

COMMODORE'S REPORT

Commodore Matt Allen

I would like to thank you for allowing me to serve a third and final term as your Commodore.

Your Board has been busy working on a number of strategic initiatives important for the future of your Club. I am very pleased with the progress made and would like to congratulate the members of the Board and the various Committee's involved, and our staff.

Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race

Mark Woolf and I recently met with Rolex in Geneva to discuss the renewal of the sponsorship of the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. There was broad agreement on the terms of the renewal of the sponsorship until the 2015 edition of the race. Once the details have been approved by both parties we plan to make a formal announcement.

We should all be proud that the profile of the event has continued to grow strongly since Rolex became naming rights sponsor in 2002. Two True's victory in 2009 continued to confirm that this is not a grand prix only race! Congratulations to Two True and to line honours winner Alfa Romeo.

The coverage from both yachting and mainstream media is better than ever before and importantly there are few races which carry the attention of sailors worldwide as the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. The 2009 race was testament of the status of our race for the entire world.

As I said in Hobart this year, the race has never been in better shape but I'm sure her best years are ahead.

Sponsors

The CYCA is extremely fortunate to have the support of the foremost sponsors in the domain of sailing. Our main sponsors Rolex SA and Audi Australia are the mainstays of



our sponsorship for our major events. Audi are naming rights sponsor for the Youth Sailing Academy, Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race, Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race and the Audi Winter Series.

We are also well supported by St Arnou for the Wednesday Twilight Series, Mt Gay for the Monday Twilight Series and Grant Thornton for the Short Ocean Pointscore and Short Haul Pointscore.

The Club also enjoys support from many other companies who partner our Members Badge Draw and support the Youth Sailing Academy. These sponsors are detailed elsewhere in this Annual Report. I would ask that you support them where possible.

Financial Position

I'm very pleased with our financial results this year. Both management and the Board have been very careful to continue the policies from previous years to ensure that the balance sheet is strong enough to tackle the proposed redevelopment of the premises. We have taken the vast bulk of the costs relating to the redevelopment into our expenses rather than capitalising them.

I'm also proud that membership subscriptions have been kept at the same levels as last year, in fact they have only increased by 3% since 2001.

The Club will be debt free early in 2011, just in time for the anticipated start of the redevelopment project.

Please refer to our Treasurer, Paul Billingham's report for more detailed information.

Flinders Islet

2009 will be remembered as the year when we lost our two great friends Andrew Short and Sally Gordon during a race around Flinders Islet in early October. Our thoughts remain with their families and friends.

I would like to thank the CYCA commissioned internal Inquiry Committee Chaired by Rear Admiral Chris Oxenbould AO RAN (Rtd) and Past Commodores David Kellett AM and John Brooks for their fine efforts in presenting such a detailed and carefully considered report.

All the recommendations made by the Inquiry Committee were accepted by the Board and have either been implemented or passed on to Yachting NSW and Yachting Australia for their consideration. I would like to encourage YNSW and YA to consider the Committee's recommendations at their earliest convenience.

Constitution

The Constitutional Review Committee Chaired by Rear Commodore John Cameron has finalised their enormous task of rewriting our Club Constitution. I would like to thank John and his fellow Committee members Alan Green, and Life Members Tony Cable and John Keelty for their considerable efforts to get us to the point of having a modern and relevant Constitution for our Club. Director John Markos also assisted enormously by ensuring that the language and format of the document is compliant.

By the time you receive this report the proposed Constitution would have been presented to members via special resolution at an Extraordinary General Meeting on Tuesday 15 June.

Your Board unanimously accepted the document to put to members for adoption.

Redevelopment of Premises

I am very pleased that we now have a long term plan for our premises. That view is also shared by our landlords and the community from the feedback that we received during the community consultation process conducted prior to the development application being lodged with Woollahra Municipal Council back in August 2009.

On instruction from Council we have had to make an alteration to the plan of the basement level car park which required us to submit an amended development application.

Once our application is assessed by council officers a report will be forwarded to the Sydney East Joint Regional Planning Panel who in our case will act as the consent authority. We are hoping a determination will be provided by August.

Once approval is granted we are planning for the project to be completed in stages. The Board will seek member approval prior to the commencement of any work which requires the Club going into debt.

