# Commodore's Report

*Commodore Garry Linacre*

It has been a great pleasure to serve my first term as Commodore of our great Club. I feel blessed to have taken the helm from Immediate Past Commodore Matt Allen who left this office with the Club in such a robust state on a number of fronts. I have received great support from a strong and cohesive Board of Directors. I honestly marvel at their diversified skill sets and the time and effort that is put into creating policy that keeps our ship on the right course. The policies of the Board are well executed by our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf and his senior staff.

I wish to single out the help and support I have enjoyed from our Audit Planning & Risk Committee Chairman Michael Cranitch. It has been a great comfort for me to have a man of Michael's legal and life experience to bounce ideas off and generally check that my thoughts are on the right track. Plaudits must also go to both Michael and the new Breakfast Club leader Niel Burling. With great determination the Breakfast Club has gained a new life and we can all experience the joy and banter during our Sunday morning preparations prior to a battle on the harbour.

## Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race

Again the 2010 edition of the great race received strong coverage from both yachting and mainstream media. The profile of the event continues to grow and this year it is exciting to be commencing the first year of our recently renewed five year term with naming rights sponsor Rolex SA.

Following some communications issues that stemmed from the 2010 race, the resulting protest and its subsequent dismissal, we are engaging in a thorough fact finding mission regarding all forms of maritime communication. Our situation here is a complex one. Steered by the words of the Coroner regarding the necessity for fleet broadcast

communication capability and the fact that HF radio is both by convention and regulation the only available method of conducting full broadcast communication with a fleet in the ocean area we conduct the race. Investigations are proceeding regarding satellite telephone communication equipment and information required to look at improvement and policy change is being gathered from expert sources.

## Long Term Tenants

In recent months we lost within weeks of each other two long term loved and respected tenants from our Club precinct. There have been lots of stories and opinions around the Club and I would like to clarify the situation. Both the Doel family of Rushcutters Ship Chandlery and Kaioni Blake of the Marina Canteen chose to terminate their tenancies of their own volition. While waterfront retail premise rents are never cheap, the quantum of these rental arrangements were re-determined and agreed in 2004. The rents were in fact considerably less than those charged in a similar retail complex nearby and other like precincts. In the case of Rushcutters Ship Chandlery approaches were made to re-consider the situation and investigate a way forward. The Club was advised that the decision was made and there was no such opportunity. Kai had sought advice from her family and her mind was well made up. After 50 years it is very sad to see the closed doors.

The Board is mindful of the loss of member service. It will not be easy going into the redevelopment of the site. Many waterfront service businesses are finding it necessary to be remote from the water and unfortunately many are disappearing altogether.

## Financial Position

Again, we can be proud of the governance provided by our Treasurer Paul Billingham, Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf, Accountant Nina McKinnon and the various department heads that ran their departments within budget in most cases. The Club is free of debt and we are poised to commence the development of the site.

I am the Commodore that for the first time in some years, is required to oversee the first moderate rise in member subscriptions. This has occurred due to a number of reasons including preparation for the redevelopment not the least of them. The Board and management will be striving to increase member benefit and to that end we have recently conducted the first member survey in some time. The response to the survey was exceptional, with responses received from over 30% of the membership. I am hopeful we can go forward and create circumstances that satisfy our members and help more of you engage in Club activity in all facets of the Club.

## Site Development

Under the Chairmanship of Vice Commodore John Cameron our progress with the development is moving forward. I will leave the detail for John's report, but sincere thanks go to Geoff Bonus and Arthur Lane who have recently been bolstered by the addition of Treasurer Paul Billingham, Director Nick Kingsmill, Past Commodore Matt Allen and CYCA member Barry Munns. These additional members are to add fiscal diligence and project management expertise as we move into the staged planning and financial requirements of the project.



## Yachting New South Wales

Our membership of Yachting New South Wales (YNSW) is the conduit to our affiliation with Yachting Australia (YA) and ultimately the International Sailing Federation (ISAF) the world authority for the sport of sailing.

YNSW under the chairmanship of Howard Elliott has been successful in gaining the support of all major Clubs in implementing some significant change. Debate on funding models for YNSW has been robust for some years. YNSW has been successful in securing member support for a new affiliation fee structure for member Clubs. This is based on the total membership census of the member Club.

