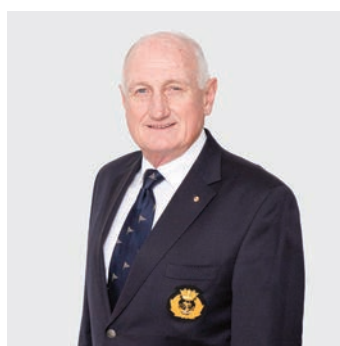

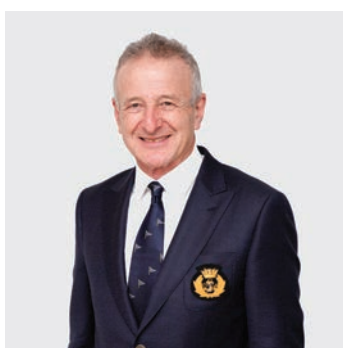

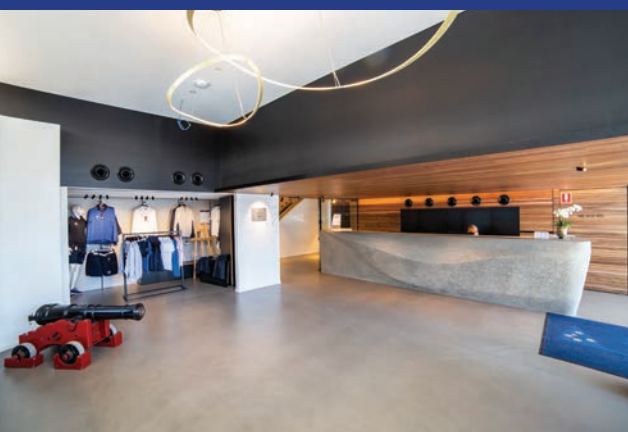

A year in review

This past 12 months at the CYCA has seen great change as we completed the major refurbishment of our premises in time for the commencement of our 75th-year celebrations. We also witnessed another amazing year on the water crowning many new champions in our various fleets, celebrating Wendy Tuck and Matt Allen's joint award as Ocean Racers of the Year; *Wild Oats XI*'s ninth line-honours title in the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race and the first Tasmanian boat since 1979 to win the race in the Reichel Pugh 66 *Alive*.

In the community our Club continued its great work in supporting local groups, young sailors and perhaps most significantly, that wonderful day in October when we hosted the Invictus Games – a day that will live long in the memories of those who competed from around the world.

So as I reflect on the year that has been and look forward to the one that is to come, there are many highlights!

A new Board, a new structure and a new CEO

With the arrival of three new Board members in Bradshaw Kellett, Justin Atkinson and David Jacobs, the Board took the opportunity to simplify the way it operates. Five standing committees were formed – Sailing, Special Events, Member Engagement, Premises and Audit, Planning & Risk and the various pre-existing sub committees given a stronger line of support for their work.

We also changed the way we ran our Board meetings – spending half of each meeting considering the future of the Club in one of four priority areas – Member Focus, Communications, Sail Training & Development and Blue Water Sailing. This made our meetings far richer and engaging and meant we were then able, through the newly introduced “Sked”, to share what we were thinking with Members on a monthly basis.

During the year we also farewelled CEO Karen Grega who contributed so much to the Clubhouse work and the reimagining of the Rolex Sydney Hobart. After a thorough search, Eddie Moore joined us and has made a great start to what has to be the best job in Australian sailing!

The Clubhouse is reborn

When I joined the Board in 2006, there was already plenty of talk about refurbishing the Clubhouse – and so after years of planning, consultation and building our financial reserves, it was amazing to see our beautiful home emerge in October to universal acclaim.

The contributions of so many Directors and Members over the years were recognised at the official opening and it was wonderful to see our longest-serving male and female Members, Michael York OAM and Joyce Warn, so delighted to be cutting the ribbon.

I must however single out our builder Belmadar for the amazing work they did to deliver both the Clubhouse and John Messenger buildings on time and under budget – we are truly grateful.

Looking forward, the Board hopes to be in a position to complete the car park resurfacing and New Beach Road boundary works over winter 2019 – finances permitting!

Getting closer to our Members

I remember saying to Members at the July 2018 AGM that I wanted them to feel a sense of pride, ownership and belonging to the Club and so it was perhaps no surprise to see the Board agree to prioritise Member focus and Communications this year.

As a Board, we have spent more time listening to Members' needs and feedback – through surveys, greater Director visibility, Town Hall meetings and the sub committees. In addition we have greatly improved our communications – Offshore was brought in-house and, 100 per cent focused on CYCA, is a really good read; Onshore is brighter, fresher and full of Club news every Monday; the monthly Sked comes out after each Board meeting and lets Members know what is going on behind the scenes; and the website and our social media channels have far more information, news, stories and features than ever before.

Finally, on Australia Day, the Board were excited to release a new package of Member benefits the like of which the Club has never been able to offer before.

So I am proud of the work that has been done here to increase the value of CYCA Membership and it will remain a focus for the coming 12 months.

