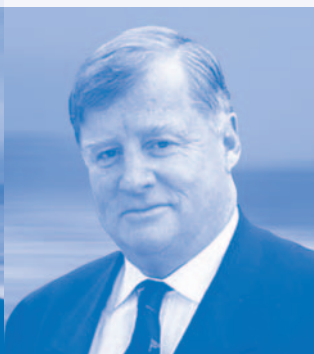

COMMODORE'S REPORT

COMMODORE GEOFF LAVIS



This is my second and final report as Commodore of this magnificent club. As I look back on the past two years (almost) I am amazed that the time has passed so quickly. Indeed I feel that I have had the pleasure of being Commodore during what I believe is a "golden" era for the club.

Financial Position and Sponsors

Financially we are in very sound condition. I made a pledge at the beginning of my term to at least maintain the already healthy financial position of the club. Two years later, and looking in to the future I can state that our financial position is substantially enhanced on that of two years past. There are of course a number of reasons for this, not the least being the already solid position of the club at the time I was elected Commodore.

During this last financial year we were indeed fortunate to attract Audi Australia as a major sponsor, having taken on naming rights to our northern offshore races, the Winter Series and principal supporter of our Youth Sailing Academy. They have signed with the club for an initial period of five years and together with the extension of sponsorship for five years by our major sponsor Rolex SA, sponsor of the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and Rolex Trophy, the club can look forward to the future with confidence. Of course Rolex and Audi are not the only sponsors. St Arnou and Mt Gay continue to sponsor our summer twilight racing and the many supporters of the Youth Sailing Academy and the Thursday Night Members' Badge Draw are greatly appreciated. These sponsors are listed in the reports from the training and development committee and the member services committee.

The strong financial position of the club is also a reflection of the skills and dedication of our staff, led by chief executive officer Mark Woolf. Our managers and staff share a common aim and that is to make the club successful in every way. The various operational areas of the club; sailing, (including both racing and cruising), youth training and development, marina, house and administration all strive for excellence. I have enjoyed a good rapport with all levels of the staff and they have been very supportive of me and indeed all the board.



Of course the club would not be in the position that it is without the continuing support of our loyal volunteers, be they on race committees, regular committees, emergency management teams, start boats, compliance auditors, assistance with finding new crew, the ever reliable Breakfast club or helping out in the information centre for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. The club is indebted to all of you and we wouldn't be the club that we are without your unselfish assistance.

Rolex Sydney Hobart Races

During my term as Commodore we have witnessed two very memorable Rolex Sydney Hobart races. The 2005 race was a big boat race that saw Bob Oatley's Wild Oats XI take out the triple of line honours, race record and the Tattersalls Cup. The 2006 race resulted in a swing back to the more traditional boats with Love & War taking the Tattersalls Cup for the third time, Bacardi in second place and Lou Abrahams third in Challenge. The 2006 race was certainly an eventful race with the sad loss of Ray White Koomooloo and the dramatic retirements of Maximus and ABN AMRO ONE, but the progress of Love & War up the leader board held the attention of all those watching the race until she docked. A number of other significant milestones occurred in the 2006 race including Lou Abrahams equalling the record of 44 Sydney Hobart Races and Phillips Foote Witchdoctor competing in a record 26 Sydney Hobart Races.

We would not be able to successfully run the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race without the support and assistance given by all the staff and volunteers at the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania. In particular the efforts of Commodore Marion Cooper and Immediate Past Commodore Robert Badenach must be applauded. We enjoy a good relationship with the club and they fulfil their role as finishing partners admirably.

Progress at the Club

Another commitment I made at the Annual General Meeting last year was to have a new Constitution for presentation to members prior to my stepping down. We have had two information evenings about the proposed changes with valuable input from those members who attended and it is my hope that a proposed Constitution can be placed before members for approval shortly.

