## COMMODORE'S REPORT

### **Commodore Matt Allen**

This past year has been a busy and productive one. The planning of the redevelopment of the premises by the Redevelopment Committee and the review of the Club's Constitution has added to the normal workload for the Board, Board Sub-Committees and many of our staff.

As you can see from the Directors' Meetings section later in this report a number of Directors, Members and staff have gone above and beyond their normal duties. I wish to thank all those involved in these Committees.

### **Financial position**

Your Board and management have been careful to ensure that the Club's financial position continues to strengthen. Given the backdrop of a looming recession we need to continue to be extremely prudent. The policies put in place some years ago have continued to serve the Club well. We have maintained membership subscription fees at the same level since 2004 which is evidence of good financial policies and careful management.

Our accounts are conservatively prepared and our budget for the current year is achievable and prudent. Please refer to our Treasurer, Paul Billingham's report for more detailed information.

### **Sponsors**

We are most fortunate to have the support of the foremost sponsors in the world of sailing. Our main sponsors – Rolex who sponsor the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and the Rolex Trophy Series and Audi, who sponsor the Youth Sailing Academy, the Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race, the Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race and the Audi Winter Series.

We are also well supported by St Arnou for the Wednesday Twilights Series, Mt Gay for the Monday Twilights Series and Grant Thornton for the Short Ocean Pointscore and Short Haul Pointscore.

The Club also relies on many other sponsors who support the Youth Sailing Academy, SOLAS and the Member Badge Draw. These sponsors are detailed elsewhere in the Annual Report, but I wish to record my thanks to them.

### **Thank you to our many volunteers**

This past year saw Richard Grubb retire as our Principle Race Officer. Richard has been our PRO since 1983. I wish to record our gratitude for all his efforts in the past and best wishes for the future.

The Club relies on many volunteers to make the Club function as well as it does. To the Board of Directors and the various Board Sub-Committees, the Associates Committee, the Breakfast Club, the Race Committees, Start Boat Teams, Information Centre Teams, Emergency Management Teams, SOLAS Trustees and the Cruising Committee, I wish to thank you all and encourage others to help as we cannot function as a Club without a strong and vibrant volunteer base.

### **Redevelopment**

The proposed redevelopment of our Club premises has received strong support from members. The community consultation process went very smoothly and we received favourable feedback from most who took the time to view our proposal. We are on track to lodge a development application soon. We will seek member approval prior to the commencement of the major part of the construction, but this is some time away.

The plans give the Club a long term premises plan, something that is essential given the superb location which we all enjoy.



### **Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race**

Our showcase race, the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race continues to grow. The 64th Race in 2008 demonstrated enormous interest via the daily newspapers, Network 7, Yahoo 7, our website and the approximately 500,000 people watching the start live on our beautiful harbour. There are few sporting events in the world that can boast a live audience of similar proportions to ours. The traffic on our website grew again to over 142 million total hits from over 4.3 million total visits. These website traffic statistics confirm that our race is of enormous world wide interest and compares extremely well against other events.

Bob Steel and his crew on Quest were popular and convincing overall winners of the race, and the feat of Wild Oats XI winning line honours for the fourth consecutive time was truly an exhibition of seamanship and great sailing achievement by the entire crew.

We marked the 10 years' anniversary of the tragic 1998 Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. We were all reminded that our pastime and sport can be a dangerous one. The wreath laying ceremony dockside in Hobart was very moving for all who attended, especially for the families present who had lost loved ones in the race.

The Club owes its gratitude to all those who help make the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race the iconic sporting event that it is today. I wish to especially thank our sister Club the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania for their continued support. Their members, Board, staff and volunteers all contribute to making the finish of our great race so memorable. Our partnership with the RYCT dates back to the beginning of the race in 1945.

### **CYCA SOLAS**

Our charity CYCA SOLAS has continued to grow in both awareness and in its support for the community. CYCA SOLAS has now contributed \$446,000 to search and rescue organisations, including donations in every Australian state and the ACT.

The majority of funding of CYCA SOLAS comes from you the members. We should all be proud of our contribution we make to the whole community, not just the boating community.

In May 2008 SOLAS made donations to NRMA Careflight to purchase three night vision goggles and to the Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Brisbane to assist with the refurbishment of one of their rescue vessels.

The Trustees are expecting a busy year ahead once the amalgamation of the various volunteer marine rescue organisations is completed which will lead to a rationalisation and standardisation of equipment. This may lead to significant

capital expenditure required by the new volunteer Marine Rescue NSW and we expect them to be applying for funding for various projects.