Sailing at the heart

Where this Club really shines of course is on the water and the Sailing Committee report details the incredible achievements this year of our Club and its Members.

As a Board, we have spent time considering our place in world sailing and how we can improve our standing; growing our incredibly successful Youth Sailing Academy; building fresh training options to introduce new Members to our sport; and broadening the range of races that we offer.

2018/2019 COMMODORE'S REPORT

The next 12 months

There are two other areas that I consider are a priority for the year 2019/20 and on which, subject to the agreement of the Board and Members support, I would like to concentrate.

Firstly, the 75th year of this Club and the 75th Rolex Sydney Hobart brings into focus the need to, once and for all, properly and comprehensively record our history for future generations. Over the years many Members have made incredible efforts to do exactly that and with great results. I make particular mention here of people such as Past Commodore Martin James in driving the yacht tracker innovation on the Rolex Sydney Hobart website; and of Peter Shipway and David Champtaloup whose wonderful video archive project has been reactivated this year to such great acclaim.

But the Club cannot solely rely on the voluntary work of these and the other Members forever and so will be devoting the proper resources and funding to begin the work of ensuring our past is not lost to the future.

Secondly, the Constitution of the Club is overly complex and out of date. I aim to work with a group of Members and Directors to simplify the Constitution to reflect our future needs and bring that to Members for their consideration in early 2020. This will not alter the maximum terms of Flag Officers but will look at other areas such as Board composition, Membership categories, By-laws etc.

These two areas are, I know, of significant interest to Members.

Celebrating 75 years

In closing, much has been achieved this year and I want to thank the Board for the incredibly constructive way they have gone about their roles – each Director either chairs a Standing Committee or leads one of the four priority areas – and each has delivered what has been asked of them and more.

The same has to be said of our team here at the CYCA – it has not been an easy year and I thank them all for their dedication and commitment.

Finally, I thank the Members for being so supportive. It is a great privilege to be elected to be a Director of this Club and as Directors, while we know that we don't always get it right (!), our commitment is unquestionable, and we are proud to serve our Members and the sport of sailing.

As we move through this 75th year, let us reflect on the proud history of CYCA, the achievements of its Members, its bright future and celebrate together!

Overview

The financial year ending 31st March 2019 saw the Club complete the refurbishment of its Clubhouse, negotiate and execute a new lease of its premises and of course operate for a large part of the year from the temporary Clubhouse on the hardstand.

This meant the Club lost significant revenue streams through its inability to hold functions, hire out meeting rooms and of course only deliver a reduced food and bar offering while also incurring significant costs in operating from the hardstand. The Board carefully planned for this year of disruption however and conservatively forecast for an improved ramp up in trading once the works were complete. A loss of around \$1 million was budgeted and indeed this is how the result ended with an audited loss for the year of \$1.02 million.

Prior to commencing the Clubhouse work, the Club secured some \$3.5 million of debt facilities to ensure the costs

could be covered and working capital needs were met. At the end of the year, while there were undrawn facilities in excess of \$800k, the Balance Sheet of course looks very different from previous years - with the cash reserves expended on the Clubhouse; the new debt taken on; and a corresponding increase in the Club's fixed assets with \$8.55 million expended on the Clubhouse and associated works.

The Board's focus for next year therefore is to complete the ancillary works in the car park and Marina A arm; improve trading; and begin to pay down debt in an orderly fashion. The Board is determined to do this at minimum direct cost to Members - the Member benefits program introduced in January 2019 will continue; Membership fee increases have been kept to inflation level only; and the Board has given Members certainty by setting a 5% annual increase in Marina fees for each of the next three years - ensuring CYCA's Marina remains by far the cheapest on Sydney Harbour.

Profitability

- Revenue increased year-on-year delivering a strong result:
- Revenue from bar and food operations was surprisingly robust after the Clubhouse reopened, with income at materially higher than budgeted levels.
 - Marina income was 2% higher year-on-year despite a 5% fee rise in October 2018. This was due to a change implemented in the prior period in permanent/casual berthing mix from 75% to 80%.
 - Membership subscription revenue was up 2% due to the fee increase.
 - Interest revenue was down due to funds coming off term deposit for use in funding the Club refurbishment.
 - Rental income was also down due to ending tenancies during the redevelopment.
 - Sponsorships remained solid and are an important driver of Club revenue.

During the year, the Club executed a new land (dry) lease with NSW Department of Industry which runs until 30 June 2049 - concurrent with the wet lease executed the previous year. In light of these lease contracts, market escalation and discount rates, our Management Team undertook a process to assess the present value of the make good provisions. This resulted in a determination of a new present value of both dry and wet lease liabilities, whereby the dry lease make good provision was increased by \$940k.

Total operating expenses increased 14% year-on-year with the primary driver being an increase in property expenses as a result of the new lease agreements for both the wet and dry leases and the costs of operating from the hardstand. There was also a \$250k increase in broadcasting-related costs for Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race; an increase in employee expenses as the Club invested in improved communication and Member relations capabilities; and an increase in consultancy fees for the completion of the new Clubhouse facilities.