In the case of the CYCA we will be invoiced for our YNSW fee in October 2011. I expect that a moderate adjustment to our annual subscriptions will be necessary to cover the CYCA affiliation fee for 2011/2012. With the new system each member of the Club will be eligible to receive a Yachting Australia membership Silver card. Each member Club is required to pay the single affiliation fee to maintain affiliation with YA and ISAF. There will be more information regarding this later during the year. All in all I see this as good for our sport. It is important to have an effective well funded governing structure.

## Staff

It has been my great pleasure to work closely this year with our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf and his team. I have received fantastic support in our combined efforts to handle some difficult situations and some immensely satisfying occurrences in the best possible manner. My thanks to all the team for a great 2010/2011 and a job well done.

## Conclusion

I consider it to be a great honour to have become Commodore of our very special Club. After more than ten years as a Director and flag officer, I am very proud of the standing the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia has attained in so many areas. The



sport of sailing and especially ocean racing; our Youth Sailing Academy and the work it does with a wide range of young people from all facets of our community; and our charity the CYCA SOLAS Trusts and the invaluable support it provides to affected families and Australia's rescue organisations. ## Treasurer's Report

*Treasurer Paul Billingham*

2010/11 has delivered what I believe to be a record profit for the Club – \$499,606, an increase of over 30% compared to 2009/10.

## Profitability

Despite trading revenues being steady, the increased profitability has been achieved through tight control of direct costs and overheads as well as the Club benefitting from higher interest rates on its cash deposits.

A significant cost in previous years has been the expenditure incurred in planning for the redevelopment however, with the application being lodged and most of the associated work completed during the 2009/10 financial year, minimal further costs of \$17,147 have been expensed and \$10,887 capitalised this year.

This brings the total redevelopment planning costs, incurred since commencement up until 31 March 2011 to \$646,202.

Of this sum \$576,925 has been written off as it has been incurred (expensed), and \$69,277 capitalised.

With the recent granting of development consent it is likely that the majority of future expenditure on the redevelopment will now be capitalised and written off in accordance with the Club's accounting policies.

This year we have introduced further segment reporting at Note 24 to the accounts which provides a little more audited information of where the Club earns its revenues. I also draw members attention to the unaudited Supplementary Information that is also provided for members benefit.

## Liquidity

The Club's working capital position has again improved – increasing to an excess of current assets over current liabilities of \$3,401,947 at 31 March 2011 compared to \$2,044,029 at the end of 2009/10.

Most notably the Club's cash holdings have increased to \$4,336,129 (2010: \$3,078,369) as a consequence of the increased profitability, reduced planning expenditure and higher interest rates.

I flagged in my 2010 report that the Club stood to profit from a rising interest rate environment and indeed interest earned this year totalled \$226,500 (2010: \$137,810) with the majority of Club funds

held on term deposit at the year end at an average rate of 6.2%.

I am also delighted to confirm that as at 31 March 2011, the Club had repaid all of its finance lease commitments and is, accordingly, now debt free with all of its assets owned outright and unencumbered.

## Capital Expenditure

Capital expenditure this year totalled \$77,955 with expenditure on the MV Gordon Marshall's shaft and prop a major cost, along with the replacement of the boardroom furniture and upgrading the audio visual capability in the board room.

In January 2011 the Club commissioned an independent valuation of all of its assets, mainly for insurance purposes. This included the leasehold improvements and, as Note 11 to the accounts shows, the value of the leasehold improvements (essentially the Clubhouse, associated buildings and the marina) came in at \$8.75m – some \$3.9m higher than the value in the accounts.

While the Board has decided to continue with its policy of recording its assets at cost (as opposed to revaluing them each year) it is reassuring to know that the independent valuation of the Club's major asset, its premises, is significantly higher than the carrying value.

## Outlook for 2011/12

For simplicity, the Club's budget for 2011/12 has been prepared and approved by the Board on the basis of no work being commenced on the redevelopment during the financial year. On this basis, trading performance is expected to be ahead of the 2010/11 result, largely due to the Club's debt being repaid and higher cash holdings.

It is however now highly likely that, during the year, elements of the redevelopment will commence and any impact on trade as a result (which should be minimal in the initial stages) will be an adverse variance to the budget which the Board will consider in its decision making.

Also factored into the forecast has been the membership fee increase announced in March 2011 by the Commodore, as well as a 5% increase in marina berth fees effective 1 October 2011.