I would like to thank the Chairman of the Redevelopment Committee Rear Commodore John Cameron, and Director Geoff Bonus and our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf for their work on this important project.

CYCA SOLAS

It has been pleasing to see that SOLAS has come to be better known and better funded during the last few years. SOLAS has now donated more than \$550,000 to search and rescue organisations around Australia. SOLAS last year jointly won the Yachting Australia Presidents Award. The SOLAS Big Boat Challenge allows us to remind sailors of the SOLAS Trusts objectives each year.

We now get regular donations from a number of sources including Sydney Cove Rotary following each year's Rotary Regatta.

Please remember that CYCA SOLAS is our own charity supporting sailors and the whole community.

Archives

Since the publication of the history of the CYCA 'From Ratbags to Respectability' the Archives Committee has been working on two new projects.

The first one is led by Director David Champtaloup and Peter Shipway. The aim is to record video interviews of all our notable ocean racers to keep as a reference for future generations. We are aiming to record some stories about the earlier days of our sport and the way they approached various races and campaigns.

The second project is to digitise our film and video library and we ask for more material from our members and friends to enhance our collection. Steve Old has completed the digitisation project of our existing material and is now ready to work on new footage, slides and photos. Please contact the Club if you have any material for our archives.

Volunteers

The CYCA relies on many volunteers for its various activities. I would like to thank you all and encourage you to keep volunteering. I hope you find it fulfilling. To those who are thinking of assisting, please step forward as we need members to assist in a range of areas. There are many different jobs to do, with at least one to suit you. Currently we are very keen to recruit volunteers for the Breakfast Club during the Audi Winter Series for 2011.

Board

I have had the pleasure of chairing a most collegiate and cohesive Board. The current Board has a diverse set of skills and has worked very hard for the long term benefit of all stakeholders of the CYCA. I would like to thank the Board

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Paul Billingham

I am pleased to report that with an annual audited profit of \$373,888, exceeding both the 2009/I0 budgeted profit and the 2008/9 annual result by circa 50%, the Club has enjoyed another excellent year – despite a slight drop in underlying trading.

Liquidity remains strong, with cash reserves at the year end topping \$3m for the first time, and with the Club now into the final year of its remaining equipment leases, should be debt free by the end of the financial year 2010/11.

The Club is accordingly in a robust financial position and well placed for its future redevelopment.

Financial summary

For members' ease of reference, as I have done previously, I summarise below certain key financial information over the last three years:

Profitability

Before allowing for planning costs written off, the Club's underlying profitability reduced by 7.2% over 2008/9.

This was mainly attributable to a decrease in discretionary spending through bar, function and food revenues which collectively led to a slight reduction in turnover of 1.24% and tighter margins (down 0.3%) compared to 2008/9.

Two of the larger reductions were in bottle shop sales which fell by 12% over 2008/9 and food commissions which fell by 26% as the Club responded to the commercial challenges faced by its caterers and agreed to new reduced, winter opening hours.

As members are aware, substantial work was done during the year on the redevelopment which led to the Development Application being submitted. Costs expensed on planning for the Club's redevelopment so far total \$559,778 with a further \$58,390 capitalised.

The Club has budgeted \$100,000 for further such costs during 2010/11 however this estimate is dependant upon any additional work the regulating authorities may require to approve the Development Application.

The Club has not factored into its budget for 2011 any costs associated with commencement of the redevelopment itself.

Liquidity

The Club has improved its cash holdings at year end to \$3,078,369 (2009: \$2,056,398).

This is slightly ahead of budget due to the earlier than forecast payment of a large annually recurring debt, which has correspondingly reduced trade and other receivables.

Despite the Club's increased cash holdings, reducing interest rates in 2009/10 resulted in interest earned in the year of \$137,810 (being at a similar level to 2008/9 (\$142,859)) however, in a rising interest rate environment, the Club stands to benefit in 2010/11 from increased returns on its cash deposits.

The final major equipment lease, relating to the marina, will expire at the end of the 2010/11 financial year at which point the Club is forecast to be wholly debt free.

Capital expenditure

Capital expenditure this year totalled \$167,342 (2008/9: \$167,669), the major element of which related to the replacement of the engine on MV Gordon Marshall at a cost of \$61,354.