Capital Expenditure

During the year we invested a total of \$8.55 million in capital expenditure, which included additions of \$7.6 million for the new Clubhouse facilities.

More information on the refurbishment can be found in the Premises Committee Report.

Liquidity

The Club secured facilities as set out in Note 18 of the accounts, mainly from St George Bank. These included an

\$800k overdraft facility to cover working capital needs; a five-year term loan for \$2.2million and a lease finance facility.

The taking-on of debt and expenditure of the Club's cash reserves on the refurbishment has changed the look of the Balance Sheet materially. The current ratio has moved from 1.26 to 0.30 and will remain below 1 for the foreseeable future. The Board has considered this and developed a 12 - month rolling forecast model to assess future cash flow. This shows a comfortable go-forward position with the strong likelihood of all debt incurred being repaid within the next four years.

Outlook for next year

2019/2020 will see an uninterrupted full financial year for the first time in several years, nevertheless, a prudent budget has been set which factors in:

- Member numbers remaining stable at around 3,000, factoring in expected membership attrition;
- Leveraging our investment in the new Clubhouse facilities through refreshed bar offerings and Membership promotions;
- Continued commitment from all major sponsors;
- A renewed commitment to maintenance of assets with increases allocated to repairs and maintenance of the marina and vessels;
- Investment in our people and corporate governance whilst controlling administration costs; and
- Continued support for the Youth Sailing Academy and CYCA SOLAS Trusts.

The Board-approved budget for 2020 projects an increase in EBITDA to \$765k however a net loss of \$554k. Strong cash flow will however allow the Club to spend circa \$575k on completing the car park and reconfiguring the end of Marina A- arm and also reduce debt by some \$500k.

The Board and Management remain focused on materially beating this budget.

Summary

This year has been a complex one - building works, new leases, changes to accounting treatments, the taking-on of debt and interrupted trading have all contributed.

I wish to thank Management and the Finance team for working so well to deliver a good result and clean audit process - it should only get easier from here!

This was a great initiative that allowed family, friends and fans alike to follow the progress in each race.

Congratulations to Philip Turner who was declared the overall winner of the 74th Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race with his Reichel Pugh 66 *Alive*. Congratulations also to the Oatley Family's *Wild Oats XI*, having notched an incredible ninth line-honours victory.

The Club is very grateful that CYCA Member Sean Langman and Noakes Group, who have been long-time supporters of CYCA, became a major event sponsor with the 2018 Noakes Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race. The race was well contested with Bruce Taylor in his Caprice 40 *Chutzpah* claiming a well-deserved overall win. *Ich Ban* (Matt Allen) placed second overall and *Highfield Caringbah* (Ian Short) in third.

Matt Allen ended his highly successful 2018 year in *Ich Ban* with an overall win of the Audi Centre Sydney Blue Water Pointscore (the IRC Pointscore of the Blue Water Series). *Ich Ban* also placed first in IRC Division 1, followed by *Celestial* and last year's Blue Water Pointscore winner *Patrice* (Tony Kirby) in third place. IRC Division 2 was won by *Enterprise* (Anthony Kirke) who made the trip across the country from Western Australia for each race. Second place in Division 2 was Vice Commodore Noel Cornish's *St Jude* followed by *Grace O'Malley* (Zoe Taylor) in third.

The Cape Byron Series (the ORCi Pointscore of the Blue Water Series) was also won by *Ich Ban* followed by *Celestial* and *St Jude*. In ORCi Division 1, *Ich Ban* was followed by *Celestial* and *Gweilo* (Matt Donald). In ORCi Division 2, *St Jude* placed first followed by *Grace O'Malley* and *Enterprise*.

The Tasman Performance Series (the PHS Pointscore of the Blue Water Series), was won by *Celestial* with *Enterprise* following in second and *Ich Ban* in third. *Celestial* won PHS Division 1 followed by *Ich Ban* and *Koa* (Andy Kearnan and Peter Wrigley). PHS Division 2 was won by *Enterprise* followed by *Grace O'Malley* and *Kayimai* (Rob Aldis).

The Line Honours Pointscore of the Audi Centre Sydney Blue Water Pointscore was convincingly won by *Comanche* (setting an incredible three race records in the process) followed by *Ich Ban* in second and *Celestial* in third.

TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT SUB-COMMITTEE Chaired by Rear Commodore Dr. Sam Haynes

The Training & Development Committee is pleased to present to Members the success and achievements of our Youth Sailing Academy (YSA), which in 2018 celebrated its 25th anniversary. In recognition of this wonderful milestone, Australian Sailing appointed CYCA as the host Club for all of Australia's match racing national titles. These national titles included the Open, Women's, Youth and Schools Championships. On top of this, CYCA hosted the Invictus Games Sailing competition in October, utilising the YSA fleet of Elliott 7m yachts. Along with all the regular events on the YSA calendar, this lined up the team for its busiest year in its history.