Some progress has been achieved in planning for the future development of the slipway and car park area. The board has engaged the services of a facilitator in this field and are working with him to provide guidance in the best way forward. There are many obstacles to overcome and there will be a large future financial commitment. Plans and suggestions will be put to members in due course for comment and approval in a similar fashion as occurred with the redevelopment of the clubhouse building.

We have made good progress on achieving a long held aim – that is to produce a book on the history of the club. As chairman of the archives committee, director Rod Skellet has led his small but enthusiastic

committee towards the final goal of producing the book. Rod's committee report gives a full update on current progress.

I have been extremely fortunate to have the support of a very active and solid board over the last year. The board has functioned extremely well with thoughtful and meaningful input from all directors with a cohesive spirit that has resulted in a highly functional board. Every member has contributed and it was pleasing to see the newly elected directors so rapidly assimilate into their role. All committee chairmen have performed admirably during the year with good and useful recommendations coming to the board from the committees. The committees this year have been particularly active in recommendations to the board which reflects the careful selection by the chairmen of their committee members. Whilst not a board member, I would also like to recognise the efforts of Jeannette York and the associates committee for the continuing support that they give the club and the board.

The club enjoys a very high level of support and camaraderie with the other like clubs on the harbour and Pittwater. The Commodores of all clubs enjoy a strong rapport and the support that all clubs give to one another, particularly through their sailing activities, ensures that there is harmony on the water as we share a common goal of getting boats out on the race courses.

In closing, it is pleasing to note that at the end of the financial year our membership stood at 2,644, the highest number to date and I think that reflects the overall general feeling of satisfaction at the present time. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time serving as a director of the club and more particularly as your Commodore. The club is in good hands and has a bright and solid future ahead of it.

TREASURER'S REPORT

TREASURER PAUL BILLINGHAM

After the challenges of adopting the Australian International Financial Reporting Standards reported by my predecessor Graham Swan last year, I am pleased to report that this year has been much more straight forward.

Strong financial management, coupled with the support of the club's new and existing sponsors (notably Audi), has delivered a net profit of \$347,991 for the year (2006 \$344,177).

Financial summary

Profitability

This strong financial result was achieved without increasing either membership or marina fees during the year and was bolstered by the welcome sponsorship by Audi of the Youth Sailing Academy and Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race.

Perhaps the only disappointment in the results is the reduced contribution from bar trading during the year.

While this may be partially attributed to factors outside the club's control, including changes to the smoking regulations, petrol price rises and rising interest rates; a decision made not to pass on liquor price rises to members, who now enjoy a significant discount to non-members in the club's bars, has been a major contributing factor.

Nevertheless, with bar trading revenue down over 15% compared to 2006, club management will be focussing on ways of improving patronage over the coming 12 months.

Liquidity

Members will note that the club's liquidity position is steadily improving and I am pleased to report that the club has now repaid in full, all of the floating rate notes issued at the time of the redevelopment.

Early in the year the club also renegotiated its marina lease and the bulk of the interest bearing liability in the accounts is attributed to the marina. Aside from the liability for this lease (and certain other smaller leases in respect of the club's boats), the Club is now, for the first time in many years, debt free.

During the year the club reviewed its banking arrangements and, after a tender process, appointed Bankwest to replace Westpac as the club's bankers. The board is of the view that Bankwest is best placed to assist the club over the coming years as it enters the next stage of development and growth.

Capital expenditure

Members will have noted during the year that the restaurant and kitchen occupied by L eat Catering has been substantially refurbished, and a new public address system and telephone system installed.

No major projects are planned for 2007/08 other than the potential introduction of new accounting and database management software.

Outlook for 2007/08

As we look to the next phase of the club's development, it is my role as treasurer, together with the club's professional management team, to ensure that the club's financial position remains robust.

With this in mind, the club has prepared a conservative, balanced budget for 2007/08 that builds on the existing financial controls and processes and which, if delivered, will further improve the club's balance sheet strength.

The skills and dedication of the financial management team, led by Nina McKinnon, cannot be underestimated and I take this opportunity of thanking them for their professionalism and assistance during the year.