### **Constitution**

The Constitution Committee, chaired by Director Alan Green, have been extremely busy working on the rewrite. A draft document is now written and is being reviewed by the Board prior to being put to members. I would like to thank the members of the Committee for their painstaking work; Director Alan Green, Rear Commodore John Cameron, Tony Cable and John Keely.

### **Staff**

Our staff, led by our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf, has done a great job again this year. Their commitment and enthusiasm has enabled the Board to focus on policy issues and future directions for the Club, rather than day to day operational issues. On behalf of all members thank you to all staff for a job very well done!

### **Thank you to the directors**

As mentioned above it has been a demanding year for many Directors. I wish to thank all Directors for their commitment and application to their responsibilities. I am most fortunate to Chair a cohesive and very talented Board. It is a Board with many varied skills and talents which are so vital for the successful running of our Club.

I would like to especially thank the various Committee Chairmen for their support and efforts over the past year. It has made my work as Commodore a pleasure.

### **50 year membership**

Your Board introduced a new membership badge for 50 years including a discounted membership subscription for those members. At future Annual General Meetings of the Club members who have attained their 50 years of membership will be awarded with the badge.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

*Treasurer Paul Billingham*

My report for the year ended 31 March 2008 commented that "the Club will not be immune to worsening domestic economic conditions" this year:

Although the depth of the global financial crisis could not have been predicted at that time, I am pleased to report that through the ongoing support of members, sponsors and the business community, coupled with strong, proactive management from our professional team lead by Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf, the Club remains in sound financial health.

### Financial summary

For member's ease of reference, I summarise below certain key financial information over the last three years:

### **Profitability**

Before allowing for planning costs written off, the Club increased its year on year profit result by 24.6%. Largely achieved through tight control of overheads and strong debtor management, this result compensates for a slight drop in underlying bar and event trading performance.

Costs expensed on planning for the Club's redevelopment to date total \$396,198 with a further \$30,732 capitalised.

The Club anticipates incurring between \$120,000 and \$160,000 during 2009/10 to reach the stage where a Development Approval has been obtained however, this estimate is of course largely dependant upon any additional work the regulating authorities may require once the Development Application is lodged.

### **Liquidity**

The Club's working capital position has again improved – increasing to an excess of current assets over current liabilities of \$1,201,878 at 31 March 2009 compared to \$459,870 in 2008.

Cash holdings at the year end totalled \$2,056,398 (2008: \$1,530,338) and a pro-active, low risk, treasury strategy has meant that the Club has optimised its interest returns by selectively depositing funds with various Australian financial institutions and the NSW State Government guaranteed NSW Public Trustee. Interest earned in 2009 totalled \$142,859 (2008: \$92,420).

Aside from certain finance lease agreements, the last of which will expire by 31 March 2011, the Club has no debt and, perhaps more importantly in the current economic environment, no immediate need to secure credit facilities.

### **Capital expenditure**

Capital expenditure this year totalled \$167,669 with the majority spent on upgrading the Clubs computer hardware to reflect current and future expected needs.

Members will have noticed the installation of a new shade structure over the deck (at a cost of some \$15,000) however aside from the general maintenance of the Club's premises and boats, there has been little extra requirement in the way of capital expenditure to maintain the expected level of member services.

### **Outlook for 2009**

The Club's trading performance is very much dependant on member, sponsor and corporate support. To assist both the Board and management to proactively manage the Club's finances over the coming year, the Club has developed an integrated three-way forecasting model as a tool to project future financial performance up to three years ahead.

For 2009/10, the Commodore has announced there will be no increase in membership fees however, the Club has budgeted for a 5% increase in permanent marina berth fees effective 1 October 2009.

A prudent budget has been set factoring in reduced utilisation of the Club facilities by corporations, greater pressure on margins and reduced interest income.

Strong focus on cost control and several initiatives from the various committees, aimed at both increasing utilisation and reducing costs, have been incorporated into planning and the Club is forecasting a modest profit for the year.

Finally, while the Club's development planning process is expected to be completed during the year, it is unlikely that any work on the redevelopment will start before 31 March 2010 and no budgetary allowance has been made.

### **Summary**

Our Club has weathered the financial storm well and is in a robust financial position.

This is in no small measure thanks to the ability of our management team, led by Mark Woolf; the skilled and highly experienced finance team, ably led by Nina McKinnon; and the daily commitment of our Commodore to guiding the affairs and financial direction of the Club.