On-water, the YSA enjoyed continued success, winning the NSW State Match Racing Championship for a 16th consecutive year, claiming all podium places in the Sharp Australian Youth Match Racing Championship, the first time a yacht club has ever done so, as well as taking regatta titles internationally at the Governor's Cup and CentrePort Wellington International Youth Match Racing Championship. This successful on-water season has also seen Tom Grimes, James Hodgson, Jess Grimes and Harry Hall selected to represent Australia at the World Sailing Youth Match Racing World Championship in Russia in August later this year.

Rounding off our sailing, all 21 members of the YSA's Advanced Squad participated in the Audi Centre Sydney Winter Series in 2018 with a further eight taking part in the Noakes Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race and nine YSA sailors and alumni taking part in the 74th Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race.

Our on-water and event hosting success also saw our staff recognised at the Australian Sailing Awards, with two YSA staff members, Head Coach Jordan Reece and YSA

Administrator Pam Scrivenor, both nominated for Australian Sports Professional of the Year.

In such a busy year, the YSA is very grateful for strong support from CYCA Members. Hosting so many major regattas in the past 12 months, the YSA relies on Members to assist with the billeting of interstate and international teams on their yachts. This support makes these regattas more affordable for visiting teams, especially the international entries, and in turn raises the profile of the regatta for competitors and sponsors of the event. As one of the five standing committees formed under the new Board structure, the Member Engagement Committee has been exploring and focusing on augmenting both the rational and emotional connection that past, present and future Members have to CYCA.

By working closely with the Member Value and Archives sub-committees, Associates Committee and Sustainability Working Group, we have enhanced communication, listened to feedback on the bar & bistro service offering, added a wider variety of events and social activities to the calendar and monitored how Members are using the refurbished Clubhouse. Below, more is described about what each of these committees have achieved over the past year and the Club would like to thank each of the chairpersons and Members of the committees who give their time freely and willingly.

Other initiatives the Committee has in-flight include, the new Member experience and reducing the time it takes from filling in the application form to enjoying the benefits of CYCA Membership, reviewing the Clubs with whom CYCA has reciprocal rights around the world and making sure that the Membership structure continues to be relevant to existing Members while appealing to potential Members.

One of the best ways to engage with Members is by asking them what they want from their Membership. During the year the Committee introduced a Members' Voice survey and were very pleased with the response. More recently the Committee undertook a larger survey covering most aspects of the Club and will start shaping a strategy for the coming year based on the results and input. More surveys and avenues to share thoughts and ideas are planned for the coming year.

ARCHIVES SUB-COMMITTEE – Chaired by Director Bradshaw Kellett

The Archives Committee have focused on five primary projects during the year which have been a great addition to capturing and transferring the history of the Club.

The Archives Room now houses a complete set of Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Programs and Offshore magazines, complemented by CYCA Annual Reports and Sailing Programs. Many other CYCA historical artefacts and information are also housed in the room.

The Video Archive Project is progressing well under the guidance of David Champtaloup and Peter Shipway. The 2018/2019 interviews so far include many significant individuals including Commodore Paul Billingham, David "Stork" Reid and Past Commodore Kerry Roxburgh being added to the online collection of Member interviews.

The photo digitising project of CYCA's stored print photos is in its 12th year of scanning. The information is currently being stored at CYCA in an effort to produce a digital archive on the History & Archives page of CYCA's website.

Along with the photos, the full collection of Offshore and Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Programs are being scanned to be made available to Members and guests and stored for historical viewing.

With the redevelopment of the Clubhouse and some changes to the display areas, a rotation system is being created to be able to display the many historical and important artefacts which CYCA possess to make sure that the rich history of the Club is never lost.

SUSTAINABILITY WORKING GROUP – Chaired by Director Justin Atkinson

This year the Board has agreed to formalise a CYCA Sustainability Program across Club operations. The focus will be on the reduction, re-use and recycling of resources. By undertaking this the Club will endeavour, in the long term, to reduce our expenditure on unnecessary items so that we can divert funds elsewhere.

The Management Team have been looking into areas where we can reduce wastage and the unnecessary use of single-use plastics such as straws and plastic cutlery. Our new Clubhouse development includes LED lighting, solar panelling and sensor lighting in an effort to reduce our power consumption.

Over the next 12-18 months a Sustainability Working Group, comprising Members and Club Management, will look to develop and implement an action plan of short- and long-term goals.

The Club is striving to take on the journey of change to be able to ensure to continuously improve the ways in which the Club and Members interact with the marine and onshore environment.

PREMISES COMMITTEE

Treasurer Arthur Lane

The previous Marina and Site Committee has had a name change to the Premises Committee to better reflect its responsibility of ensuring that all the Club's assets and facilities are maintained at the highest standards for use by Members.

Clubhouse and Annex

The land-based assets have undergone an extensive and long-overdue refurbishment. The development restrictions imposed by Council were such that the buildings could not be extended by even a millimetre in width, breadth or height however the result is a modern, efficient and practical layout that is also very attractive and seems much larger and easier to use than the previous Clubhouse. We must acknowledge the efforts of past CEO Karen Grega and Operations Manager Michael Neumann.

A solar energy system has been installed on the roof which has seen a significant saving to our power bills.