Finally, the budget allows for additional expenditure on member functions, from music on the deck during the Audi Winter Series to funding for the Summer Season Open Day. An additional so far unallocated allowance has been made for initiatives arising from the membership survey which the Board may want to adopt this coming year.

Looking further ahead, during the year the Board will take into account the results of the membership survey and the cash flow requirements of the redevelopment to determine the best way in which to fund the Club in the future. I anticipate that the results of this important review will be announced prior to the 2012 Annual General Meeting.

## Summary

The Club should be proud of its financial result for 2010/11, achieved against a backdrop of tightening spending habits of members and guests and continues to be well served by its experienced and skilled finance team lead by the Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf, and Club Accountant Nina McKinnon.

It is fair to say that the Club has never been in a stronger financial position than it is today, nor better prepared financially for the changes ahead.

The membership survey will however be a timely reminder of the need to balance financial success with the provision of the services that members deserve and expect – a key focus for the 2011/12 Board and finance team.

# Redevelopment Committee Report

In November 2010 the Commodore announced to members that the Club was granted consent to develop the premise we occupy at Rushcutters Bay.

This significant milestone marks the beginning of a strategic capital improvement phase in the Club's history, the likes we have not experienced since the current Club house and floating marina were redeveloped in the late 1990's.

In 2006 the Board recognised that for the Club to maintain our position as the world's leading organising authority of ocean yacht racing events, improvements were required to the facilities that is offered to members and guests. Since then an extensive design and planning process has been undertaken, with a successful outcome being achieved.

## Committee Members

In addition to myself as Chairman, the Committee consists of the following members;

The Committee also recognises and is grateful for the assistance and guidance provided by the Club's Audit Planning & Risk Committee.

The members of this Committee offer a broad and extensive range of professional experience that covers design, architectural, construction, finance and project management skills required for such an extensive project.

## Architects

Our architectural team headed by Michael Heenan, Director and Belinda Falsone, Senior Associate of the firm Allen Jack & Cottier have done a remarkable job in executing the brief we provided them, with every project milestone and outcome achieved. On behalf of the Committee I thank them for their professional approach thus far.

The highlights of the development include;

- extension of arm D of the marina with nine additional berths accommodating yachts up to 18m in length
- the de-linking of marina arms A & B, the linking of arms B & C with the relocation of the current arm C gangway to allow direct access to arm B & C of the marina from the new hardstand
- extension of the hardstand north across the current slipway and arm C timber deck
- the development of an underground and ground level car park that will accommodate 98 cars
- the development of floor space to accommodate the services of a shipwright, ship chandlery, sailing school, and convenience shop
- the development of facilities to accommodate the sailing office, marina and operations team
- the development of multi-purpose facilities to accommodate the off water training requirements of the CYCA Youth Sailing Academy and the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Media Centre in December each year.

The Committee has recommended to the Board the most efficient method of delivering the desired outcomes is by staging the development. The benefits of such an approach include; mitigating the expected inconvenience and disruption to the Club during the construction phase;

allowing the Club to continue to run its comprehensive calendar of events and maintain its day to day revenue streams; and most importantly properly manage the servicing of expected funding costs.

## Staging

- **Stage 1** – Will be the extension of 'D' Arm providing an additional nine berths for vessels up to 18 metres.

Included in this stage will be additional temporary car parking (for approximately 25 cars), achieved by using the redundant slipway area.

- **Stage 2** – The extension of the Hardstand area, and the linking of B and C arms via the A arm gangway.
- **Stage 3** – Reorganise the existing Club entry to provide for the basement excavation.
- **Stage 4** – Construct basement.
- **Stage 5** – Construct new building.
- **Stage 6** – Reconnect the marina to hardstand.

Members can view a model of the development which is located outside the entrance to the Coasters Retreat, or review the approved plans via the Club's website.

As Chairman I would like thank to all members of this Committee, the architects and staff, especially our Chief Executive Officer Mark Woolf who has contributed an enormous amount of time and energy to the project to ensure a successful outcome to the planning phase was achieved.

## Sailing Committee Report

It is my pleasure as Chairman of the Sailing Committee to present its Annual Report.

I thank my fellow Committee members, Director Geoff Bonus and Director Anthony Dunn, Richard Cawse, Dennis Doyle, Sarah Goddard-Jones, Les Goodridge, John Kirkjian, Paul Williams and Tim Cox for their commitment, support and most valued input.