Our greatest financial challenges in the coming year will clearly be to keep a tight lid on costs; maintain utilisation of the Club by members and external corporations; and secure the ongoing and long term support of the Club's myriad of sponsors and supporters.

## SAILING COMMITTEE REPORT

The 2008/09 sailing season has again provided our fleet with a great variety of racing. Entry levels have been very satisfactory and the Sailing Committee continues to search for policy that provides our management team with a structure to seek improvement in our racing program.

Handicapping and rating systems as always generate robust debate among yachtsmen and women. The IRC system seems to be meeting our needs and expectations. The IRC database continues to grow and with it the database to improve the system. At this point the Sailing Committee see no better alternative for our major races. The Committee will continue to monitor the situation and research any alternative that is presented. It should be noted that the ORC system has a growing list of yacht owners showing interest. The CYCA policy is to co-operate with any group of owners who wish to test a rating system.

The Club has acquired the now well established Top Yacht software system. It is planned that our Sailing Office will bring more of our PHS handicapping in house. The Sailing Office used the Top Yacht system for the St Arnou and Mt Gay Twilight Series this summer season. This proved to be a success. We are now using the Top Yacht system to create the PHS handicaps for the Audi Winter Series and to date we are sure we are on the right track.

### Thank you to the volunteers

This year marked the retirement of Richard Grubb as the Club's Principal Race Officer. Richard served the Club for well over 20 years. Richard's service was marked by a thank you dinner in the Morna room attended by a list of special guests chosen by Richard. Commodore Matt Allen presented Richard with a magnificently framed CYCA burgee as a

token of the Club's appreciation. The core of Richard's team continue to serve with John Hurley acting as Race Officer. That team is; Maryrose Heffernan, Jane Stranger, Robyn Morton, Annie Aitken, Jennifer Birdsall, Steve Kidson, Doug Cairns, Debbie Wilson, Shaaron Walsh, Gail Lewis-Bearman, Dick Bearman, Valda Payne, Denise Van Ewijk. We thank you all whole heartedly.

John Winning and his family again offered the wonderful support of the magnificent JBW as our Radio Relay Vessel for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race. Thanks must go to the Winnings and to his skipper Andrew Copley.

Once again Past Commodore David Kellett AM and his team of radio operators provided us with an excellent communications situation for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race 2008, Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race 2008 and the Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race 2008.

Year after year our dedicated International Juror John Kirkjian helps us with our juries and protest committees. John represents the Club on the YNSW Racing Rules and Special Regulations Committees and continues to provide a high level of support to the Club on a range of fronts.

Tim Cox has again provided strong and effective chairmanship of our various major race Committees over the last year.

This year Director and Sailing Committee member Richard Cawse again provided communication support and assistance for retirements in Eden for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. He appointed an able assistant this year in Past Commodore John Messenger. Thanks go to Richard and John for their great work in Eden.



Robert Skol assisted us with the twilight races by helping to place crew on members' yachts. Rob's efforts continue to provide a wonderful and much needed service to members.

I was again privileged this year to chair the very strong group of individuals who make up the Sailing Committee. The Committee is formed by a dedicated and diverse group of members. I thank them for their input and support.

### **Our Offshore Race to Newcastle**

Our second Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race was a success with a significant lift in entry numbers. The Newcastle Cruising Yacht Club completed their magnificent Club house and it was in full swing as a great finishing venue for our second race. Reports were very good from all concerned and the Sailing Committee is hopeful of a significant lift in entries for the third race.

In the Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race 2009 Stephen Ainsworth's Loki was successful in taking out the double of Line Honours and IRC.

### **Champions and notable results**

The Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race is the final leg of the Blue Water Pointscore. This season David Beak and his Mr Beaks Ribs team were the worthy victors in this coveted pointscore. The Tasman pointscore was won by Greg Zyner's Copernicus.

The Ocean Pointscore IRC division was again convincingly won by Julian Farren-Price's About Time with an eight point difference to Dick Cawse's Vanguard in second place. Julian and his crew also won Division 1 IRC of the Short Ocean Pointscore. Richard Holstein's Next won the PHS Ocean Pointscore followed again by Vanguard in second place. Annette and Robin Hawthorn's Imagination took out the Grant Thornton Short Ocean Point Score Division 1 PHS Pointscore, with Howard Piggott's Brilliant the winner of Division 3 IRC. Division 3 PHS went to Eye Appeal sailed by Michael Delaney & John Markos.