The Board has approved the Committee's recommendation to upgrade the surface finish to the larger car park and to replace the old brushwood fence to the street boundary with a new more robust metal boundary fence and sliding gates which will provide far improved security to the Club's premises. Management will implement a construction programme to minimise the short-term inconvenience that this operation will cause. The new gates together with the 'smart card' system (your Membership card) will give our Management Team a far greater control over the usage of the bays for Members of the Club.

Illegal parking by Members is still an issue to be resolved and the Board will be taking a far more stringent approach on Members who deliberately park in no-parking areas, emergency-only and accessible parking spaces.

Marina

As signalled last year the Committee has now completed its feasibly report on re-aligning the berths at the end of A-Arm from east-west berths to north-south orientated berths. This will allow for larger vessels and an additional two berths. Importantly, it will allow for safer access and exits from the berths. The Board have given permission to obtain approval from the relevant authorities and have set a budget for the

works. RMS have given their approval for the change and the proposal is presently before the Council for a Development Approval.

The Marina presently houses about 212 vessels however as there are also about 175 yachts on the waiting list the Committee have spent time on developing a policy for having inactive vessels removed. The Board has also accepted the Committee's recommendation with regard to inactive vessels on the Marina in order to reduce the waiting list for active Members requiring berths. A matrix has also been developed that provides a fairer and more transparent method for assessing the difficult task of allocating berths when they do become available. We are also reviewing the continuing status of those berth holders who are consistently not timely with payment of their marina fees.

Our Management Team have again demonstrated their dedication in the very effective preventative maintenance schedule that they work to within the strict budgeting capital expenditure restraints and their ability and agility to deal with and resolve the very many unexpected issues that arise in a marine environment. This past year, a higher quality wheel has been found for the trolleys and these are being fitted, the heavy-duty trolley has been repaired and an additional heavy duty trolley will also soon be on the dock for Members' use. In addition, a further 15 lockers are being acquired to supplement the ones presently on the hard stand.

The efforts that Tom Giese, Max Leonard, Stephen Cole, Max Henderson and Manuel Bonacini put into the day-to-day management and maintenance of the buildings, Marina and the site to make our use of the facilities so accessible are very much appreciated.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank the Committee for all its very valuable input, oversight and time over the past year. Having the knowledge, skills and diverse abilities of Past Commodore Kerry Roxburgh, past Directors Peter Shipway and Andrew Wenham, Directors Bradshaw Kellett and David Jacobs and Members Kieran Wallis and Adam Barnes has allowed this committee to work through and successfully resolve the many issues that have arisen over the year.

SPECIAL EVENTS COMMITTEE

This year, under the new Board Committee structure, oversight for all major events fell under the newly formed Special Events Committee – and it was a busy first year!

As well as assuming responsibility for the marque Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race, the Committee also drove the successful delivery of the inspiring Invictus Games in October 2018 and the planning for the Club's 75th anniversary year, now well and truly underway.

The 74th Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht race was an absolute classic – what a finish we witnessed! With our fantastic Sailing Office and Race Committee looking after the on-water side, off the water, the Special Events Committee focussed on the continuing evolution of the race coverage, shore side experience and social media, with incredible results. Some 1.65 million Australians watched the start which was simulcast on Channel 7 and 7Mate – an all-time record. The two Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Villages in Sydney and Hobart reached a new level of quality and attracted visitors in their droves with our major sponsor, Rolex SA, delighted with the changes made over the past four years.

Poignantly, against this background of sailing celebration, we remembered those sailors who lost their lives in 1998 – the race was genuinely and respectfully dedicated to their memory throughout.

The 75th race is however now less than six months away, and our five-year plan to match the race's on-water reputation as the premier annual blue water race with the shore-side experience continues, with incredible support from finishing partner RYCT, the NSW and Tasmanian Governments, Tasports and so many others.

CYCA SOLAS TRUST REPORT

The CYCA Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Safety of Life at Sea Trusts (CYCA SOLAS Trusts) were established following the tragic loss of six lives in the 1998 Sydney Hobart Yacht Race. They continue to raise funds for disbursement to families in need and safety organisations.

The CYCA SOLAS Trusts have a 100 percent flow through to beneficiaries from donations making the Trusts truly unique and with great impact, with administration and management costs to run the Trusts absorbed by the CYCA.

Due to the support of the CYCA Board and the generosity of several notable benefactors, the Trusts have raised in excess of \$130,000 this year; while distributing over \$148,000 towards several search and rescue projects in New South Wales and Queensland. The funds were put towards new motors for rescue vessels, upgrade to radio systems and night vision camera's which help all water users, not just ocean racers.

The annual SOLAS dinner co-ordinated by Kendi Kellett was held at the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron this year due to CYCA renovations. Commander Marc Pavillard RAN who co-ordinated the helicopter rescues during the 1998 Hobart race was an exceptional guest speaker making the evening a great success attended by over 110 Members and supporters who raised in excess of \$25,000.

With the support of the Flag Officers of the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania, SOLAS also held another dinner there in October with Wendy Tuck as the guest speaker; the aim being this continue to be an annual event.