The Sailing Committee meets each month to review and revise when necessary, our procedures and race protocols to maintain and improve yacht racing. We endeavour to keep up with the latest technology and in this context online entry was introduced for all the Club's racing over the 2010/11 season. So far the system has brought new efficiencies into the Sailing Office and made the paperwork for boat owners much easier. We continue to look at making the paperwork easier for owners.

During the recent Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race we successfully trialled and have now adopted a new race tracker unit for the Club's major races which will improve the standings and progressive results features of the race websites.

### Technical Communications sub-committee established

Following the review of the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, the Sailing Committee has established a Technical Communications sub-committee which is reviewing and assessing new technologies and improvements to our race communications and protocols.

We continue to monitor handicapping and rating systems. There is continued support for IRC being used as the Club's predominant rating system. We note that in the 2010 Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race we had 34 boats racing in ORCi division and therefore propose to continue to accept entries under both the popular IRC and emerging ORC handicap systems.

The Sailing Office used modules of the Top Yacht system for all racing over the summer series. This proved to be a resounding success. We are now fine tuning the PHS handicaps for the Audi Winter Series. This series presents a number of handicapping challenges, but we are confident of a good and fair outcome in the series for those participating.

### Volunteers

Our volunteers again provide a great service to the Club. Thank you to Robyn Morton for acting as Race Officer, Steve Kidson as 'Offshore Coxwain' and thank you to the race team of; Maryrose Heffernan, Jane Stranger, Jennifer Birdsall, Doug Cairns, Shaaron Walsh, Gail Lewis-Bearman, Dick Bearman, Darryl McManus and Denise Van Ewijk. Thank you also to Robert Skol, the dedicated Crew Liaison Officer who has helped match crew to boats in our various racing programs.

Thank you to John Winning and his family for the use of the JBW as our Radio Relay Vessel for the Rolex Sydney Hobart and Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Races. Thanks must also go to Andrew Copley, skipper of the JBW.

Past Commodore David Kellett AM and his team of radio operators provided us with an excellent communications scenario for the 2010 Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and the 2010 Audi Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race. Over the past year, with the assistance of Marine Rescue Port Jackson, we have conducted our race skeds and monitoring from the South Head Signal Station for many of our shorter blue water races with great success. Thank you to Marine Rescue NSW for your co-operation and support. Denis Doyle and David Kellett are also to be thanked for conducting these skeds.

Thank you to our dedicated International Juror John Kirkjian who assists with our juries and Protest Committees. John also

represents the Club on the YNSW Racing Rules and Special Regulations Committees.

Thank you to Tim Cox who provided strong and effective Chairmanship of our various major Race Committees over the last year. Tim's experience, co-operation and advice are greatly valued.

Thank you to John Brooks who took on the important responsibility of Emergency Management Team Leader for the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, and also Sailing Committee member Richard Cawse and Past Commodore John Messenger who volunteered as the mobile emergency management team stationed in Eden.

We have had a successful sailing season over all divisions with excellent results.