While the ongoing support of our valued club sponsors underpins the club's financial health, it is the patronage of the club and its facilities by members that is the lifeblood. I look forward to seeing you in the club and on the water over the coming 12 months.

AUDIT PLANNING & RISK COMMITTEE REPORT

VICE COMMODORE MATT ALLEN, CHAIRMAN

The audit, planning and risk committee has during this past year conducted a review of our banking and audit services in addition to the normal responsibilities detailed below.

Please refer to our Treasurer's report covering the review of our banking arrangements.

Your committee has felt it appropriate that we put out to tender the external audit of the club as we have had KPMG provide audit services for over 10 years. This follows accepted corporate governance guidelines that recommend a review of the auditor after such a period of time.

The committee's responsibilities include;

- Reviewing the adequacy of existing external and internal audit arrangements, the club's accounting policies and practices, the financial statements and the club's internal control systems.
- Giving the board additional assurance regarding the quality and reliability of financial information prepared for use by the board.
- Devising and implementing short term and long term plans.
- Reviewing rents and other periodic receivables of the company.
- Reviewing and approving draft annual budgets prepared by the management.
- Liaising with the club's external auditors and reporting to the board on the auditor's findings.
- Monitoring compliance with the club's and its subsidiary's statutory responsibilities including those under the Corporations Act, the Registered Clubs Act and environmental laws.
- Reviewing and renewing policy terms in relation to the club's insurances.
- Reviewing policies and procedures in relation to the club's risk management and making recommendations to the board as to appropriate risk management strategies.
- The monitoring of compliance with approved policies.
- Reviewing the club's compliance with taxation policies.
- Considering matters with relation to the club's information technology requirements.
- An ongoing audit of the procedures employed by the club in its conduct of its major races.
- Dealing with litigation and other claims against the club.
- Reviewing, negotiating and signing-off on all significant contractual arrangements and other long term commitments entered into by the club, including agreements with sponsors.
- The oversight of the CYCA Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS) Trusts.
- Commissioning and obtaining revaluations of our assets.
- With the assistance of Past Commodore Martin James review each Notice of Race and other documentation generated by the sailing activities of the club.

The committee has the benefit of some very capable people, namely; Past Commodore Martin James, Treasurer Paul Billingham, Rear Commodore Michael Cranitch and Past Treasurer Graham Swan. I thank them for their efforts.

The committee is fortunate to have a variety of backgrounds upon which to draw upon that include legal, banking, financial and accounting expertise.

As you will note from the Treasurer's report and the financial statements, your club is in a sound financial position. As we plan for the redevelopment of the car park and slipway areas of the club it is crucial that we continue with our fiscal disciplines.

I would also like to thank both our chief executive officer Mark Woolf and accountant Nina McKinnon who have helped enormously in the various responsibilities of the committee.

SAILING COMMITTEE REPORT

REAR COMMODORE GARRY LINACRE, CHAIRMAN

The 2006/7 CYCA sailing season has provided us with some wonderful and popular racing and a wealth of great competition. There have been very popular results in all categories of racing. Entry levels have been excellent and the sailing committee and summer sailing work group have been busy working to raise participation and competitor satisfaction.

While it still has its detractors, the IRC rating system is serving us well. We were fortunate to be granted a visit and some valuable clarification from Mike Urwin from the Royal Ocean Racing Club during December 2006. It is true that the IRC rule is addressing most of our members' concerns. The issues regarding canting keels and stored power are still with us but CYCA racing is moving forward and the IRC rule is gaining in momentum. The sailing committee is committed to maintaining a vigilant watch on this situation. We are happy to cooperate with members looking for improvement and welcome member input and feedback.

Thank you to volunteers

The CYCA is very lucky to have a wealth of keen, enthusiastic and capable volunteers who are supported by a great team of staff members led by Mark Woolf. To stage yachting events at the level we do requires a significant contribution from so many members however I would like to take this opportunity to make special mention of Richard Grubb and his team. With years of valuable experience the team on Offshore continue to provide us with excellent on water race management. There are too many to mention individually but may I single out Robyn Morton and Denise Van Ewijk.

