to year end we extended the marina hire purchase for another five years thereby

transferring the bulk of the interest bearing liability of \$1,467,507 to a non-current liability.

I would like to thank our accountant Nina McKinnon and her staff for their assistance during the year and a special thank you to Christina Del Conte and Mark Woolf for all the help they have provided during the year.

In addition to the role of Treasurer I have enjoyed participating on the Member Services Committee with Director Michael Cranitch, the Archives Committee with Director Rod Skellet, the Audit Planning and Risk Committee under the stewardship of Vice Commodore Matt Allen, and cooking those sausages with the Breakfast Club!

Our Club's financial strength depends on the continuing support of our sponsors and usage of the facilities by members. I look forward to seeing you on the water or in the Clubhouse.

Audit, Planning & Risk Committee Report

The Cruising Yacht of Australia has an Audit, Planning and Risk Committee. The Committee has during the last year focused on the refinancing of various assets including the marinas and the adoption of AIFRS to accounts.

The Committees responsibilities include:

- Reviewing the adequacy of existing external and internal audit arrangements, the Company's accounting policies and practices, the financial statements and the Company's internal control systems.
- Giving the Board additional assurance regarding the quality and reliability of financial information prepared for use by the Board.
- Devising and implementing short term and long term financial plans.
- Reviewing rents and other periodic receivables of the Company.
- Reviewing and approving draft annual budgets prepared by the management.
- Liaising with KPMG, the Company's external auditors and reporting to the Board on the auditors findings.
- Monitoring compliance with the Company's and its subsidiary's statutory responsibilities including those under the Corporations Act, the Registered Clubs Act and environment laws.
- Reviewing and renewing policy terms in relation to the Company's insurances.
- Reviewing policies and procedures in relation to the Company's risk management and making recommendations to the Board as to appropriate risk management strategies.
- The monitoring of compliance with approved policies.
- Reviewing the Company's compliance with taxation policies.
- Considering matters with relation to the Company's information technology requirements.
- An ongoing audit of the procedures employed by the Company in its conduct of its major races.
- Dealing with litigation and other claims against the Company.
- Reviewing, negotiating and signing-off on all significant contractual arrangements and other long term commitments entered into by the Company, including agreements with sponsors.

- The oversight of the CYCA Safety of Life at Sea Trusts.
- Commissioning and obtaining revaluations of our assets.
- With the assistance of past Commodores Martin James and John Messenger dealing with rental reviews with our landlords.

I would like to record my sincere thanks to past Audit, Planning and Risk Committee Chairman Past Commodore Martin James for his enormous assistance and long hours during the year. In addition to Past Commodore James, the Committee has the benefit of having some very capable people on which to draw upon, namely; Paul Billingham, Director Michael Cranitch, and Treasurer Graham Swan. I thank them for their efforts.

As you will note from the Treasurer's Report and the Financial Statements your Club is in a sound financial position.

The adoption of AIFRS standards to our accounts has created extra work during the year both for your Committee and management.

I would also like to thank both our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf, and Accountant Nina McKinnon who have helped enormously in the various responsibilities of the Committee.



Sailing Committee Report

John Kirkjian as always has provided the CYCA with a sound Protest Committee base. The volunteers along with John who continue to support the Club with their time and knowledge in this sometime difficult area are also to be thanked.

The 61st Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race proved to be yet another good event and a

large number of people contributed to it. Tim Cox and his team on the Race Committee including friends from the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania are thanked by all who participate in the race. John Brooks and the Emergency Management Team also contributed to the back up necessary to run this flagship event.

David Kellett with his trusted team of volunteers again manned the Radio Relay Ship for the 61st Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. This year John Winning supported the CYCA by providing his exceptional power yacht *JBW* as the Radio Relay Ship. John must be thanked for his support and gratitude from all of us has been passed onto John.

The CYCA Sailing Committee itself is made up of a group of volunteers that provide a wealth of knowledge to ensure that CYCA racing and sailing can be carried out at a high level of awareness and enjoyment. Each member of the Sailing Committee is a boat owner and a member of the CYCA and thus endeavours to provide every facet of CYCA sailing to be successful. It has been a busy year and I thank all those on the Sailing Committee for their continued support.

Championship series

The premier pointscores of the CYCA are undoubtedly the Blue Water Championship and the Tasman Trophy. These championship series embrace all our offshore events including the races to Mooloolaba and Gold Coast, the races around Cabbage Tree Island, Flinders Islet and Bird Islet, and the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. The history of the CYCA completely revolves around these historical events as most have been a part of that history ranging back some 60 years. The collection of these offshore classics forms



arguably the toughest group of races anywhere in the world. They epitomise the values of seamanship, reliability and persistence and provide Australian offshore sailors with sailing challenges not collectively provided elsewhere.