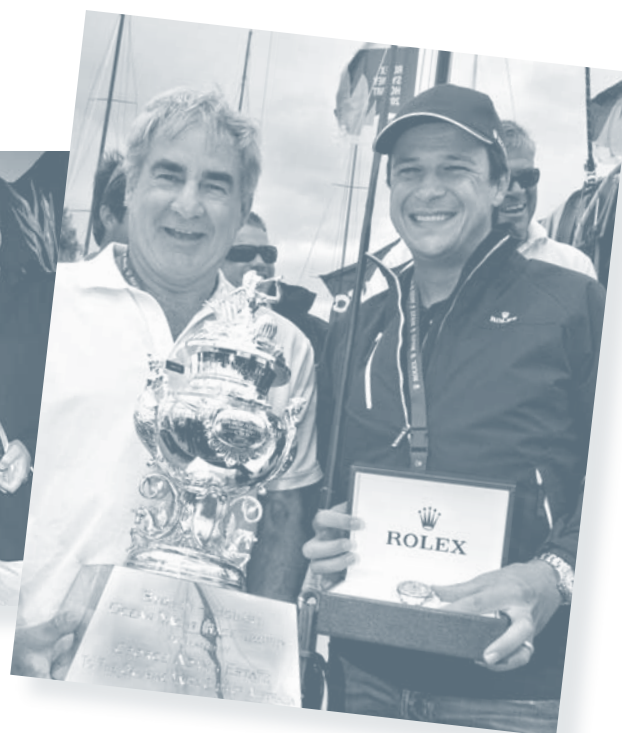

### Sailing results

The Audi Sydney Offshore Newcastle Yacht Race was the final leg of the Blue Water Pointscore. Stephen Ainsworth after four firsts in the series, was able to clinch Blue Water victory with his seventh place in this race. This year the Cape Byron Series was reinstated for the overall ORCi winner in the blue water series. Fittingly the series was taken out by Syd Fischer who is an avid supporter of the ORCi rating rule.

The Ocean Pointscore IRC division was won by About Time sailed by Julian Farren-Price with a nine point break to Commodore Garry Linacre's Vamp. Stephen Thomas in Blackadder won the PHS Ocean Pointscore followed by About Time in second place. Annette and Robin Hawthorn in Imagination took out the Grant Thornton SOPS Division 1 IRC

The line honours and Illingworth Trophy winner was Bob Oatley's 5 times line honours winner Wild Oats XI, with Sean Langman's Investec Loyal close behind in second place.

The ever popular Monday night Mount Gay Twilight Series was well supported and a great success. Ian and Shane Guanaria's One More No More 3 took out the Division 1 PHS pointscore from You're Hired. Division 2 PHS pointscore went to