International juror John Kirkjian heads up our rules committee base and handles our protest situations in a most satisfactory manner.

John's work in forming an international jury for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race is invaluable. John is helped by a (hopefully) expanding number of protest committee volunteer jurors. Tim Cox provides strong and effective chairmanship of our major event race committees. His experience and leadership brings a high level of management confidence to the events we conduct.

John Winning again this year provided his magnificent motor yacht JBW as Radio Relay Vessel for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and the Audi Sydney Southport Yacht Race. We are very grateful to John for assisting the Club and for the cooperation of his skipper Andrew "Steak" Copley. We must also acknowledge and thank David Kellett AM and his crew of radio operators, their service to our racing is immeasurable.

Special mention must also go to Colin and Denise Wilson for the wonderful contribution they have made in Eden for many years. The list of volunteers is very large and the club and sailing committee thank you all very sincerely.

Mervyn Clarke has again voluntarily provided a superb service in assisting boat owners and potential crew members find each other in pursuit of greater participation in our sport. Our recent research has shown the importance owners place on the ability to find crew and the sailing committee is looking at ways to make this an easier task. We believe this will be a major driver in lifting participation levels across our events.



The sailing committee is made up of volunteer members who are essentially boat owners from different racing and cruising groups within the club. This group serve the club very well and it is a privilege to chair such a group. I would also like to extend special thanks to Roger Hickman who chaired this committee for many years. We are fortunate to be left with the legacy of all the very hard work performed by Roger during his time as chairman and to him our thanks are extended.

Champions and notable results

This year the club's sailing season saw some very special achievements. The coveted Tattersalls Cup was won by the Kurts family's magnificent Love and War; most ably skippered by Lindsay May with a crew of primarily ex-Brindabella sailors including George Snow. This win was emotional, feel good and great for the race, the sport and our club.

For Ed Psaltis and Bob Thomas to prevail in our two most coveted summer series pointscores with their modified Farr 40 AFR Midnight Rambler is an exceptional performance. It was wonderful to see Ed fighting for this long awaited Blue Water win against overseas entrant Chris Bull who shipped Jazz from the UK and finished a commendable runner up to the AFR team. Let's hope we see more visitors for our summer pointscore events.

For the first time in over 30 years, AFR Midnight Rambler also won the Division 1 pointscore in the Short Ocean Pointscore. This was certainly a memorable year for a very good crew and a great achievement.

I would like to make special mention of our wonderful Short Haul Series, a very unique series that was originally created thanks to the drive of another famous club volunteer, John Keelty. Short Haul racing provides entry level, exit strategy, comeback friendly racing. It has an ocean aspect, does not require huge crew resources and has superb social aspects. This year, with some very close fought competition, Caprice of Huon skippered by David Champtaloup was the deserving winner.

Other noteworthy winners were Richard Cawse and the Vanguard crew in the Ocean Pointscore for the fourth consecutive time -a very special achievement. The beautiful John Illingworth designed Morag Bheag won both PHS and IRC divisions of Division 3 SOPS. This was great work by club handicapper John Maclurcan.

Other events

Our mid-week racing continues to thrive with over 25 regulars this year. Our very original Mount Gay Monday Series remains the only 'with spinnaker' racing option midweek Congratulations to Darryl Hodgkinson in Uplift for a hard fought win. The St Arnou Wednesday Series continues to attract large entry levels.

The Audi Winter Series is well under way. This year some minor changes have been made in an effort to improve the racing and competitors' enjoyment. We have separated the one design classes and given them fleet starts. The start time of the pursuit classes has been put back 30 minutes and we have shortened the courses around 10% in length.