The CYCA Blue Water Championship for this season was won by *Prime Time* owned and campaigned by David Mason. David sailed his Beneteau 44.7 with his regular crew consistently throughout the season to win this much coveted trophy.

The Tasman Trophy for Performance Handicap racing, which also embraces those races in the CYCA Blue Water series, was won by *Pretty Fly II*. Colin and Gladys Woods sailed a great season and while having a lot of fun won a series that is potentially the hardest one to win unless you sail very consistently throughout the season, as *Pretty Fly II* did.

Other major sailing events

The other major sailing events have been the CYCA Short Ocean Pointscore, Ocean Pointscore, Mount Gay Monday Spinnaker Twilight Series and the St Arnou Wednesday Twilight Series, which were all well supported amongst our members and other keen yachtsmen. The CYCA Short Haul group has continued to grow and have had some exceptional racing, further plans to stimulate this keen group are taking place for next season. The BMW Sydney Winter Series continues to have a record number of entries and proves popular which would indicate that the formula of pursuit-style racing is well-liked and will continue unchanged. The Club is a buzz every Sunday with the CYCA Breakfast Club providing a breakfast and a fun style atmosphere before racing, and a big thanks to that group for their contribution to our sailing.

On behalf of all CYCA sailors, congratulations should go to our Sailing Manager, Justine Kirkjian, who has provided the Club with another very successful year. Our racing has been conducted without any major issues and Justine and her team of Chris, Susan and Roger have worked very hard this year to ensure a difficult job is well done. Chris has recently stepped up to the plate whilst Justine is enjoying the arrival of her and Dave's young daughter Chloe.

Again this year, on behalf of all CYCA members and Yachting Australia members, I would like to thank one of our most valuable volunteers, Mervyn Clarke, who gives up his time in assisting boat owners and potential crew members to come together for sailing. Mervyn co-ordinates the list of crewing positions on boats and the list of owners looking for potential crew members and can be found in the Sydney Hobart Bar on most race days.

Sailing – our core business

The issues never seem to disappear and the responsibility to all sailors that the CYCA Sailing Committee has must surely ensure that this Committee must remain buoyant and capable of guiding the tough decisions toward the CYCA Board to consider. 2005-2006 was an extremely busy and successful year for the YSA. During the year we employed Suzzi Ghent as full time assistant coach. The combination of Suzzi with the support of Robert Bell and various Advanced Squad members has extended the YSA's capacity to run sail training programmes. During the year part-time coaches such as Dayne Sharp, have extended the skills of our top YSA sailors.

Youth Sailing ISAF World Championships

A highlight of the year was Evan Walker and Kyle Langford winning the Gold Medal at the Volvo Youth Sailing ISAF World Championships

in Korea. Both nominated the CYCA as their home Club and it is pleasing to see so many of our young sailors elect to represent our Club at national and world championship level.

The continued increase in the number of YSA sailors taking positions on keel boats during many of our Club races, both inshore and offshore, has been most pleasing to witness. Marina & Site Committee Report



Director Garry Linacre, Chairman

Once again it has been a very busy and productive year for the Marina and Site staff. Andy Payne the Operations Manager led the marina and maintenance team very effectively. We can be proud of the way our staff have served the members during this past year.

It was with regret we accepted the resignation of Andy Payne in April 2006. We wish Andy well in his new pursuits. Andy achieved a lot in his three years with the Club. We have been lucky to promptly find a well qualified and most suitable replacement for Andy. Brian McMahon has settled in to his position already and although it is early days it is evident that Brian is well suited to the task of overseeing our marina, site and various assets.

The sailing programme was as usual very full this year. All the major logistical tasks involving repositioning hardstand occupants to make way for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Media centre and relocating marina occupants was handled with utmost co-operation and a minimum of fuss. This was also true for installation and removal of the satellite transponders for all three long offshore races.

Fine tuning of the marina and site maintenance schedule continued. The Club now has various maintenance contracts in place for major plant and equipment items. Regular preventative maintenance is carried out which is resulting in a positive effect on departmental costs.

The marina has also been attended to by Bellingham Marine. Each year Bellingham checks and tightens all fastenings to ensure maximum performance and life from this important asset. Underwater contractors also attend to the pylons keeping them free of excess growth. This is an ongoing maintenance situation.