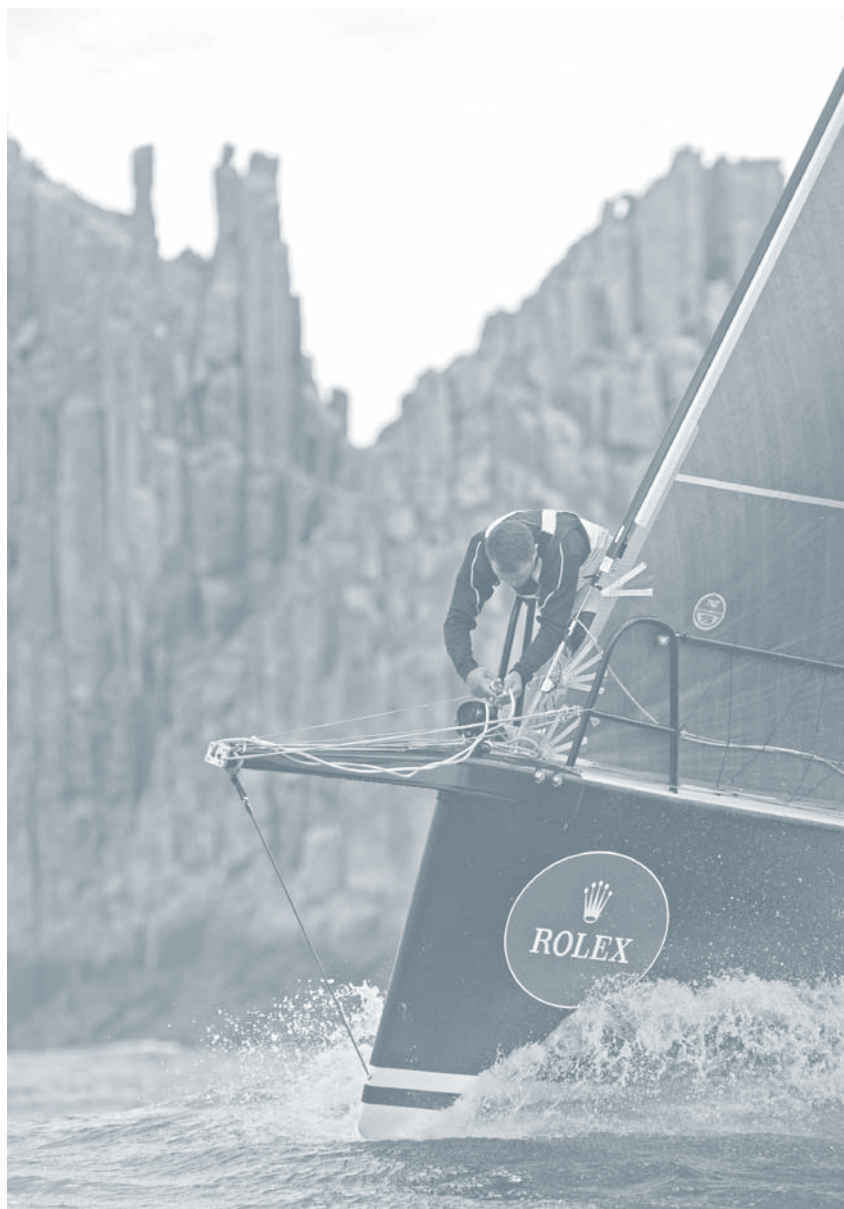

## Marina & Site Committee Report

This is my second year as Chair, and wish take this opportunity to thank the members of this Committee for their commitment to the Club and the interest they have shown on behalf of the members of our Club throughout the year.

As always there has been a strong working relationship between the staff and the long standing members of this Committee. Our goal remains to create a high standard and focussed approach to maintaining the assets of the Club.

### **A successful year!**

It is always a pleasure to be able to attend meetings where issues are handled quickly and efficiently.

This Committee deals with strategic issues regarding the site and other assets as they arise, giving the Board well thought out recommendations for their consideration.

In conjunction with the By-Law Review Committee we have developed a series of procedures and definitions to deal with the ongoing parking problems that have been the subject of much debate around the Club.

Members should remember however that parking is not a right but a privilege, so on behalf of my Committee I ask all members to be considerate to your fellow members and only use the car parking as allowed under the By-Laws.

Permanent berthing remains another significant benefit of membership and remains at a premium with vacancies replaced as soon as practical by the Committee from those on the waitlist. It should be noted the waiting list is continually vetted to ensure that each application category is fairly considered against the available berth according to the size of yachts.

The Committee is now tasked with the assessment of berth holders who have

come to the end of their current licence agreement. This assessment will ensure the currency and use of vessels as required by the licence agreement.

Allowing us to continue to monitor the activity of permanent marina berth licence holders to ensure yachts berthed on the marina actively participate in Club organised events.

Although we consider that the waiting list is still too long, we can only place vessels as the current permanent berth licence holders relinquish their licence. Now that the DA has been approved including the extension of 'D' arm we will shortly commence this work as part of Stage 1 of the Development thus providing additional berths to the benefit of the Club.

The activities and events organised by the Club for the benefit of members is growing, and with this increase it is necessary to ensure that our facilities are maintained to the expected high standards so all members and your guests have an environment for which we can all be proud.

These facilities require careful and planned maintenance all executed by our staff and we have them to thank for their expertise and diligence in the manner in which they attend to their duties.

However, it is up to all members to assist by taking care of our assets, and in the event you observe any damage I ask that you report it to the operations team so they can attend to the matter immediately.

The cruise to Hobart in January and February 2011 is the second organised by Cruising Committee members David Champtaloup (Caprice of Huon) and Denis Doyle (Sextant). - costs and expenses incurred by the relevant officers in defending proceedings, whether civil or criminal and whatever their outcome; and
- other liabilities that may arise from their position, with the exception of conduct involving a wilful breach of duty or improper use of information or position to gain a personal advantage.

# Notes to the Financial Statements

for the financial year ended 31 March 2011

## 1. General information

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia ("the Company") is a company limited by guarantee and operating in Australia.

In accordance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia, every member of the company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company in the event of it being wound up, whilst he or she is a member or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up such as may be required, not exceeding \$2 per member.

The company has 2,692 members at year end.

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia's registered office and its principal place of business are as follows:

## 2. Adoption of new and revised Accounting Standards

In the current year, the company has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (the AASB) that are relevant to its operations and effective for the current annual reporting period. The adoption of these new and revised Standards and Interpretations has resulted in no changes to the company's accounting policies.

At the date of authorisation of the financial report, the following Standards and Interpretations were on issue but not yet effective:

These Standards and Interpretations will be first applied in the financial report of the company that relates to the annual reporting period beginning after the effective date of each pronouncement. The directors have yet to assess the impact adoption of these new accounting standards will have on the financial statements.

## 3. Significant accounting policies

### Statement of compliance

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001, Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and complies with other requirements of the law including the Registered Clubs Act.

Accounting Standards include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ('A-IFRS'). A statement of compliance with IFRS cannot be made due to the application of not for profit sector specific requirements contained in the A-IFRS.