Newcastle Cruising Yacht Club became a great supporter of SOLAS and held a dinner in their Clubhouse in November with Matt Allen, the winner of the 2017 Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race as guest speaker. Another exceptional evening with terrific auction prizes donated by local businesses raised \$23,000 on the night. Thanks go to Commodore Steve Rae and General Manager Paul O'Rourke and their Members for the wonderful support.

Another major fund-raising event is the SOLAS Rotary Charity Regatta where with the support of many CYCA boat owners, \$20,000 was raised for SOLAS. Thank you to all Members who support this worthy cause.

Bids for a ride on one of the competing maxi yachts in the Grinders Coffee SOLAS Big Boat Challenge also continues to be a great fund-raising event, thanks to the generosity of the yacht owners, raising over \$16,000 last year.

SOLAS has also become an integral part of the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race Corporate Lunch in December where SOLAS raised a further \$19,000.

In closing, I wish to thank my fellow Trustees for their ongoing commitment to this great charity, Matt Allen, Paul Billingham, David Gotze, Leander Klohs, Arthur Lane and Karen Grega the Secretary of the Trusts, as well as the support of Vice Commodore Noel Cornish AM.

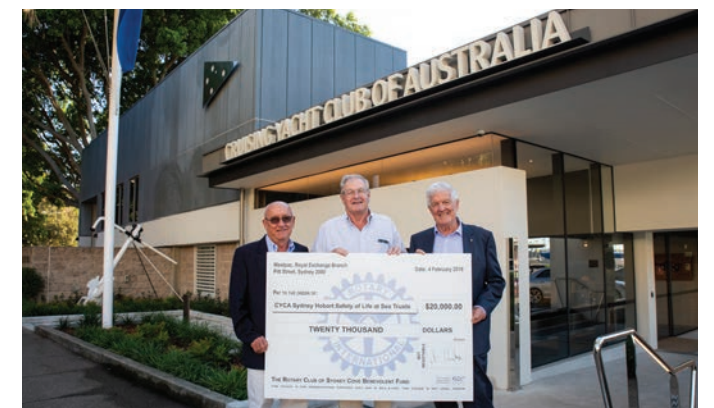

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 March 2019

1 General Information

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia (“the Company”) is a company limited by guarantee and operating in Australia.

In accordance with the Constitution of the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia, every member of the company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company. In the event of the company being wound up, whilst he or she is a member or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up such as may be required, not exceeding \$2 per member.

The company has 2,963 (2018: 2,787 members) members at year end.

Cruising Yacht Club of Australia’s registered office and its principal place of business are as follows:

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial report are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Basis of accounting

Statement of compliance

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board and The Corporations Act 2001. The financial report also complies with other requirements of the law including the Registered Clubs Act. Cruising Yacht Club of Australia is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial statements.

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards as issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB).

The financial statements were authorised for issue by the directors on 12 June 2019.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost, except for the revaluation of certain non-current assets and financial instruments. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

In the application of the company’s accounting policies, which are described within this note, management is required to make judgments, estimates and assumptions about carrying

values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstance, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Judgments made by management that have significant effects on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustments in the next year are disclosed, where applicable, in the relevant notes to the financial statements.

Accounting policies are selected and applied in a manner which ensures that the resulting financial information satisfies the concepts of relevance and reliability, thereby ensuring that the substance of the underlying transactions or other events is reported.

(b) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition and construction of qualifying assets, which are assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use, are added to the costs of those assets, until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and deposits at call. Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value and have a maturity of three months or less at the date of acquisition.

(d) Employee benefits

A liability is recognised for benefits accruing to employees in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave and long service leave when it is probable that settlement will be required and they are capable of being measured reliably.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits expected to be settled within 12 months, are measured at their nominal values using the remuneration rate expected to apply at the time of settlement.

Liabilities recognised in respect of employee benefits which are not expected to be settled within 12 months are measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to

be made by the company in respect of services provided by employees up to reporting date.

Long term service benefits

The Company's net obligation in respect of long-term service benefits is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods. The obligation is calculated using expected future increases in wage and salary rates including related on-costs and expected settlement dates, and is discounted using rates for Commonwealth Government bonds at the balance date which have maturity dates approximating to the terms of the Company's obligations.

(e) Financial assets

Loans and receivables

Trade receivables, loans, and other receivables that have fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market are classified as 'loans and receivables'. Loans and receivables are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment.

Interest is recognised by applying the effective interest rate basis for debt instruments other than those financial assets 'at fair value through profit or loss'.

Impairment of financial assets

Financial assets, other than those at fair value through profit or loss, are assessed for indicators of impairment at each balance sheet date. Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset the estimated future cash flows of the investment have been impacted. For financial assets carried at amortised cost, the amount of the impairment is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the original effective interest rate.

The carrying amount of the financial asset is reduced by the impairment loss directly for all financial assets with the exception of trade receivables where the carrying amount is reduced through the use of an allowance account. When a trade receivable is uncollectible, it is written off against the allowance account. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off are credited against the allowance account. Changes in the carrying amount of the allowance account are recognised in profit or loss.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the previously recognised impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss to the extent the carrying amount of the investment at the date the impairment is reversed does not exceed what the amortised cost would have been had the impairment not been recognised.