This year in our wonderful Grant Thornton Short Haul series Baltic Lady sailed by Neil Burling had a convincing win in the Short Haul PHS Pointscore and Alex Brandon and James Connell's Zephyr took out the IRC pointscore.

Bob Oatley and his formidable Wild Oats XI team lead by Mark Richards achieved their fourth consecutive line honours victory in the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. This was a great achievement and not completed without very strong opposition from Grant Wharington's Skandia. Overall honours went for the second time to Bob Steel, this time with his well campaigned TP52 Quest, another TP52, Alan Whiteley's Cougar II finished a very creditable second overall in the race.

In other sailing, our Monday night Mount Gay Twilight Series grew both in numbers and quality. Clare Crawford's Assassin took out the Division 1 PHS pointscore by half a point from Love Byte. Ann and Bob Penty's well campaigned Big Blue won the Division 2 PHS pointscore from Yputakiteup and Superfine. The Wednesday St Arnou Twilight Series proved as popular as ever and we continue to attract excellent entry numbers.

We are now well into the Audi Winter Series. The Sailing Committee has effected some changes this year bringing the handicaps in house under the Top Yacht System. Entry numbers are excellent and we hope that the weather remains kind, fair and just windy enough.

### **The Sailing Office**

This is the second year I have enjoyed the privilege of working with Justine Kirkjian. Justine has chosen the career path of being a professional sports administrator. I can only say that we are lucky that she is administering our sport at our Club. Justine's professionalism, discipline and organisational skills are second to none. Justine is ably supported by Roger Wragby, Amy Howie and Stephen Craig.

The administration of the Youth Sailing Academy now comes under the umbrella of Justine Kirkjian's management. I am sure that the efficiencies and resource management of all our sailing activities being under one umbrella will serve the Club very well.

The Sailing Committee remains fully cognisant of our responsibility to this sport. The CYCA is the recognised leader in the sport of ocean racing. We aim to provide racing that suits the needs of our members. We seek to (where possible) introduce systems that make it easier to participate in this great sport. To this end may I encourage communication from all stakeholders of the Club's racing. The simple aim of the Sailing Committee is to provide the members with what they want in sailing.





## AUDIT, PLANNING & RISK COMMITTEE REPORT

This year has been a busy one for the Audit Planning & Risk Committee. The proposed redevelopment of the Club has required a number of meetings to consider the long term fiscal implications for the Club, and a consideration of the budget necessary to advance the project forward. In addition, the Committee has continued to attend to its functions on a case by case basis.

As the Treasurer's report indicates, the Club has had a pleasing year in terms of its management and profitability, which has lead the Audit Planning & Risk Committee to the view that the future development of the Club is sustainable, albeit in a staged manner. During the course of the year the Audit Planning & Risk Committee has relied heavily on Martin James to manage the documentation of the Club's sailing activities, which he has done in his usual exemplary fashion. The continued valued input of our Commodore Matt Allen and our Treasurer Paul Billingham has proved to be of enormous value in considering the matters which have passed before the Audit Planning & Risk Committee during the year. In addition, much assistance and legal input has been obtained from the most recent member of our Committee, John Markos.

Finally, the efforts of the Audit Planning & Risk Committee have been considerably aided by the input of Nina McKinnon. She has provided a solid input particularly in relation to the day to day financial affairs of the Club and long term planning in such matters as insurance and the like.

## CRUISING COMMITTEE REPORT

### ***Cruising Captain John Keelty***

Since the last Annual General Meeting CYCA Cruising has been quite active in many areas both in and outside the Club.

One significant event organised by the CYCA Cruising Committee members Denis Doyle, David Champstaloup and Andrew Hawkins, was the inaugural Club Marine Cruise to Hobart.

Although not starting on Boxing Day as a race as the original event ended up doing, it in fact carried out the original intentions set out by our Club's founders by carrying out a genuine cruise in company from Sydney to Hobart.

Five yachts participated in this years cruise: Caprice of Huon (CYCA Cruising Committee member David Champstaloup), Sextant (CYCA Cruising Committee member Denis Doyle), Plum Crazy (Tig Thomas, MHYC), Sue Sea (Royal Perth Yacht Club) and giving the event an international flavour Maamalni (Seattle Yacht Club, USA).

The cruise offered a far different perspective than that of a race, the only stipulation being that they arrive in Hobart on a pre-determined date in order to enjoy the wonderful dinner provided by the event sponsor Club Marine. They could leave from Sydney whenever they liked and enjoy the pleasures of cruising in company on the way down, which was in fact the Club founders' original intent.