Other Changes

This season, after significant consultation, a decision was taken not to sail to Mooloolaba. A strong desire was communicated from a wide range of owners as to the current unsuitability of Mooloolaba as finishing place for an ocean race. This was due to the absence of a club and a disciplined dredging regime for the entrance waterway. An equally strong message was conveyed that owners prefer to race to Southport in late July. Hence we moved the original Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race back to its traditional timeslot. Because of the popularity of Southport as a finish venue, the hospitality of the Southport Yacht Club and the quality of its facilities, the decision was taken to also sail to Southport in March this year.

The sailing committee is monitoring this situation. We maintain communication regarding the Mooloolaba situation as well as exploring other options for our March/April ocean race.

I would like to take the opportunity on behalf of all our sailors to convey sincere thanks to our sailing manager Justine Kirkjian and her team, Susan Veal, Amy Howie and Roger Wragby. It has not been an easy year in the sailing office. Due to unforeseen circumstances staff members were placed under extra pressure which they handled very well, covering when required and lifting when needed. We are lucky to have such a dedicated group. Their obvious desire to improve service to the members demonstrates dedication to the task.

The CYCA

The sailing committee of the CYCA has a great responsibility to foster the amazing traditions developed over 63 years by this great club. In providing first class racing across a wide spectrum with an emphasis on offshore events, it is important that we also cater for entry level participants in this sport. We aim together with our staff to fine tune the already excellent program, make it easier to enter, emphasise safety and make compliance logical and as simple as possible. We will improve our racing and its management wherever we find the need to do so. We aim to work closely with Yachting NSW and in turn with Yachting Australia in the development of our great sport of yachting.

TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

VICE COMMODORE MATT ALLEN, CHAIRMAN

The training and development committee's main function is to oversee the CYCA Youth Sailing Academy (YSA).

I am extremely pleased to report that the YSA has achieved a great deal throughout the last 12 months. The CYCA YSA is now the leading youth sail training facility in Australia. We are offering the next generation paths into sailing that I wish were available when I was in my youth. In turn, this is providing both our members and our sport with enormous long term benefits.

One of the features of the past year has been the obvious depth of sailing talent within the YSA which became apparent each time we sent our youth to their first regattas as CYCA representatives. We continue to have a policy of providing regatta opportunities to a wide range of sailors rather than just sending our number one ranked team to represent the club.

I have had the pleasure of taking a number of YSA and ex-YSA sailors with me to various regattas over the course of the last year and I have been very impressed with what I've seen. Increasingly other skippers are doing the same with positive results. This coming year, with the assistance of Pam Scrivenor, we intend to facilitate many more YSA sailors going out on a variety of CYCA yachts.

Another highly successful YSA initiative is the three youth squads that train over winter with selection the ultimate aim of many NSW youth sailors. In August we conducted an enlightening seminar on diesel engines that covered both how they work and how they should be maintained. Our presenter, David Giddings from Drive Marine Services runs the Advanced Diesel Maintenance Courses for the Royal Australian Navy. He covered all there is to know in order to demystify the workings of a diesel engine and also how to formulate a maintenance program for yachts that actually works.

In September we went on a most educational and entertaining visit to the Royal Australian Navy's new heritage centre at Garden Island. This was followed by a very pleasant ferry ride and long lunch at Watsons Bay.

In May this year we conducted our fourth Heavy Weather Sailing Seminar in order to inform those who attended on the best way to handle a yacht in hard to extreme conditions. Over 200 people attended the evening to hear our speakers Michael Spies, Ed Psaltis and Ian Treleaven recount their tales and give advice based on their actual experiences. This is a subject on which it is extremely difficult to get accurate practical information and will definitely be back on our agenda for next year.

Also in May we had our annual evening at the Sydney Fish Markets where we attended the Sydney Seafood School. This year we were shown how to cook and present Tapas which proved another great educational evening for all who like to cook and enjoy good food.