(f) Financial instruments issued by the company

Debt and equity instruments

Debt and equity instruments are classified as either liabilities or as equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or loss' or other financial liabilities.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities, including borrowings, are initially measured at fair value, net of transaction costs.

Other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, with interest expense recognised on an effective yield basis.

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial liability and of allocating interest expense over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liability, or, where appropriate, a shorter period.

(g) Impairment of other tangible and intangible assets

At each reporting date, the company reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any). Where the asset does not generate cash flows that are independent from other assets, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Where a reasonable and consistent basis of allocation can be identified, corporate assets are also allocated to individual cash-generating units, or otherwise they are allocated to the smallest group of cash-generating units for which a reasonable and consistent allocation basis can be identified.

Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset for which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the relevant asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation decrease.

Where an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to the revised estimate of its

recoverable amount, but only to the extent that the increased carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset (cash-generating unit) in prior years. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss immediately, unless the relevant asset is carried at fair value, in which case the reversal of the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation increase.

(h) Income tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Company is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997), provided it continues as a sporting club predominately encouraging and promoting the sport of yachting, boating, cruising for pleasure and the building and sailing of yachts and boats. Accordingly, tax effect accounting has not been adopted by the Company.

(i) Leases

Leases are classified as finance leases when the terms of the lease transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of the leased asset to the lessee. All other leases are classified as operating leases.

Finance leases

Assets held under finance leases are initially recognised at their fair value or, if lower, at amounts equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, each determined at the inception of the lease. The corresponding liability to the lessor is included in the balance sheet as a finance lease obligation.

Lease payments are apportioned between finance charges and reduction of the lease obligation so as to achieve a constant rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability. Finance charges are charged directly against profit or loss, unless they are directly attributable to qualifying assets, in which case they are capitalised in accordance with the company's general policy on borrowing costs. Refer to note 3(a). Contingent rentals are recognised as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Finance leased assets are amortised on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life of the asset.

Operating leases

Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term, except where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed. Contingent rentals arising under operating leases are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

Lease incentives

In the event that lease incentives are received to enter into operating leases, such incentives are recognised as a liability. The aggregate benefits of incentives are recognised as a reduction of rental expense on a straight-line basis, except

where another systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed.

(j) Trade receivables

Impairment of financial assets

The company applies the AASB 9 simplified approach to measure expected credit losses which uses a lifetime expected loss allowance for all trade receivables and contract assets.

Previous accounting policy for impairment of trade receivables

Trade receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Trade receivables are generally due for settlement within 30 days. They are presented as current assets unless collection is not expected for more than 12 months after the reporting date.

Collectability of trade receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off by reducing the carrying amount directly. An allowance account (provision for impairment of trade receivables) is used when there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables. The amount of the impairment allowance is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the original effective interest rate. Cash flows relating to short-term receivables are not discounted if the effect of discounting is immaterial.

The amount of the impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss within other expenses. When a trade receivable for which an impairment allowance had been recognised becomes uncollectible in a subsequent period, it is written off against the allowance account. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off are credited against other expenses in profit or loss.

(k) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value represents the estimated selling price less all estimated costs of completion and costs necessary to make the sale.

(l) Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment, leasehold improvements and equipment under finance lease are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the item. In the event that settlement of all or part of the purchase consideration is deferred, cost is determined by discounting the amounts payable in the future to their present value as at the date of acquisition.

Depreciation is provided on property, plant and equipment, including buildings on leasehold land. Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis so as to write off the net cost or other

revalued amount of each asset over its expected useful life to its estimated residual value. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the period of the lease or estimated useful life, whichever is the shorter, using the straight-line method.

The estimated useful lives, residual values and depreciation method are reviewed at the end of each annual reporting period, with the effect of any changes recognised on a prospective basis.

The gain or loss arising on disposal or retirement of an item of property, plant and equipment is determined as the difference between the sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognised in profit or loss.

The following estimated lives are used in the calculation of depreciation:

Leasehold improvements	5 – 33 years / term of the lease
Boats	2 – 10 years
Plant and equipment	2 – 10 years
Motor vehicles	8 years

(m) Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the company prior to the end of financial year which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within negotiated terms. Trade and other payables are presented as current liabilities unless payment is not due within 12 months from the reporting date. They are recognised initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

(n) Borrowings

Borrowings are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred. Borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Any difference between the proceeds (net of transaction costs) and the redemption amount is recognised in profit or loss over the period of the borrowings using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities are recognised as transaction costs of the loan to the extent that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down. In this case, the fee is deferred until the draw down occurs. To the extent there is no evidence that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down, the fee is capitalised as a prepayment for liquidity services and amortised over the period of the facility to which it relates.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the company has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

(o) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that the company will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of

the consideration required to settle the present obligation at reporting date, taking into account the risks and uncertainties surrounding the obligation. Where a provision is measured using the cash flows estimated to settle the present obligation, its carrying amount is the present value of those cash flows.