This was the first of the 'long cruise in company' events planned by CYCA Cruising, with a cruise to Newcastle being planned for 2009 and another cruise to Hobart planned for 2010.

### **Calling interested members to participate**

CYCA Cruising will be forming a sub-committee to develop these and other future cruising events so if you have an interest in joining this committee, or participating in this style event please contact us.

The other significant CYCA Cruising achievement will be the rolling out of the Medical Management for Mariners (MMM) course, which is due to commence in August this year:

This course has been formulated to show both cruising and racing sailors the best hands on way to handle a medical situation should it arise when they are hours and even days away from professional medical assistance. To be known as the CYCA MMM course it will be taught at the Don Harrison Simulation Centre at St Vincent's Hospital Darlinghurst and will cover most life threatening problems that could be encountered and require management beyond first aid, such as stroke, heart attack, dehydration caused by sea sickness, broken bones, amputations, spinal injuries and other life threatening problems.

Using the simulation centre allows us to create an actual scenario using the 'Sim Man', a mannequin that actually breathes, has a pulse, can speak and bleed just as a human can, which allows the scenario to be most realistic. His use allows us to have hands on experience of treating the problems.

The Yachting NSW Annual Cruising Get-together was held at the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club this year. Several CYCA members attended and presented a copy of "From Ratbags to Respectability" to the RPAYC Cruising Committee.

In October Denis Doyle and team presented a very informative and practical educational seminar on using mobile IT systems. The evening explored practical and inexpensive methods to get connected whilst on the water and demonstrated email, sat phone, HF and Skype options in layman's terms.

Unfortunately we were unable to conduct our annual Man Overboard/ Safety Day due to the busy calendar, however this is seen as one of our key events and shall be held in the near future. These days allow us to show members new technologies in life saving equipment such as the new MOB location device called the MOBILARM V100. This device will greatly contribute to the safe recovery of a man overboard as the device automatically transmits a man overboard mayday alert when it detects the wearer has gone overboard. It transmits the MOB mayday signal, including GPS coordinate data on an ongoing basis, via the VHF radio to all vessels in the area monitoring Channel 16 including the VHF on the vessel the MOB has fallen off, which will greatly increase the chances of that person being rescued especially in Club offshore events. As indicated we plan to show it at a MOB Day in the very near future.

The annual Cruising Christmas party was held in conjunction with the Blues Point Yacht Club at Lavender Bay and we enjoyed a great day, both on and off the water:

## MARINA & SITE COMMITTEE REPORT

**Director Alan Green, Chairman**

Another year passes with the Marina and Site Committee having the same members as the previous years. This has resulted in another successful year. This is the best Committee I have had the pleasure to sit on or chair over the last 13 years that I have been on the Board. It has successfully considered several of the difficult issues that have not been resolved in the past. The results are showing up in the main area of permanent berthing, which has been the number of members waiting for permanent berths and the number of vessels that do not appear to be active. This problem is clearly being resolved with more and more members having signed the new marina licence, and several members either removing their vessels from the marina or making an effort to use their vessels more actively. In addition the number of permanent allocations is increasing. Certainly the waiting list is still too long, and we only wish for a far larger marina, but the steady progress made reflects the quality of the advice given to the Board by this Committee. Members should be aware that we are still working to improve on what is already a better outcome than in the past. The introduction of the new marina software system has enabled us to obtain better data and maintain better control of the marina so that members waiting for berths can be given more and better information.

The other major issue of car parking has not been fully resolved but investigations have been undertaken and our Chief Executive Officer has spoken with certain members. We have developed some solutions to this real long term problem that we hope will be implemented after the study of possible solutions is completed. The Club does not have enough car parking spots. The Club's By-Laws are very clear on the rules regarding car parking. It is critical that on any race day that the number of spaces available is maximised. We want to encourage members to come to the Club to sail their boats.

Sailing activities and events at the Club are growing ever more strongly in their popularity, meaning an increasing number of persons are using the Club facilities.

Maintenance of all our facilities and supporting vessels is proceeding at a high level of efficiency. The quality of our marina, our sailing support facilities and our site maintenance programme is due to the application and skills of our staff. Problems that have arisen have been promptly reported and are addressed as quickly as possible. Past Commodore John Messenger maintained a watchful eye and drew our attention to some issues and problems with the maintenance of the marina. Thank you John.