This year culminated our lengthy and comprehensive search for a suitable mark laying vessel. We now proudly boast ownership of the *MV Gordon Marshall*. This fine example of a Steber 36 in work boat configuration is proving to be a great asset in augmenting our race management tasks. The boat has been equipped with specially made ground tackle retrieving winch sourced from Italy. So far the new systems employed are working very effectively. The other boats in our fleet continue to be maintained in top condition and are also serving the Club well.



Clubhouse maintenance

The Clubhouse maintenance has continued throughout the year. We have also completed the soft refurbishment of the restaurant area. These subtle changes have added to the ambience of the area and are a definite improvement. We also carried out a refurbishment of the tiled areas in both ladies bathrooms.

Unfortunately I am unable to report on the progress of any works in the slipway area. The Marina and Site Committee through the Board are reviewing options and I hope to be in a position to present a report in the coming months.

The demand for marina berths is not subsiding in the least. Although plans were put in place to accommodate larger yachts and cater for our growing fleet in both length and numbers, we remain stretched. The Committee and staff are monitoring the non-activity of yachts with permanent berths on our marina. It is necessary for the Club to give priority to boats that are fully involved in our Club's activities and racing. The Committee is also looking at ways that we can reconfigure the marina within our existing lease area in order to cater for the shift to larger craft. We will remain vigilant in this area.

The marina staff have managed to run the marina very well in order to meet our budget expectations this year. That situation has been achieved.

In extending a vote of thanks to our marina staff I would also like to thank my fellow Committee members; Director John Walton, Andrew Copley, Karl Stechmann and Andy Offord.

Member Services Committee Report

Review and results of operations

The result from ordinary activities before tax for the year amounted to a net profit of \$344,176 compared with a loss of \$26,402 for the prior year, after adjustments have been made for AIFRS. This resulted after charging \$846,091 (2005: \$805,693) for depreciation and amortisation.

Dividends

The Company is a non-profit organisation and is prevented by its constitution from paying dividends.

State of affairs

In the opinion of the directors there were no significant changes in the state of affairs of the Company that occurred during the financial year under review.

Environmental regulation

The Company's operations are subject to various environmental regulations under both Commonwealth and State legislation.

The Board believes that the Company has adequate systems in place for the management of its environmental requirements and is not aware of any breach of those environmental requirements as they apply to the Company.

Likely developments

The directors do not anticipate any further development in the operations of the Club which will affect the results in subsequent years.

Events subsequent to reporting date

Hire purchase

The hire purchase for the marina was renegotiated subsequent to year end and extended for a further 5 years. Accordingly, the obligation recognised as a current interest bearing liability in the balance sheet in the amount of \$1,467,507 will not be required to be settled in full within 12 months of balance date, and it would now be shown as a non-current liability.

Indemnification and insurance of officers

The Company has provided for and paid premiums to the value of \$6,077 during the year for directors' and officers' liability insurance. The insurance is in respect of legal liability for damages and legal costs to a maximum of \$10,000,000 arising from claims made by reason of any omissions or acts (other than dishonesty) by them, whilst acting in their individual or collective capacity as directors or officers of the Company.

The insurance premiums relate to:

- costs and expenses incurred by the relevant officers in defending proceedings, whether civil or criminal and whatever their outcome; and
- other liabilities that may arise from their position, with the exception of conduct involving a wilful breach of duty or improper use of information or position to gain a personal advantage.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 31 March 2006

Significant accounting policies

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia ("the Company") is a company domiciled in Australia.

The financial report was authorised for issue by the directors on 25 May 2006.

(a) Statement of compliance

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards ("AASBs"), Urgent Issues Group Interpretations ("UIGs") adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ("AASB"), the Corporations Act 2001, the Registered Clubs Act and Gaming Machines Tax Act 2001. International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRSs") form the basis of Australian Accounting Standards adopted by the AASB, and for the purpose of this report are called Australian equivalents to IFRS ("AIFRS") to distinguish from previous Australian GAAP. The financial reports of the Company also comply with IFRSs and interpretations adopted by the International Accounting Standards Board.

This is the Company's first financial report prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, being AIFRS and AASB 1 First Time Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards has been applied. An explanation of how the transition to AIFRS has affected the reported financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company is provided in note 23.

(b) Basis of preparation

The financial report is presented in Australian dollars.

The financial report is prepared on the historical cost basis.

The preparation of a financial report in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates. These accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Company.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Judgements made by management in the application of Australian Accounting Standards that have significant effect on the financial report and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustment in the next year are discussed in note 1.

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently by the Company and to all periods presented in the financial report and in preparing an opening AIFRS balance sheet at 1 April 2004 for the purposes of the transition to Australian Accounting Standards – AIFRS.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

(i) Owned assets

Items of property, plant and equipment are stated at cost or deemed cost less accumulated depreciation (see below) and impairment losses (see accounting policy (g)).