The financial statements were authorised for issue by the directors on the 17 May 2011.

### Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost, except for the revaluation of certain non-current assets and financial instruments. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

In the application of the company's accounting policies, which are described within this note, management is required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstance, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.



Judgements made by management that have significant effects on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustments in the next year are disclosed, where applicable, in the relevant notes to the financial statements.

Accounting policies are selected and applied in a manner which ensures that the resulting financial information satisfies the concepts of relevance and reliability, thereby ensuring that the substance of the underlying transactions or other events is reported.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report:

**(a) Borrowing costs**

All borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

**(b) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits. Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value and have a maturity of three months or less at the date of acquisition.

Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities in the balance sheet.

**(c) Employee benefits**

A liability is recognised for benefits accruing to employees in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave and long service leave when it is probable that settlement will be required and they are capable of being measured reliably.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits expected to be settled within 12 months, are measured at their nominal values using the remuneration rate expected to apply at the time of settlement.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits which are not expected to be settled within 12 months are measured as the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made by the company in respect of services provided by employees up to reporting date.

**Defined contribution plans**

Contributions to defined contribution superannuation plans are expensed when employees have rendered service entitling them to the contributions.

**Long term service benefits**

The Company's net obligation in respect of long-term service benefits, other than pension plans, is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods. The obligation is calculated using expected future increases in wage and salary rates including related on-costs and expected settlement dates, and is discounted

using rates for Commonwealth Government bonds at the balance sheet date which have maturity dates approximating to the terms of the Company's obligations.

**(d) Financial assets**

**Loans and receivables**

Trade receivables, loans, and other receivables that have fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market are classified as 'loans and receivables'. Loans and receivables are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment.

Interest is recognised by applying the effective interest rate.

**Effective interest method**

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and of allocating interest income over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts (including all fees on points paid or received that form an integral part of the effective interest rate, transaction costs and other premiums or discounts) through the expected life of the financial asset, or, where appropriate, a shorter period.

Income is recognised on an effective interest rate basis for debt instruments other than those financial assets 'at fair value through profit or loss'.

**Impairment of financial assets**

Financial assets, other than those at fair value through profit or loss, are assessed for indicators of impairment at each balance sheet date. Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset the estimated future cash flows of the investment have been impacted. For financial assets carried at amortised cost, the amount of the impairment is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the original effective interest rate.

The carrying amount of the financial asset is reduced by the impairment loss directly for all financial assets with the exception of trade receivables where the carrying amount is reduced through the use of an allowance account. When a trade receivable is uncollectible, it is written off against the allowance account. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off are credited against the allowance account. Changes in the carrying amount of the allowance account are recognised in profit or loss.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the previously recognised impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss to the extent the carrying amount of the investment at the date the impairment is reversed does not exceed what the amortised cost would have been had the impairment not been recognised.

## Notes to the Financial Statements *for the financial year ended 31 March 2011 (continued)*

### **(e) Financial instruments issued by the company**

#### **Debt and equity instruments**

Debt and equity instruments are classified as either liabilities or as equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement.

#### **Financial liabilities**

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or loss' or other financial liabilities.

#### **Other financial liabilities**

Other financial liabilities, including borrowings, are initially measured at fair value, net of transaction costs.

Other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, with interest expense recognised on an effective yield basis.

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial liability and of allocating interest expense over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liability, or, where appropriate, a shorter period.

#### **(f) Impairment of other tangible and intangible assets**

At each reporting date, the company reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any). Where the asset does not generate cash flows that are independent from other assets, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Where a reasonable and consistent basis of allocation can be identified, corporate assets are also allocated to individual cash-generating units, or otherwise they are allocated to the smallest group of cash-generating units for which a reasonable and consistent allocation basis can be identified.

Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset for which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognised

immediately in profit or loss, unless the relevant asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation decrease.

Where an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount, but only to the extent that the increased carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset (cash-generating unit) in prior years. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss immediately, unless the relevant asset is carried at fair value, in which case the reversal of the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation increase.

#### **(g) Income tax**

No provision has been made for income tax as the Company is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997), provided it continues as a sporting club predominately encouraging and promoting the sport of yachting, boating, cruising for pleasure and the building and sailing of yachts and boats. Accordingly tax affect accounting has not been adopted by the Company.