Maintenance issues on the marina continue to be minimised by implementing regular inspections and preventative work. However, it is up to all members to look after what we have. When we spill paint or damage the marina it is critical that the matter is promptly reported and a cleanup is implemented. If there is an issue, members should draw the attention of staff to the problem. In this way we will keep right on top of any emerging issues.

Once again the policy of the maintenance of the marina and all of the Club's facilities have been part of the responsibilities of this Committee. We have established a database of precedent issues so that uniformity of decision making going forward can be implemented. Transparency and ethical correctness are the corner stones in our policy development. In fact, all our staff, many supporters and contractors are doing the real work in looking after what we have. Without those key personnel the quality of the maintenance carried out would decline.

I have said the following previously and I have said it at many Board meetings that none of these outcomes that I report here could have been achieved without the high calibre, the professionalism, and close working relations of the Committee members and the Club staff who work in this area. My sincere thanks to the Committee members Director Geoff Bonus, Rear Commodore John Cameron, Andrew Copley and Karl Stechmann. Based on the expertise of these people we have a very high level of advice regarding the maintenance of our assets. Again, special thanks to our great operations and marina staff; Brian McMahon, Frank Bergmann, and Scott Finsten. Without the work of this team we would be hard pressed to achieve the results that we did. They have been capably directed by our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf who also attended our Committee meetings.

In conclusion, heartfelt thanks to all the members of this Committee, it has been fun and a great and special honour to work with such an efficient team as you are. You have made the meetings a joy. I repeat what I said over the last few years that I have chaired this Committee... "with a team like you, I am sure that there is no problem that could not be solved." It has been a personal honour to work for the Club in this important area.

The company has provided for and paid premiums to the value of \$6,000 during the year for directors' and officers' liability insurance. - costs and expenses incurred by the relevant officers in defending proceedings, whether civil or criminal and whatever their outcome; and
- other liabilities that may arise from their position, with the exception of conduct involving a wilful breach of duty or improper use of information or position to gain a personal advantage.



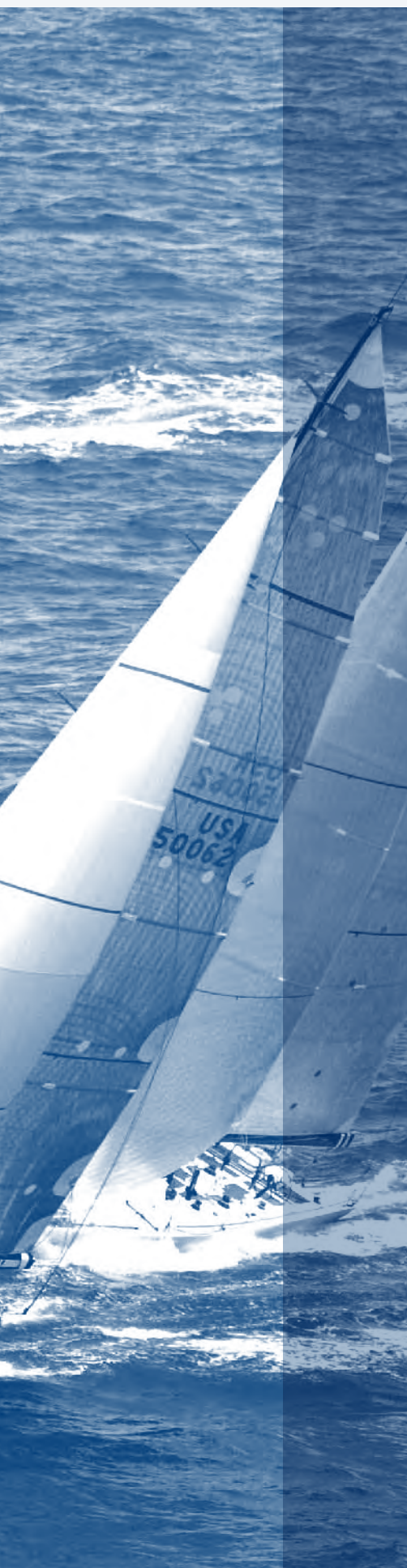

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 March 2009

### 1. General information

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia ("the Company") is a company limited by guarantee and operating in Australia.

In accordance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia, every member of the company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company in the event of it being wound up, whilst he or she is a member or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up such as may be required, not exceeding \$2 per member.

The company has 2,701 members at year end.

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia's registered office and its principal place of business are as follows:

### 2. Adoption of new and revised Accounting Standards

In the current year, the company has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (the AASB) that are relevant to its operations and effective for the current annual reporting period. The adoption of these new and revised Standards and Interpretations has resulted in no changes to the company's accounting policies.