Certain items of property, plant and equipment that had been revalued to fair value on or prior to 1 April 2004, the date of transition to Australian Accounting Standards - AIFRSs, are measured on the basis of deemed cost, being the revalued amount at the date of that revaluation.

Where parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items of property, plant and equipment.

(ii) Leased assets

Leases in terms of which the Company assumes substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership are classified as finance leases.

Lease payments are accounted for as described in accounting policy.

Property held under operating leases that would otherwise meet the definition of investment property may be classified as investment property on a property-by-property basis.

(iii) Subsequent costs

The Company recognises in the carrying amount of an item of property, plant and equipment the cost of replacing part of such an item when that cost is incurred if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are recognised in the income statement as an expense as incurred.

(iv) Depreciation

Depreciation is charged to the income statement on a straight-line or reducing balance basis over the estimated useful lives of each part of an item of property, plant and equipment. Land is not depreciated. The estimated useful lives in the current and comparative periods are as follows:

The residual value, if not insignificant, is reassessed annually.

Significant accounting policies (continued)

(d) Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are stated at their cost less impairment losses (see accounting policy (g)).

(e) Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and selling expenses.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash balances call and term deposits. Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the Company's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows.

(g) Impairment

The carrying amounts of the Company's assets, other than investment property and inventories (see accounting policy (e)) are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated (see accounting policy (i)).

An impairment loss is recognised whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash-generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised in the income statement, unless an asset has previously been revalued, in which case the impairment loss is recognised as a reversal to the extent of that previous revaluation with any excess recognised through profit or loss.

Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to cash-generating units (group of units) and then, to reduce the carrying amount of the other assets in the unit (group of units) on a pro rata basis.

(i) Calculation of recoverable amount

The recoverable amount of the Company's investments in held-to-maturity securities and receivables carried at amortised cost is calculated as the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the original effective interest rate (i.e., the effective interest rate computed at initial recognition of these financial assets). Receivables with a short duration are not discounted.

The recoverable amount of other assets is the greater of their fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset. For an asset that does not generate largely independent cash inflows, the recoverable amount is determined for the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

(ii) Reversals of impairment

An impairment loss in respect of a held-to-maturity security or receivable

carried at amortised cost is reversed if the subsequent increase in recoverable amount can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment recognised.

An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, if no impairment loss had been recognised.

(h) Interest-bearing borrowings

Current accounting policy

Interest-bearing borrowings are recognised initially at fair value less attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, interest-bearing borrowings are stated at amortised cost with any difference between cost and redemption value being recognised in the income statement over the period of the borrowings on an effective interest basis.

Comparative period policy

Interest-bearing borrowings are recognised at their principal amount, subject to set-off arrangements. Interest expense is accrued at the contracted rate and included in Note 10 *Trade and Other Payables*.

(i) Taxation

No provision has been made for income tax as the Company is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997), provided it continues as a sporting club predominately encouraging and promoting the sport of yachting, boating, cruising for pleasure and the building and sailing of yachts and boats. Accordingly tax affect accounting has not been adopted by the Company.

(j) Employee benefits

(i) Defined contribution plans

Obligations for contributions to defined contribution pension plans are recognised as an expense in the income statement as incurred.

(ii) Long-term service benefits

The Company's net obligation in respect of long-term service benefits, other than pension plans, is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods. The obligation is calculated using expected future increases in wage and salary rates including related on-costs and expected settlement dates, and is discounted using rates for Commonwealth Government bonds at the balance sheet date which have maturity dates approximating to the terms of the Company's obligations.

(iii) Wages, salaries, annual leave, sick leave and non-monetary benefits

Liabilities for employee benefits for wages, salaries, annual leave and sick leave that are expected to be settled within 12 months of the reporting date represent present obligations resulting from employees' services provided to reporting date, are calculated at undiscounted amounts based on remuneration wage and salary rates that the Company expects to pay as at reporting date including related on-costs, such as workers compensation insurance and payroll tax.

Significant accounting policies (continued)

Non-accumulation non-momentary benefits such as medical care, housing and free or subsidised goods and services, are expensed based on the net marginal cost to the Company as the benefits are taken by the employees.

(k) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are stated at cost.

(l) Provisions

A provision is recognised in the balance sheet when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. If the effect is material, provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows at a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability.

(i) Restoration costs

A provision for restoration costs is recognised when an obligation exists to restore certain sites for the effect of the Company's operations.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the restoration obligation at the reporting date. The amount is reviewed annually and changes recognised at the end of the reporting period.