Outlook for 2010/11

Members will note that the Club has been somewhat impacted by decreased trading in its non marina operations – partly as a factor of reduced patronage, the new restaurant hours and the desire to preserve the value of the members discount on bar sales. Overall profitability has been preserved by close control of operating costs and the strong performance of the marina.

The use of Club facilities by external corporations fell during the year by some 30% compared to 2009, and while the early signs for 2010/11 are encouraging, it is important that members appreciate the value to the Club of attracting organisations to use its facilities (particularly during the working week) as a major source of revenue and promote it accordingly whenever the opportunity arises.

For 2010/11, the Commodore has again announced there will be no increase in membership fees however, this will now be the sixth consecutive year that members' subscriptions have not increased and it is likely that an increase will be necessary in 2011/12 once the redevelopment plans are finalised, costed and presented to members.

Summary

It is clear that our Club was impacted in 2009/10 by a reduction in the discretionary spending habits of its members and guests, which led to a slight decline in underlying trading performance.

This was not unexpected by your Board, which set a tight budget for the year, and with close cost control by the Club's management team, led by Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf, the Club has exceeded its budget on all measures.

This is an excellent financial result for the year – one the Club should be proud of.

With 2010/11 likely to be the last full year of uninterrupted trading, plans must now be made as to how the Club will finance its redevelopment and this will become a major focus for the Board and management.

As ever the skilled finance team, led by Nina McKinnon, has made both the production of the accounts and the annual audit an uncomplicated affair, and my thanks go out to her year in, year out for her dedication to the smooth running of the Club's finances.

SAILING COMMITTEE REPORT

Rear Commodore Garry Linacre, Chairman

The 2009/10 sailing season has again been a great success with all divisions in our fleet experiencing a high standard of racing. Entry levels have increased and the Sailing Committee continues to review our policies in order to provide our management team with a basis to ensure that all our stakeholders have a high level of satisfaction within our racing program.

Handicapping and rating systems continue to generate robust debate among both competitors and officials. The IRC system seems to be meeting our needs and expectations. The IRC database continues to grow and with that growth comes the potential to improve the system. At this point in time the Sailing Committee sees no case to implement change. In the last Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race we had an ORCi division numbering 35. The CYCA will co-operate with any group of owners who wish to evaluate a rating system. Entry in either, or both systems will be permitted, and as ORCi numbers grow divisions will be created as necessary.

The Club has moved well down the path of familiarisation with the Top Yacht software system and, as planned, our Sailing Office has brought more of our PHS handicapping 'in house'. The Sailing Office used modules of the Top Yacht system for the Mt Gay Rum Monday and St Arnou Wednesday Twilight Series this summer season. This proved to be a success. We are fine tuning the use of the Top Yacht system to create the PHS handicaps for the Audi Winter Series. While the winter series presents a number of handicapping challenges, we are confident of a good and fair outcome in the series for those participating.

Vale John Hurley

With our Sailing Manager Justine Kirkjian about to embark on a period of maternity leave, our incumbent Principal Race Officer John Hurley was contracted to stand in as Acting Sailing Manager. Shortly after this appointment John became aware of some serious heath problems. John continued on in his position, until sadly his illness made it too much for him. John passed away on 19 March 2010. John was a great friend of the CYCA as well as being a wonderful yachtsman and administrator. We shall miss him.

Flinders Islet Incident

The Commodore has already touched on the tragedy that occurred during the conduct of the Flinders Islet Race in the early hours of 10 October 2009 in his report. On behalf of the Sailing Committee I concur with his comments.

Thank you to the volunteers

Our wonderful group of volunteers again stepped up and helped the Club in a superb way. Robyn Morton deserves special thanks, often acting as Race Officer, she has taken on a solid work load to the benefit of racing and the Club. Steve Kidson has done a marvellous job as 'Offshore Coxwain'. All the team deserve warm thanks. The team is; Maryrose Heffernan, Jane Stranger, Annie Aitken, Jennifer Birdsall, Doug Cairns, Debbie Wilson, Shaaron Walsh, Gail Lewis-Bearman, Dick Bearman, Valda Payne and Denise Van Ewijk. We thank you all whole heartedly.