At the date of authorisation of the financial report, the following Standards and Interpretations were on issue but not yet effective:

These Standards and Interpretations will be first applied in the financial report of the company that relates to the annual reporting period beginning after the effective date of each pronouncement.

### 3. Significant accounting policies

#### Statement of compliance

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001, Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and complies with other requirements of the law including the Registered Clubs Act and Gaming Machines Tax Act 2001.

Accounting Standards include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ('A-IFRS'). A statement of compliance with IFRS cannot be made due to the application of not for profit sector specific requirements contained in the A-IFRS.

The financial statements were authorised for issue by the directors on 19 May 2009.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost, except for the revaluation of certain non-current assets and financial instruments. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

In the application of the company's accounting policies, which are described within this note, management is required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstance, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Judgements made by management that have significant effects on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustments in the next year are disclosed, where applicable, in the relevant notes to the financial statements.

Accounting policies are selected and applied in a manner which ensures that the resulting financial information satisfies the concepts of relevance and reliability, thereby ensuring that

the substance of the underlying transactions or other events is reported.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report:

#### (a) Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

#### (b) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits. Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value and have a maturity of three months or less at the date of acquisition.

Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities in the balance sheet.

#### (c) Employee benefits

A liability is recognised for benefits accruing to employees in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave and long service leave when it is probable that settlement will be required and they are capable of being measured reliably.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits expected to be settled within 12 months, are measured at their nominal values using the remuneration rate expected to apply at the time of settlement.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits which are not expected to be settled within 12 months are measured as the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made by the company in respect of services provided by employees up to reporting date.

#### Defined contribution plans

Contributions to defined contribution superannuation plans are expensed when employees have rendered service entitling them to the contributions.

#### Long term service benefits

The Company's net obligation in respect of long-term service benefits, other than pension plans, is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods. The obligation is calculated using expected future increases in wage and salary rates

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the financial year ended 31 March 2009 (continued)

including related on-costs and expected settlement dates, and is discounted using rates for Commonwealth Government bonds at the balance sheet date which have maturity dates approximating to the terms of the Company's obligations.

**(d) Financial assets**

**Loans and receivables**

Trade receivables, loans, and other receivables that have fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market are classified as 'loans and receivables'. Loans and receivables are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment.

Interest is recognised by applying the effective interest rate.

**Effective interest method**

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and of allocating interest income over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts (including all fees on points paid or received that form an integral part of the effective interest rate, transaction costs and other premiums or discounts) through the expected life of the financial asset, or, where appropriate, a shorter period.

Income is recognised on an effective interest rate basis for debt instruments other than those financial assets 'at fair value through profit or loss'.

**Impairment of financial assets**

Financial assets, other than those at fair value through profit or loss, are assessed for indicators of impairment at each balance sheet date. Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset the estimated future cash flows of the investment have been impacted. For financial assets carried at amortised cost, the amount of the impairment is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the original effective interest rate.

The carrying amount of the financial asset is reduced by the impairment loss directly for all financial assets with the exception of trade receivables where the carrying amount is reduced through the use of an allowance account. When a trade receivable is uncollectible, it is written off against the allowance account. Subsequent recoveries of amounts

previously written off are credited against the allowance account. Changes in the carrying amount of the allowance account are recognised in profit or loss.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the previously recognised impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss to the extent the carrying amount of the investment at the date the impairment is reversed does not exceed what the amortised cost would have been had the impairment not been recognised.

**(e) Financial instruments issued by the company**

**Debt and equity instruments**

Debt and equity instruments are classified as either liabilities or as equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement.

**Financial liabilities**

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or loss' or other financial liabilities.

**Other financial liabilities**

Other financial liabilities, including borrowings, are initially measured at fair value, net of transaction costs.

Other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, with interest expense recognised on an effective yield basis.

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial liability and of allocating interest expense over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liability, or, where appropriate, a shorter period.

**(f) Impairment of other tangible and intangible assets**

At each reporting date, the company reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any). Where the asset does not generate cash flows that are independent from other assets, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the financial year ended 31 March 2009 (continued)

Where a reasonable and consistent basis of allocation can be identified, corporate assets are also allocated to individual cash-generating units, or otherwise they are allocated to the smallest group of cash-generating units for which a reasonable and consistent allocation basis can be identified.

Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset for which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the relevant asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation decrease.