MARINA & SITE COMMITTEE

DIRECTOR ALAN GREEN, CHAIRMAN

The marina & site committee has had its most successful year in this key and critical area of the club. Sailing activities and events at the club are growing, resulting in an increased number of persons using the facilities. Maintenance of all our facilities and vessels is proceeding at a high level of efficiency and as a whole the marina and site program of maintenance and utilisation provided few problems due to the skills of our staff.

Difficulties in the marina waitlist area that have for years been unresolved or without an apparent solution have now been solved. This year, with a combination of previous and new committee members and an imperative to progress matters, great results have been achieved.

The quality of the workmanship in the marina as developed and supervised by our former Commodore John Messenger meant that maintenance issues were minimised. Similarly due to the ongoing work in maintaining the house, maintenance issues were minimal. Thanks to former Commodore Hugo van Kretschmar for his work in that area. We all benefit from the hard work that has been done in the past.

We are fortunate to have such wonderful facilities and with the ongoing improvements to and maintenance of the house this year, the clubhouse continues to provide a quality environment for its members.

Maintenance of the marina and the site are only a part of the responsibilities of this committee. The committee is primarily responsible for policy, with our good staff and our many supporters and contractors doing the work. The committee has also provided advice and direction on many other items of maintenance as they relate to the club's assets, such as looking after the hardstand, and the repair and maintenance of our start and coach boats. As part of the expertise of our new committee members, we have had the services of an architect and a builder this year. This has meant a very high level of advice regarding the maintenance of our assets.

The most important achievements this year have been a breakthrough in redrafting the Marina Licence Agreement, (many thanks to the efforts of director Howard Piggott) which will result in a more efficient allocation of permanent berths to members who actively participate in club events. To date the waiting time for berths has been seen as too long. In conjunction with the development of the new agreement, Scott and Frank have been working on developing a tracking and data analysis program for waitlisted marina applications. Their excellent work in this area will (in the long run) mean less waiting time, greater certainty and information for members on the wait list. Clearly those with vessels that will be actively used and participate in club events will continue to be given the highest priority.

An innovative plan to further extend the capacity of the marina has been developed by the committee. Again, we are working with former Commodore John Messenger to develop a plan to increase the marina capacity and therefore to further speed up berth allocations.

Another vexing problem has been car parking. The committee has struggled with this issue for some while. It is a problem that has not been resolved for many years. It is a well known that the club does not have sufficient car parking spots and at times cars seem to be parked on the club premises all day for no apparently good or valid reason. The club's by-laws are very clear on the rules regarding car parking. With the assistance of the board through the disciplinary committee there may be some light at the end of the tunnel. It is critical that on race days the number of spaces available is maximised.

None of these outcomes could have been achieved without the high calibre, the professionalism, and close working relations of the committee members and the club staff who work in this area. Special thanks to the committee members Geoff Bonus, John Cameron (one of the club's directors), Andrew Copley and Karl Stechmann. Also special thanks to our great marina staff Frank Bergmann, Scott Finsten and Brian McMahon. Without the work of this team we would be hard pressed to achieve the results we did. We were also fortunate that our chief executive officer Mark Woolf was able to join us at some of our meetings.

In conclusion, many thanks again to all the members of this committee, it has been an honour to work with you. You have made the meetings a joy. With a team like you, I am sure no problem is insurmountable.

ARCHIVES COMMITTEE REPORT

It has been a year of solid progress for the committee over the last 12 months with key developments in two major projects.

With board approval the archives committee purchased the appropriate computer hardware and software to digitise much of our hard copy archive material. Based in the temporary office on the old slipway, this equipment has been vital in enabling us to download and cross reference names, boats, dates and events. The first task taken on by David Colfelt, who advised the club on the purchase, has been scanning of our hard copies of Offshore Yachting magazine. The insurance is in respect of legal liability for damages and legal costs within an annual limit of \$10,000,000 (subject to a sub limit of \$5,000,000 per claim in any one insurance period) arising from claims made by reason of any omissions or acts (other than dishonesty) by them, whilst acting in their individual or collective capacity as directors or officers of the Company.