(m) Revenue

(i) Goods sold and services rendered

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of beverage and other goods and is recognised in the income statement when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services to members and other patrons of the Company is recognised in the income statement when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due, the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably, there is a risk of return of goods or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

Subscriptions

Subscription fees are taken into account on an accruals basis and the portion relating to the ensuing year is transferred to subscriptions in advance.

Yard and marina

Yard and marina revenue consists of casual and permanent berthing fees, hardstand fees, locker fees and tender fees provided to members and other patrons of the club. Yard and marina revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided.

Sailing revenue

Sailing revenue consists of ferry charter fees, race entry fees, sponsorship and other associated income. Sailing revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided for all revenue except sponsorship which is recognised as it accrues.

(ii) Rental income

Rental income from property is recognised in the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives granted are recognised as an integral part of the total rental income.

(n) Expenses

(i) Operating lease payments

Payments made under operating leases are recognised in the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives received are recognised in the income statement as an integral part of the total lease expense and spread over the lease term.

ii) Finance lease payments

Minimum lease payments are apportioned between the finance charge and the reduction of the outstanding liability. The finance charge is allocated to each period during the lease term so as to produce a constant periodic rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability.

(iii) Net financing costs

Net financing costs comprise interest payable on borrowings calculated using the effective interest method, dividend income, and interest receivable on funds invested. Interest income is recognised in the income statement as it accrues, using the effective interest method. Dividend income is recognised in the income statement on the date the entity's right to receive payments is established which in the case of quoted securities is ex-dividend date. The interest expense component of finance lease payments is recognised in the income statement using the effective interest rate method.

(o) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority are classified as operating cash flows.

(p) Segment reporting

A segment is a distinguishable component of the Company that is engaged either in providing products or services (business segment), or in providing products or services within a particular economic environment (geographical segment), which is subject to risks and rewards that are different from those of other segments.

1. Accounting estimates and judgements

Management discussed with the Audit, Planning & Risk Committee the development, selection and disclosure of the Company's critical accounting policies and estimates and the application of these policies and estimates.

The Company's operations and customers are located predominantly in Sydney, New South Wales. The Company provides promotion for participation in yachting including the sport of sailing and ocean racing facilities.

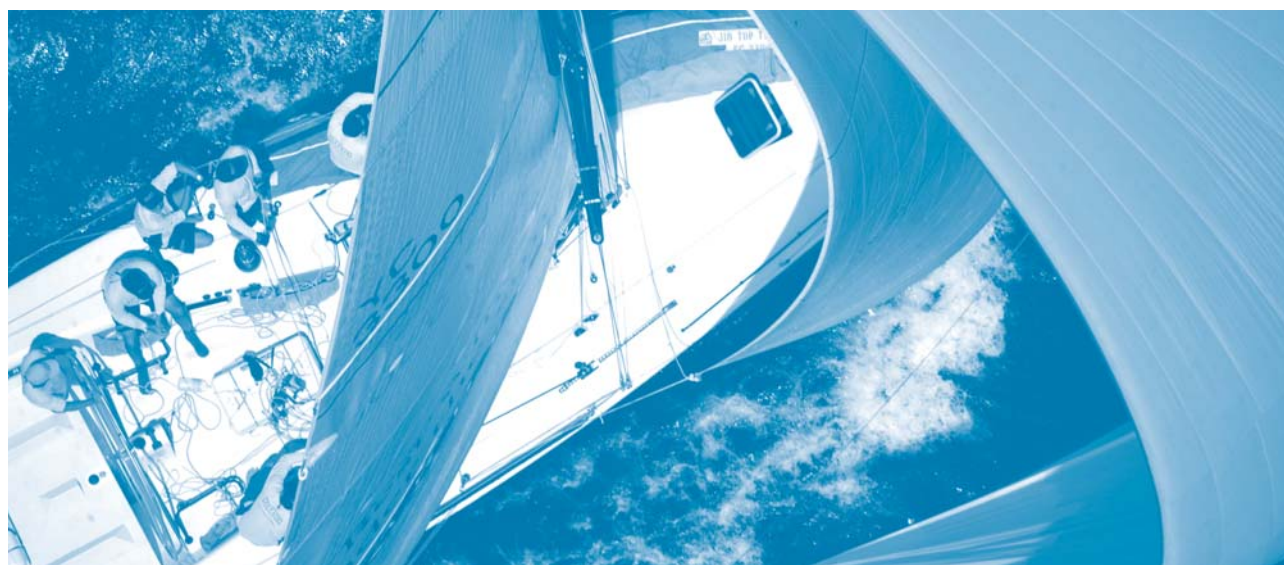

Scope