Where an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount, but only to the extent that the increased carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset (cash-generating unit) in prior years. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss immediately, unless the relevant asset is carried at fair value, in which case the reversal of the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation increase.

#### **(g) Income tax**

No provision has been made for income tax as the Company is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997), provided it continues as a sporting club predominately encouraging and promoting the sport of yachting, boating, cruising for pleasure and the building and sailing of yachts and boats. Accordingly tax affect accounting has not been adopted by the Company.

#### **(h) Inventories**

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs, including an appropriate portion of fixed and variable overhead expenses, are assigned to inventory on hand by the method most appropriate to each particular class of inventory, with all categories being valued on a first in first out basis. Net realisable value represents the estimated

selling price less all estimated costs of completion and costs necessary to make the sale.

#### **(i) Leases**

Leases are classified as finance leases when the terms of the lease transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of the leased asset to the lessee. All other leases are classified as operating leases.

##### **Finance leases**

Assets held under finance leases are initially recognised at their fair value or, if lower, at amounts equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, each determined at the inception of the lease. The corresponding liability to the lessor is included in the balance sheet as a finance lease obligation.

Lease payments are apportioned between finance charges and reduction of the lease obligation so as to achieve a constant rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability. Finance charges are charged directly against income, unless they are directly attributable to qualifying assets, in which case they are capitalised in accordance with the company's general policy on borrowing costs. Refer to note 3(a). Contingent rentals are recognised as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Finance leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over the estimated useful life of the asset.

##### **Operating leases**

Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term, except where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed. Contingent rentals arising under operating leases are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

##### **Lease incentives**

In the event that lease incentives are received to enter into operating leases, such incentives are recognised as a liability. The aggregate benefits of incentives are recognised as a reduction of rental expense on a straight-line basis, except where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the financial year ended 31 March 2009 (continued)

**(j) Property, plant and equipment**

Plant and equipment, leasehold improvements and equipment under finance lease are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the item. In the event that settlement of all or part of the purchase consideration is deferred, cost is determined by discounting the amounts payable in the future to their present value as at the date of acquisition.

Depreciation is provided on property, plant and equipment, including buildings on leasehold land. Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the net cost or other revalued amount of each asset over its expected useful life to its estimated residual value. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the period of the lease or estimated useful life, whichever is the shorter, using the straight line method. The estimated useful lives, residual values and depreciation method are reviewed at the end of each annual reporting period, with the effect of any changes recognised on a prospective basis.

The gain or loss arising on disposal or retirement of an item of property, plant and equipment is determined as the difference between the sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognised in profit or loss.

The following estimated lives are used in the calculation of depreciation:

Leasehold improvements	5 – 33 years / term of the lease
Boats	2 – 8 years
Plant and equipment	2 – 8 years

**(k) Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that the company will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of the consideration required to settle the present obligation at reporting date, taking into account the risks and uncertainties surrounding the obligation. Where a provision is measured using the cashflows estimated to settle the present obligation, its carrying amount is the present value of those cashflows.

When some or all of the economic benefits required to settle a provision are expected to be recovered from a third party, the receivable is recognised as an asset if it is virtually certain that reimbursement will be received and the amount of the receivable can be measured reliably.

**Restoration costs**

A provision for restoration costs is recognised when an obligation exists to restore certain sites for the effect of the company's operations.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the restoration obligation at the reporting date. The amount is reviewed annually and changes recognised at the end of the reporting period.

**(l) Revenue**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

**Goods sold and services rendered**

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of beverage and other goods and is recognised in the income statement when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services to members and other patrons of the Company is recognised in the income statement when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due; the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably; there is a risk of return of goods; or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

**Subscriptions**

Subscription fees are taken into account on an accruals basis and the portion relating to the ensuing year is transferred to subscriptions in advance.

**Yard and marina**

Yard and marina revenue consists of casual and permanent berthing fees, hardstand fees, locker fees and tender fees provided to members and other patrons of the Club. Yard and marina revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the financial year ended 31 March 2009 (continued)

**Sailing revenue**

Sailing revenue consists of ferry charter fees, race entry fees, sponsorship and other associated income. Sailing revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided for all revenue except sponsorship which is recognised as it accrues.

**Rental income**

Rental income from property is recognised in the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives granted are recognised as an integral part of the total rental income.

**Interest revenue**

Interest revenue is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount.

**(m) Goods and Services Tax**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except:

- i). where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority, it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense; or
- ii). for receivables and payables which are recognised inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as part of receivables or payables.

Cash flows are included in the cash flow statement on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.