John Winning and his family again offered the wonderful support of the magnificent JBW as our Radio Relay Vessel for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. Thanks must go to the Winnings and to JBW skipper Andrew (Steak) Copley.

Once again Past Commodore David Kellett AM and his team of radio operators provided us with an excellent communications scenario for the 2009 Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and the 2009 Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race. In a new development in our communications we have reached a level of co-operation with the volunteer operators of the South Head Signal Station. The initial trials in the Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race, with the assistance of Robyn Morton proved successful. We plan to build on this experience and develop a good sound relationship with Marine Rescue Sydney with the ability to use this well positioned facility with its excellent antenna array.

Year after year our dedicated International Juror John Kirkjian helps us with our juries and Protest Committees. John represents the Club on the YNSW Racing Rules and Special Regulations Committees and continues to provide a high level of support to the Club on a range of fronts.

Tim Cox has again provided strong and effective Chairmanship of our various major race committees over the last year. Tim's experience, co-operation and advice are greatly valued by both the staff and myself.

Thanks must also go to David Jordon who took on the important responsibility of Emergency Management Team Leader for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. Part of his team once again included Director and Sailing Committee member Richard Cawse and Past Commodore John Messenger who volunteered as the mobile emergency management team stationed in Eden. Thanks go to Richard and John for their dedication to the event and the Club.



During the year our much appreciated crew liaison volunteer Mervyn Clarke passed away. After a call was put to members for his role to match crew and boats in our various racing programs, Robert Skol offered to step into the breach. Merv will be missed by all, and thanks go to Robert for agreeing to keep this great service to owners and crew active.

I was again privileged this year to chair the very strong group of individuals who make up the Sailing Committee. The Committee is formed by a dedicated and diverse group of members. I thank them for their input and support.

Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race

Our third Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race was a success with a satisfactory lift in entry numbers. The Newcastle Cruising Yacht Club provided wonderful hospitality in their new Clubhouse.

In this seasons Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Race Bob Oatley's Wild Oats XI was successful in taking out Line Honours, and Yendys skippered by Geoff Ross won IRC. ORCi honours went to Colin Woods with Pretty Fly III.

Champions and notable results

The Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race is the final leg of the Blue Water Pointscore. Bob Steel by a slim margin, was able to clinch Blue Water victory with his third place in this race.

The Ocean Pointscore IRC division was won by Vanguard sailed by Richard Cawse with an nine point break to Paul Clitheroe's Balance and Matthew Short's Shortwave separated by count back for second and third respectively. Noel Cornish in St Jude won the PHS Ocean Pointscore followed again by Vanguard in second place. Annette and Robin Hawthorn in Imagination took out the Grant Thornton SOPS Division I PHS Pointscore from Warwick Sherman sailing Occasional Coarse Language. CRUISING COMMITTEE REPORT

Cruising Captain John Keelty

Once again during the past 12 months CYCA Cruising has been active both in and outside the Club.

The most significant event for CYCA Cruising since the last annual report has been the establishment of the long awaited Medical Management for Mariners (MMM) Course conducted in conjunction with St Vincent's Hospital Darlinghurst. Participants who undertake this course are shown how to deal with the many emergencies that ongoing research has recognised that can occur on both ocean racing and cruising yachts. The course is held over eight nights, with seven at the hospitals own Don Harrison Patient Safety Simulation Centre and the last conducted on a yacht at the CYCA.

To date we have conducted three courses, with two more planned for 2010. The topics covered include:

- MMM Protocol and Principles
- Injections
- Danger and haemorrhage
- Airway, breathing and near drowning
- Circulation and abdominal pain
- Depressed level of consciousness
- Exposure and marine envenomation
- Fractures, catherisation and real life
- \bullet Get up and go

As can be seen this course is a world first for sailors, it goes way beyond even remote first aid and gives hands on experience on how to manage the many marine emergencies that can be encountered while at sea.

None of this would have been possible without the finances donated by CYCA SOLAS Trusts, the support of the Commodore and the Board of the CYCA, and the assistance of the staff at both St Vincent's Hospital and the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia. I wish to especially thank our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf, Nina McKinnon, Christina Del Conte, and the reception team, whose ongoing support and assistance has been outstanding and helps make it all happen.