The insurance premiums relate to:

- costs and expenses incurred by the relevant officers in defending proceedings, whether civil or criminal and whatever their outcome; and
- other liabilities that may arise from their position, with the exception of conduct involving a wilful breach of duty or improper use of information or position to gain a personal advantage.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. REPORTING ENTITY

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia ("the Company") is a company domiciled in Australia. The address of the Company's registered office is 1 New Beach Road, Darling Point NSW 2027.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

(a) Statement of compliance

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards ("AASBs"), Urgent Issues Group Interpretations ("UIGs") adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ("AASB"), the Corporations Act 2001, the Registered Clubs Act and Gaming Machines Tax Act 2001. International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRSs") form the basis of Australian Accounting Standards adopted by the AASB, and for the purpose of this report are called Australian equivalents to IFRS ("AIFRS") to distinguish from previous Australian GAAP. The financial report of the Company also complies with IFRSs and interpretations adopted by the International Accounting Standards Board.

The financial report was authorised for issue by the Directors on 22nd May 2007.

(b) Basis of measurement

The financial statement is prepared on the historical cost basis.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

The Company's financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is the Company's functional currency.

(d) Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

Significant accounting policies

The accounting policies set out below have been applied to all periods presented in these financial statements.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

(i) Recognition and measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are stated at cost or deemed cost less accumulated depreciation (see below) and

impairment losses (see accounting policy (i)). The cost of property, plant and equipment at 1 January 2004, the date of transition to AASB's was determined by reference to its fair value at that date.

Cost includes expenditure that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the assets. Where parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items of property, plant and equipment.

(ii) Leased assets

Leases in terms of which the Company assumes substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership are classified as finance leases. Lease payments are accounted for as described in accounting policy (p). Property held under operating leases that would otherwise meet the definition of investment property may be classified as investment property on a property-by-property basis.

(iii) Subsequent costs

The Company recognises in the carrying amount of an item of property, plant and equipment the cost of replacing part of such an item when that cost is incurred if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are recognised in the income statement as an expense as incurred.

(iv) Depreciation

Depreciation is charged to the income statement on a straight-line or reducing balance basis over the estimated useful lives of each part of an item of property, plant and equipment. Land is not depreciated. The estimated useful lives in the current and comparative periods are as follows:

The residual value, if not insignificant, is reassessed annually.

(f) Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are stated at their cost less impairment losses (see accounting policy (i)).

(g) Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less any selling expenses.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

Significant accounting policies (continued)

(h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances, call and term deposits. Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the Company's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows.

(i) Impairment

The carrying amounts of the Company's assets, other than inventories (see accounting policy (g)) are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated (see accounting policy (j)(i)).

An impairment loss is recognised whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash-generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised in the income statement, unless an asset has previously been revalued, in which case the impairment loss is recognised as a reversal to the extent of that previous revaluation with any excess recognised through profit or loss.

Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to cash-generating units (group of units) and then, to reduce the carrying amount of the other assets in the unit (group of units) on a pro rata basis.

(i) Calculation of recoverable amount

The recoverable amount of the Company's investments in held-to-maturity securities and receivables carried at amortised cost is calculated as the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the original effective interest rate (i.e., the effective interest rate computed at initial recognition of these financial assets). Receivables with a short duration are not discounted.

The recoverable amount of other assets is the greater of their fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset. For an asset that does not generate largely independent cash inflows, the recoverable amount is determined for the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

(ii) Reversals of impairment

An impairment loss in respect of a held-to-maturity security or receivable carried at amortised cost is reversed if the subsequent increase in recoverable amount can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment recognised.

An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, if no impairment loss had been recognised.

(j) Interest-bearing borrowings

Current accounting policy

Interest-bearing borrowings are recognised initially at fair value less attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, interest-bearing borrowings are stated at amortised cost with any difference between cost and redemption value being recognised in the income statement over the period of the borrowings on an effective interest basis.

Comparative period policy

Interest-bearing borrowings are recognised at their principal amount, subject to set-off arrangements.