#### **(h) Inventories**

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value represents the estimated selling price less all estimated costs of completion and costs necessary to make the sale.

#### **(i) Leases**

Leases are classified as finance leases when the terms of the lease transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of the leased asset to the lessee. All other leases are classified as operating leases.

#### **Finance leases**

Assets held under finance leases are initially recognised at their fair value or, if lower, at amounts equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, each determined at the inception of the lease. The corresponding liability to the lessor is included in the balance sheet as a finance lease obligation.

Lease payments are apportioned between finance charges and reduction of the lease obligation so as to achieve a constant rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability. Finance charges are charged directly against income, unless they are directly attributable to qualifying assets, in which case they are capitalised in accordance with the company's general policy on borrowing costs. Refer to note 3(a). Contingent rentals are recognised as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Finance leased assets are amortised on a straight line basis over the estimated useful life of the asset.

#### Operating leases

Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term, except where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed. Contingent rentals arising under operating leases are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

#### Lease incentives

In the event that lease incentives are received to enter into operating leases, such incentives are recognised as a liability. The aggregate benefits of incentives are recognised as a reduction of rental expense on a straight-line basis, except where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed.

#### (j) Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment, leasehold improvements and equipment under finance lease are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the item. In the event that settlement of all or part of the purchase consideration is deferred, cost is determined by discounting the amounts payable in the future to their present value as at the date of acquisition.

Depreciation is provided on property, plant and equipment, including buildings on leasehold land. Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the net cost or other revalued amount of each asset over its expected useful life to its estimated residual value. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the period of the lease or estimated useful life, whichever is the shorter, using the straight line method. The estimated useful lives, residual values and depreciation method are reviewed at the end of each annual reporting period, with the effect of any changes recognised on a prospective basis.

The gain or loss arising on disposal or retirement of an item of property, plant and equipment is determined as the difference between the sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognised in profit or loss.

The following estimated lives are used in the calculation of depreciation:

Leasehold improvements	5 – 33 years / term of the lease
Boats	2 – 8 years
Plant and equipment	2 – 8 years

#### (k) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that the company will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of the consideration required to settle the present obligation at reporting date, taking into account the risks and uncertainties surrounding the obligation. Where a provision is measured using the cash flows estimated to settle the present obligation, its carrying amount is the present value of those cash flows.

When some or all of the economic benefits required to settle a provision are expected to be recovered from a third party, the receivable is recognised as an asset if it is virtually certain that reimbursement will be received and the amount of the receivable can be measured reliably.

#### Restoration costs

A provision for restoration costs is recognised when an obligation exists to restore certain sites for the effect of the company's operations.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the restoration obligation at the reporting date. The amount is reviewed annually and changes recognised at the end of the reporting period.

#### (l) Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

#### Goods sold and services rendered

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of beverage and other goods and is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services to members and other patrons of the Company is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due; the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably; there is a risk of return of goods; or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

#### Subscriptions

Subscription fees are taken into account on an accruals basis and the portion relating to the ensuing year is transferred to subscriptions in advance.

## Notes to the Financial Statements *for the financial year ended 31 March 2011 (continued)*

### **Yard and marina**

Yard and marina revenue consists of casual and permanent berthing fees, hardstand fees, locker fees and tender fees provided to members and other patrons of the Club. Yard and marina revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided.

### **Sailing revenue**

Sailing revenue consists of ferry charter fees, race entry fees, sponsorship and other associated income. Sailing revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided for all revenue except sponsorship which is recognised as it accrues.

### **Rental income**

Rental income from property is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives granted are recognised as an integral part of the total rental income.

### **Interest revenue**

Interest revenue is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount.

### **(m) Goods and Services Tax**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except:

- i). where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority, it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense; or
- ii). for receivables and payables which are recognised inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as part of receivables or payables.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

### **(n) Judgements in Applying the Accounting Policies**

Management judgement is applied in determining the following key assumptions used in the calculation of the long service leave provision at year end; future increases in wages and salaries; future on-cost rates; experience of employee departures and period of service. Management judgement is also used regarding the makegood provision. To assist an external estimation has been obtained for the year ended 31 March 2011.

### **(o) Key Sources of Estimation Uncertainty**

The estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment are subject to estimation error.

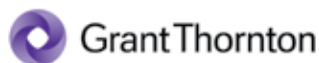