Another high priority on the Cruising Committee's agenda is the promotion and organisation of the second Sydney to Hobart Cruise in order to establish this as a regular event on the CYCA Sailing calendar. Our next cruise will take place in January 2011 and is timed to arrive in Hobart so that participants can attend the Tasmanian Wooden Boat Festival

and join in the 2011 Van Dieman's Land Circumnavigation, or simply cruise the spectacular coast of Tasmania. It will be a no pressure and enjoyable way to sail to Tasmania. Any member who is interested should contact either David Champtaloup (Caprice of Huon) or Denise Doyle (Sextant) or see the CYCA website for further information.

During March Jeremy Firth and Penny St Leger of the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania gave us an interesting presentation on the round Tasmania Cruise. This will be followed by another information night for those who may be interested in doing the Cruise to Hobart later this year.

Other CYCA Cruising events included a cruising get together at Newcastle Cruising Yacht Club and a number of information evenings.

The first educational information night organised was aimed to assist in overcoming the mysteries of the diesel engine. To this end Denise Doyle liaised with Dave Giddens from Drive Marine Services, who gave us an excellent presentation about diesel engines. In May Ted Nobbs arranged for Rob Starkey to explain to all who attended about yacht electrics with a focus on batteries and other essential electric items aboard a yacht.

CYCA Club's Trophy for the Best Cruise Overseas

This year the CYCA Club's Trophy for the Best Cruise Overseas has been awarded to Alex Whitworth who completed his second round the world voyage in his 10 metre sloop Berrimilla. This circumnavigation was carried out under sail via the top of Alaska, then down to England where he once again competed in the Rolex Fastnet Race before returning to Australia. This makes Alex and Berrimilla the first yacht to circumnavigate the world via the infamous North West Passage under sail, a truly remarkable feat.

MARINA & SITE COMMITTEE REPORT

Firstly let me say a very big thank you to Alan Green who as immediate past Chairman of the Marina & Site Committee maintained his interest and as such is still serving the Club on this Committee.

I have served for three years on this Committee before being appointed Chairman in July 2009.

As each year passes we have been able to maintain constancy in the make-up of the Committee, allowing it to have a very strong working relationship with the staff.

Our goal remains to create a high standard and focussed approach to maintaining the assets of the Club which include the Clubhouse, marina and the Club water based vessels.

Another successful year

So another successful year. It is always a pleasure to be able to attend meetings where issues are handled quickly and efficiently.

This Committee deals with strategic issues regarding the site and other assets as they arise, giving the Board well thought out recommendations for their consideration.

One of the more obvious issues the Committee constantly battles with is car parking and the demands that face the Club when limited car parking is outweighed by the number of members looking for a car spot. Hopefully the longer term solution will be partly met when the Club undergoes the redevelopment which includes double the current car parking available. Members should remember however, that parking is not a right but a privilege, so on behalf of my Committee I ask all members to be considerate to your fellow members and only use the car parking as outlined in the relevant By Law.

Permanent berthing remains another significant benefit of membership and remains at a premium with vacancies replaced as soon as practical by the Committee from those on the waitlist. It should be noted that the waiting list is continually vetted to ensure that each application category is fairly considered against the available berth according to the size of yachts.

The amended Licence agreement has been in place now for two years and appears to be working as we intended.

Although we consider that the waiting list is still too long, we can only place vessels as the current permanent berth licence holders relinquish their licence. The plans to extend D arm of the marina as part of the redevelopment plans will help to somewhat alleviate this situation.

The Committee is continuing to monitor the activity of permanent marina berth licence holders to ensure yachts berthed on the marina actively participate in Club organised events with an annual review of all licences now in place.

The activities and events organised by the Club for the benefit of members is growing and with this increase it is necessary to ensure that our facilities are maintained to the expected high standards so all members and your guests have an environment for which we can all be proud.

These facilities require careful and planned maintenance all executed by our staff, and we have them to thank for their expertise and diligence in the manner in which they attend to their duties.

However, it is up to all members to assist by taking care of our assets, and in the event you observe any damage I ask that you report it to the operations team so they can attend to the matter immediately

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 March 2010

I. General information

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia ("the Company") is a company limited by guarantee and operating in Australia.