Interest expense is accrued at the contracted rate and included in Note 13 Trade and Other Payables.

(k) Taxation

No provision has been made for income tax as the Company is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997), provided it continues as a sporting club predominately encouraging and promoting the sport of yachting, boating, cruising for pleasure and the building and sailing of yachts and boats. Accordingly tax affect accounting has not been adopted by the Company.

(l) Employee benefits

(i) Defined contribution plans

Obligations for contributions to defined contribution pension plans are recognised as an expense in the income statement as incurred.

(ii) Long-term service benefits

The Company's net obligation in respect of long-term service benefits, other than pension plans, is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods. The obligation is calculated using expected future increases in wage and salary rates including related on-costs and expected settlement dates, and is discounted using rates for Commonwealth Government bonds at the balance sheet date which have maturity dates approximating to the terms of the Company's obligations.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION (CONTINUED)

Significant accounting policies (continued)

(l) Employee benefits (continued)

- (iii) Wages, salaries, annual leave, sick leave and non-monetary benefits

Liabilities for employee benefits for wages, salaries, annual leave and sick leave that are expected to be settled within 12 months of the reporting date represent present obligations resulting from employees' services provided to reporting date, are calculated at undiscounted amounts based on remuneration wage and salary rates that the Company expects to pay as at reporting date including related on-costs, such as workers compensation insurance and payroll tax.

Non-accumulation non-monetary benefits such as medical care, housing and free or subsidised goods and services, are expensed based on the net marginal cost to the Company as the benefits are taken by the employees.

(m) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are stated at cost.

(n) Provisions

A provision is recognised in the balance sheet when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. If the effect is material, provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows at a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability.

(i) Restoration costs

A provision for restoration costs is recognised when an obligation exists to restore certain sites for the effect of the Company's operations.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the restoration obligation at the reporting date. The amount is reviewed annually and changes recognised at the end of the reporting period.

(o) Revenue

(i) Goods sold and services rendered

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of beverage and other goods and is recognised in the income statement when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services to members and other patrons of the Company is recognised in the income statement when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due; the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably; there is a risk of return of goods; or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

Subscriptions

Subscription fees are taken into account on an accruals basis and the portion relating to the ensuing year is transferred to subscriptions in advance.

Yard and marina

Yard and marina revenue consists of casual and permanent berthing fees, hardstand fees, locker fees and tender fees provided to members and other patrons of the Club. Yard and marina revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided.

Sailing revenue

Sailing revenue consists of ferry charter fees, race entry fees, sponsorship and other associated income. Sailing revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided for all revenue except sponsorship which is recognised as it accrues.

(ii) Rental income

Rental income from property is recognised in the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives granted are recognised as an integral part of the total rental income.

(p) Expenses

(i) Operating lease payments

Payments made under operating leases are recognised in the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives received are recognised in the income statement as an integral part of the total lease expense and spread over the lease term.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

Significant accounting policies (continued)

(p) Expenses (continued)

(ii) Finance lease payments

Minimum lease payments are apportioned between the finance charge and the reduction of the outstanding liability. The finance charge is allocated to each period during the lease term so as to produce a constant periodic rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability.

(iii) Net financing costs

Net financing costs comprise interest payable on borrowings calculated using the effective interest method and interest receivable on funds invested.

Interest income is recognised in the income statement as it accrues, using the effective interest method.

The interest expense component of finance lease payments is recognised in the income statement using the effective interest rate method.

(q) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority are classified as operating cash flows.

(r) Segment reporting

A segment is a distinguishable component of the Company that is engaged either in providing products or services (business segment), or in providing products or services within a particular economic environment (geographical segment), which is subject to risks and rewards that are different from those of other segments.

(s) New standards and interpretations not early adopted

The Company's operations and customers are located predominantly in Sydney, New South Wales. The Company promotes participation in yachting including the sport of sailing and ocean racing.