When some or all of the economic benefits required to settle a provision are expected to be recovered from a third party, the receivable is recognised as an asset if it is virtually certain that reimbursement will be received and the amount of the receivable can be measured reliably.

Site restoration make good provision

A provision for site restoration is recognised when an obligation exists to restore certain sites for the effect of the company's operations.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the restoration obligation at the reporting date. The amount is reviewed annually and changes recognised at the end of the reporting period.

(p) Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Goods sold and services rendered

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of beverage and other goods and is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services to members and other patrons of the Company is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due; the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably; there is a risk of return of goods; or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

Subscriptions

Subscription fees are taken into account on an accruals basis and the portion relating to the ensuing year is transferred to subscriptions in advance.

Yard and marina

Yard and marina revenue consists of casual and permanent berthing fees, hardstand fees, locker fees and tender fees provided to members and other patrons of the Club. Yard and marina revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided.

Sailing revenue

Sailing revenue consists of ferry charter fees, race entry fees, sponsorship and other associated income. Sailing revenue is recognised when the goods or services are provided for all revenue except sponsorship which is recognised as it accrues.

Rental income

Rental income from property is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives granted are recognised as an integral part of the total rental income.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount.

(q) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the taxation authority, are presented as operating cash flows.

(r) New and amended standards adopted by the Company

This note explains the impact of the adoption of AASB 9 Financial Instruments.

(i) AASB 9 replaces the provisions of AASB 139 that relate to the recognition, classification and measurement of financial assets and financial liabilities, derecognition of financial instruments, impairment of financial assets and hedge accounting. In accordance with the transitional provisions in AASB 9 (7.2.15) and (7.2.26), comparative figures have not been restated. There is no hedge accounting.

(s) New accounting standards and interpretations not yet adopted

Certain new accounting standards and interpretations have been published that are not mandatory for reporting periods ending 31 March 2019 and have not been early adopted by the Company. The Company's assessment of the impact of these new standards and interpretations, which are expected to have an effect on the Company's financial statements, is set out below:

(i) AASB 1058, 'Income of Not-for Profit Entities', introduces major changes to the income recognition by public and private sector not-for-profit (NFP) entities. Rather than accounting for all contribution transactions under AASB 1004 Contributions, NFPs will now need to determine whether a transaction is a genuine donation (accounted for under AASB 1058) or a contract with a customer

(accounted for under AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers). The mandatory application date of AASB 15 has been deferred to 1 January 2019 for NFP entities. If they want to adopt the new revenue recognition rules before that date, they will need to apply AASB 1058 at the same time. The Company is yet to assess AASB 15's full impact.

(ii) AASB 15, 'Revenue from contracts with customers' will replace AASB 118 which covers revenue arising from the sale of goods and the rendering of services and AASB 111 which covers construction contracts. The standard is effective for accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January, 2019 for not-for-profit entities in Australia and early adoption is permitted. The Company is yet to assess AASB 15's full impact.

(iii) AASB 16, 'Leases', was issued in February 2016. It will result in almost all leases being recognised on the balance sheet, as the distinction between operating and finance leases is removed. Under the new standard, an asset (the right to use the leased item) and a financial liability to pay rentals are recognised. The only exceptions are short-term and low-value leases. The accounting for lessors will not significantly change. The standard is effective for accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January, 2019 and early adoption is permitted. The Company is yet to assess AASB 16's full impact.

3 Critical accounting estimates and judgements

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

(a) Critical accounting estimates and assumptions

The company makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates will, by definition, seldom equal the related actual results. The estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

(i) Make good provision

This provision represents the present value of the directors' best estimate of the future sacrifice of economic benefits that will be required to settle the site restoration make good obligations pursuant to the company's lease of land and waterways. The estimate has been made on the basis of a cost estimate obtained from a Quantity Surveyor which has been projected to a future value using an escalation rate. The escalation rate is the equivalent of CPI and, where applicable, additional escalation for specific elements of the leased property. The discount rate applied to bring this future value back to its present value carrying amount is based on long-term Government bond rates.

24. Going concern

At 31 March 2019, the Company had a loss after tax of \$1,018,873 (2018: loss of \$73,587) and the Company's current liabilities exceeded its current assets by \$2,730,753 (2018: positive working capital of \$973,017). The Company however generated positive cash inflows from operations of \$1,596,290 (2018: cash inflows \$1,057,336) for the year ended on that date. The negative working capital position was due to the deferred income of \$1,349,206 (2018: 576,898) and the current portion of the make good provision of \$187,714 (2018: \$1,725,235) recognised in the financial statements.

It is deemed that the deferred income and the make good provision is purely an accounting balance and will not result in future cash outflows to the Company. Further, the Company is forecast to generate operating profits and positive operating cash flows for the year ending 31 March 2020. Accordingly the financial report has been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes continuity of normal business activities and the realisation of assets and the settlement of liabilities in the ordinary course of business.

There has not arisen in the interval between the end of the financial year and the date of this report any item, transaction or event of a material or unusual nature likely, in the opinion of the directors of the company, to affect significantly the operations of the company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the company, in future financial years.