In accordance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia, every member of the company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company in the event of it being wound up, whilst he or she is a member or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up such as may be required, not exceeding \$2 per member.

The company has 2,715 members at year end.

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia's registered office and its principal place of business are as follows: I New Beach Road Darling Point NSW 2027

2. Adoption of new and revised Accounting Standards

These Standards and Interpretations will be first applied in the financial report of the company that relates to the annual reporting period beginning after the effective date of each pronouncement.

3. Significant accounting policies

Statement of compliance

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001, Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and complies with other requirements of the law including the Registered Clubs Act.

Accounting Standards include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ('A-IFRS'). A statement of compliance with IFRS cannot be made due to the application of not for profit sector specific requirements contained in the A-IFRS.

The financial statements were authorised for issue by the directors on the 18th of May 2010.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost, except for the revaluation of certain non-current assets and financial instruments. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

In the application of the company's accounting policies, which are described within this note, management is required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstance, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Judgements made by management that have significant effects on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustments in the next year are disclosed, where applicable, in the relevant notes to the financial statements.

Accounting policies are selected and applied in a manner which ensures that the resulting financial information satisfies the concepts of relevance and reliability, thereby ensuring that the substance of the underlying transactions or other events is reported.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report:

(a) Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the financial year ended 31 March 2010 (continued)

(b) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits. Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value and have a maturity of three months or less at the date of acquisition.

Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities in the balance sheet.

(c) Employee benefits

A liability is recognised for benefits accruing to employees in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave and long service leave when it is probable that settlement will be required and they are capable of being measured reliably.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits expected to be settled within 12 months, are measured at their nominal values using the remuneration rate expected to apply at the time of settlement.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits which are not expected to be settled within 12 months are measured as the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made by the company in respect of services provided by employees up to reporting date.

Defined contribution plans

Contributions to defined contribution superannuation plans are expensed when employees have rendered service entitling them to the contributions.

Long term service benefits

The Company's net obligation in respect of long-term service benefits, other than pension plans, is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods. The obligation is calculated using expected future increases in wage and salary rates including related on-costs and expected settlement dates, and is discounted using rates for Commonwealth Government bonds at the balance sheet date which have maturity dates approximating to the terms of the Company's obligations.

(d) Financial assets

Loans and receivables

Trade receivables, loans, and other receivables that have fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market are classified as 'loans and receivables'. Loans

and receivables are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment.

Interest is recognised by applying the effective interest rate.

Effective interest method

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and of allocating interest income over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts (including all fees on points paid or received that form an integral part of the effective interest rate, transaction costs and other premiums or discounts) through the expected life of the financial asset, or, where appropriate, a shorter period.

Income is recognised on an effective interest rate basis for debt instruments other than those financial assets 'at fair value through profit or loss'.

Impairment of financial assets

Financial assets, other than those at fair value through profit or loss, are assessed for indicators of impairment at each balance sheet date. Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset the estimated future cash flows of the investment have been impacted. For financial assets carried at amortised cost, the amount of the impairment is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the original effective interest rate.

The carrying amount of the financial asset is reduced by the impairment loss directly for all financial assets with the exception of trade receivables where the carrying amount is reduced through the use of an allowance account. When a trade receivable is uncollectible, it is written off against the allowance account. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off are credited against the allowance account. Changes in the carrying amount of the allowance account are recognised in profit or loss.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the previously recognised impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss to the extent the carrying amount of the investment at the date the impairment is reversed does not exceed what the amortised cost would have been had the impairment not been recognised.

(e) Financial instruments issued by the company

Debt and equity instruments

Debt and equity instruments are classified as either liabilities or as equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or loss' or other financial liabilities.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities, including borrowings, are initially measured at fair value, net of transaction costs.

Other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, with interest expense recognised on an effective yield basis.

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial liability and of allocating interest expense over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liability, or, where appropriate, a shorter period.

(f) Impairment of other tangible and intangible assets

At each reporting date, the company reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any). Where the asset does not generate cash flows that are independent from other assets, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Where a reasonable and consistent basis of allocation can be identified, corporate assets are also allocated to individual cash-generating units, or otherwise they are allocated to the smallest group of cash-generating units for which a reasonable and consistent allocation basis can be identified.

Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset for which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the relevant asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation decrease.

Where an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount, but only to the extent that the increased carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset (cash-generating unit) in prior years. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss immediately, unless the relevant asset is carried at fair value, in which case the reversal of the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation increase.

(g) Income tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Company is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997), provided it continues as a sporting club predominately encouraging and promoting the sport of yachting, boating, cruising for pleasure and the building and sailing of yachts and boats. Accordingly tax affect accounting has not been adopted by the Company.

(h) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs, including an appropriate portion of fixed and variable overhead expenses, are assigned to inventory on hand by the method most appropriate to each particular class of inventory, with all categories being valued on a first in first out basis. Net realisable value represents the estimated selling price less all estimated costs of completion and costs necessary to make the sale.

(i) Leases

Leases are classified as finance leases when the terms of the lease transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of the leased asset to the lessee. All other leases are classified as operating leases.

Finance leases

Assets held under finance leases are initially recognised at their fair value or, if lower, at amounts equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, each determined at the inception of the lease. The corresponding liability to

the lessor is included in the balance sheet as a finance lease obligation.

Lease payments are apportioned between finance charges and reduction of the lease obligation so as to achieve a constant rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability. Finance charges are charged directly against income, unless they are directly attributable to qualifying assets, in which case they are capitalised in accordance with the company's general policy on borrowing costs. Refer to note 3(a). Contingent rentals are recognised as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Finance leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over the estimated useful life of the asset.

Operating leases

Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term, except where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed. Contingent rentals arising under operating leases are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

Lease incentives

In the event that lease incentives are received to enter into operating leases, such incentives are recognised as a liability. The aggregate benefits of incentives are recognised as a reduction of rental expense on a straight-line basis, except where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed.

(j) Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment, leasehold improvements and equipment under finance lease are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the item. In the event that settlement of all or part of the purchase consideration is deferred, cost is determined by discounting the amounts payable in the future to their present value as at the date of acquisition.

Depreciation is provided on property, plant and equipment, including buildings on leasehold land. Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the net cost or other revalued amount of each asset over its expected useful life to its estimated residual value. Leasehold improvements are

depreciated over the period of the lease or estimated useful life, whichever is the shorter, using the straight line method. The estimated useful lives, residual values and depreciation method are reviewed at the end of each annual reporting period, with the effect of any changes recognised on a prospective basis.

The gain or loss arising on disposal or retirement of an item of property, plant and equipment is determined as the difference between the sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognised in profit or loss.

(k) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that the company will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of the consideration required to settle the present obligation at reporting date, taking into account the risks and uncertainties surrounding the obligation. Where a provision is measured using the cash flows estimated to settle the present obligation, its carrying amount is the present value of those cash flows.

When some or all of the economic benefits required to settle a provision are expected to be recovered from a third party, the receivable is recognised as an asset if it is virtually certain that reimbursement will be received and the amount of the receivable can be measured reliably.

Restoration costs

A provision for restoration costs is recognised when an obligation exists to restore certain sites for the effect of the company's operations.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the restoration obligation at the reporting date. The amount is reviewed annually and changes recognised at the end of the reporting period.

(I) Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Goods sold and services rendered

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of beverage and other goods and is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services to members and other patrons of the Company is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due; the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably; there is a risk of return of goods; or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

Subscriptions

Subscription fees are taken into account on an accruals basis and the portion relating to the ensuing year is transferred to subscriptions in advance.

Yard and marina

Yard and marina revenue consists of casual and permanent berthing fees, hardstand fees, locker fees and tender fees provided to members and other patrons of the Club. Yard and marina revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided.

Sailing revenue

Sailing revenue consists of ferry charter fees, race entry fees, sponsorship and other associated income. Sailing revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided for all revenue except sponsorship which is recognised as it accrues.

Rental income

Rental income from property is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives granted are recognised as an integral part of the total rental income.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount..

(m) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except:

- i). where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority, it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense; or
- ii). for receivables and payables which are recognised inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as part of receivables or payables.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.
